**Harga komoditi yang lebih tinggi mendorong Harga Pengeluar Malaysia
untuk mencatatkan peningkatan 11.2 peratus pada Mei 2022**

PUTRAJAYA, 28 Jun 2022 – Kenaikan Indeks Harga Pengeluar Malaysia yang mengukur harga barangan di pintu kilang kekal tinggi pada kadar 11.2 peratus pada Mei 2022 berbanding 11.0 peratus direkodkan pada April 2022, Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia melaporkan hari ini di dalam laporan bulanan terbaharu iaitu **INDEKS HARGA PENGELUAR (IHPR) PENGELUARAN TEMPATAN, MEI 2022**.

Dalam satu kenyataan pada hari ini, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia berkata, "Peningkatan dalam IHPR pengeluaran tempatan pada Mei 2022 disumbangkan oleh indeks Perlombongan yang meningkat 20.6 peratus berbanding 18.4 peratus direkodkan pada April 2022. Indeks Pertanian, perhutanan & perikanan mencatatkan peningkatan 16.7 peratus (April 2022: 18.0%) disumbangkan terutamanya oleh kenaikan dalam indeks bagi Penanaman tanaman kekal (21.2%), Perikanan (11.3%) dan Penanaman tanaman tidak kekal (7.8%). Pada Mei 2022, indeks Pembuatan mencatatkan peningkatan dua digit 10.1 peratus buat kali pertama sejak Ogos 2011 (10.6%) dengan 10.1 peratus, dipacu oleh kenaikan dalam indeks subsektor Pembuatan minyak & lemak daripada sayuran & haiwan (24.5%), Pembuatan produk petroleum bertapis (22.9%) dan Pembuatan kimia asas, baja & sebatian nitrogen, plastik & getah sintetik dalam bentuk primer (13.3%). Sementara itu, indeks Bekalan air meningkat 1.2 peratus, manakala, indeks Bekalan elektrik & gas menurun 0.6 peratus."

Melihat kepada bulan ke bulan, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin menjelaskan, "Pada Mei 2022, IHPR pengeluaran tempatan meningkat 1.2 peratus berbanding 0.2 peratus yang dicatatkan pada bulan sebelumnya. Kenaikan ini disumbangkan oleh indeks Perlombongan yang mencatatkan 4.0 peratus (April 2022: -6.6%) disumbangkan oleh kenaikan pada indeks Minyak mentah (4.3%) dan Gas asli (3.1%). Pada masa yang sama, indeks Pembuatan meningkat 1.0 peratus disokong oleh kenaikan dalam indeks bagi subsektor Pembuatan minyak & lemak daripada sayuran & haiwan (2.6%), Pembuatan produk petroleum bertapis (1.3%) dan Pembuatan peralatan elektronik pengguna (1.1%). Indeks Pertanian, perhutanan & perikanan turut meningkat 0.9 peratus (April 2022: -2.9%), dipacu oleh kenaikan dalam indeks Ayam (3.8%) dan Buah tandan segar kelapa sawit (0.8%). Selain itu, indeks sayur-sayuran seperti Kangkung, Timun, Sawi, Kacang panjang dan Kubis bulat turut meningkat. Indeks Bekalan air meningkat 0.1 peratus, manakala, indeks Bekalan elektrik & gas menurun 0.5 peratus."

Mengulas mengenai IHPR pengeluaran tempatan mengikut peringkat pemprosesan, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin berkata, "Indeks Bahan mentah untuk diproseskan selanjutnya meningkat 17.3 peratus pada Mei 2022 berbanding 17.1 peratus direkodkan pada April 2022. Kenaikan ini disumbangkan oleh indeks Bahan bukan makanan (19.8%) dan Bahan makanan & makanan untuk binatang (3.8%). Pada masa yang sama, indeks Bahan perantaraan, bekalan & komponen terus mencatatkan peningkatan lebih tinggi 13.5 peratus pada Mei 2022 (April 2022: 13.1%) didorong oleh kenaikan dalam indeks Bahan api yang diproses & pelincir (18.7%), Bahan & komponen untuk pembuatan (15.0%) dan Bekalan (5.7%). Indeks Barang siap turut mencatatkan peningkatan pada Mei 2022 dengan 1.0 peratus (April 2022: 1.1%), disokong oleh peningkatan dalam indeks Makanan pengguna siap (6.5%)."

Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia turut menjelaskan bahawa perbandingan pada asas bulanan, indeks Bahan mentah untuk diproseskan selanjutnya meningkat 2.1 peratus berbanding penurunan 3.5 peratus yang direkodkan pada April 2022. Indeks Bahan perantaraan, bekalan & komponen meningkat 1.2 peratus, manakala indeks Barang siap meningkat 0.3 peratus.

Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin menambah, "Peningkatan dua digit dalam IHPR di Malaysia

adalah selari dengan kenaikan inflasi di peringkat pengeluar bagi beberapa negara terpilih yang dipengaruhi oleh faktor kekurangan bekalan terutama bahan mentah berikutan kelonggaran sekatan, pembukaan ekonomi serta perang antara Rusia dan Ukraine. Inflasi di peringkat pengeluar bagi United Kingdom meningkat 15.7 peratus pada Mei 2022, naik daripada 14.7 peratus dicatatkan pada April 2022. Kenaikan ini didorong oleh harga yang lebih tinggi bagi bahan api dan bahan mentah yang meningkat lebih daripada 22.0 peratus tahun ke tahun. Pada masa yang sama, peningkatan harga gasoline dan produk-produk tenaga menyumbang kepada kenaikan 10.8 peratus bagi inflasi di peringkat pengeluar di Amerika Syarikat pada Mei 2022. Situasi yang sama berlaku kepada negara Asia Selatan seperti Thailand, di mana inflasi di peringkat pengeluar mencatatkan kenaikan 13.3 peratus pada Mei 2022 (April 2022: 12.8%). Peningkatan ini disumbangkan oleh kenaikan dalam sektor Pembuatan dan Perlombongan.”

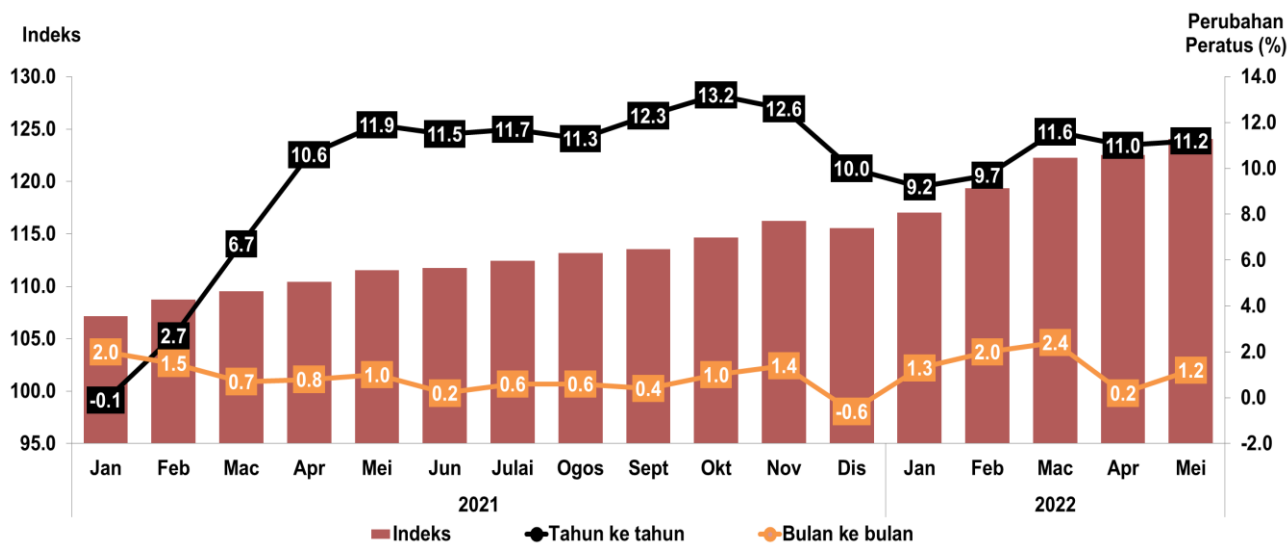

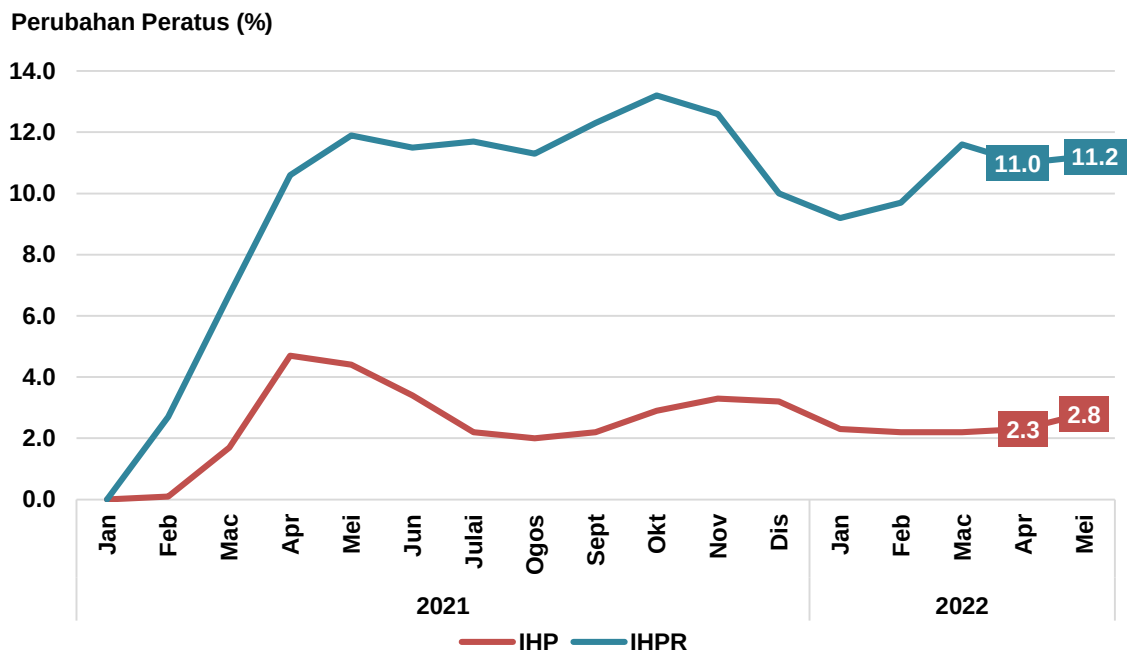

Carta 1: Indeks Harga Pengeluar (IHPR) Pengeluaran Tempatan, Januari 2021 – Mei 2022



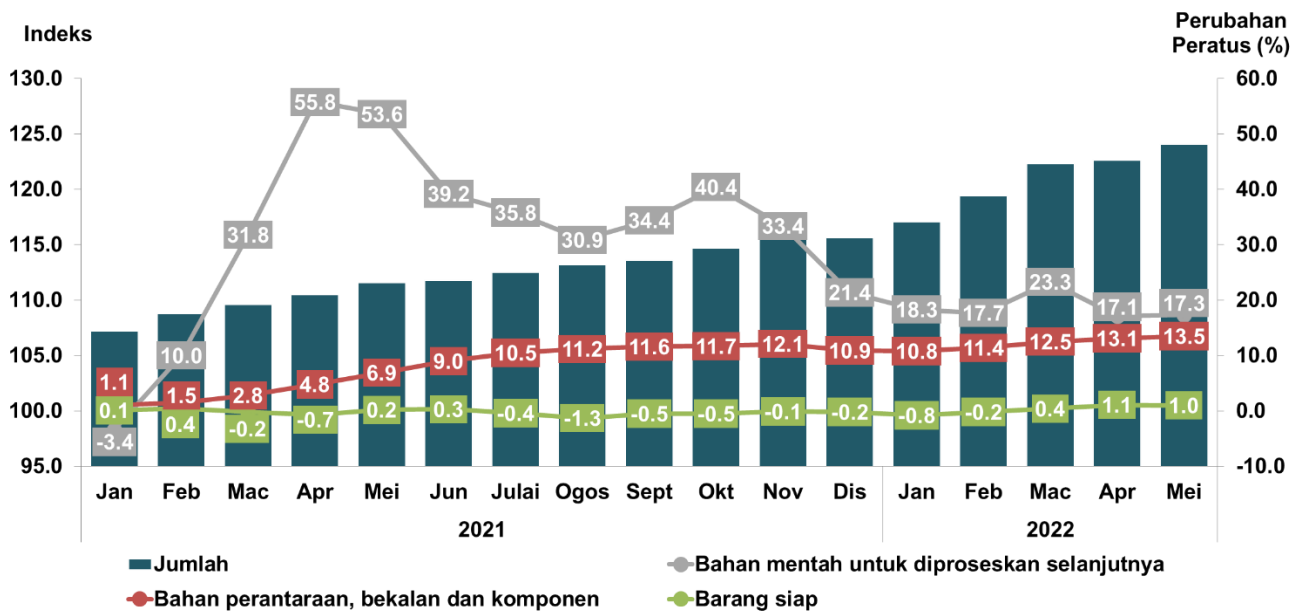

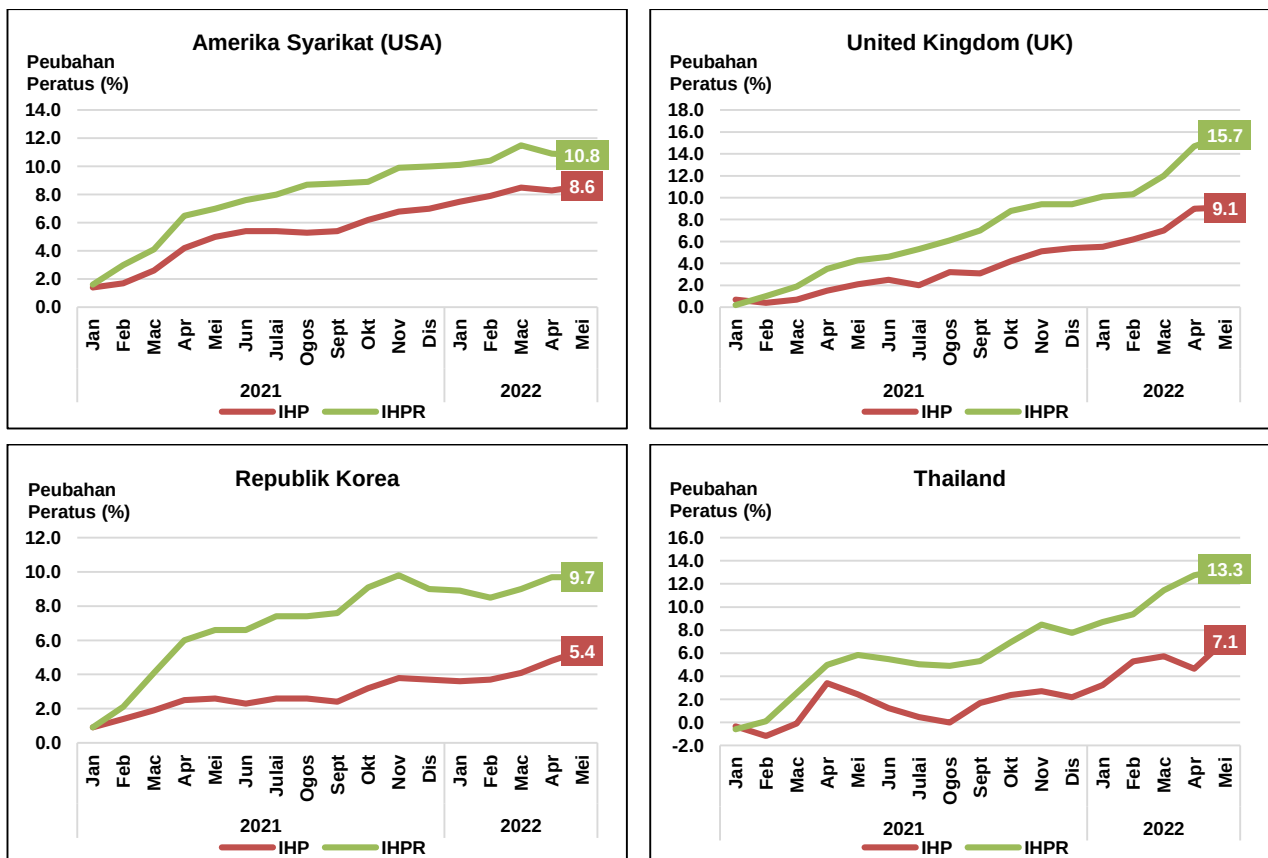

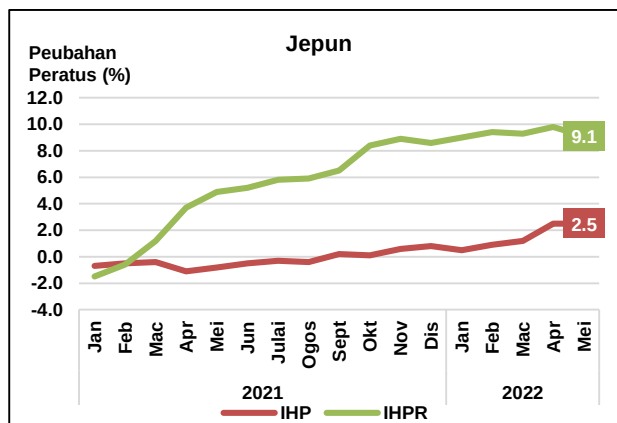
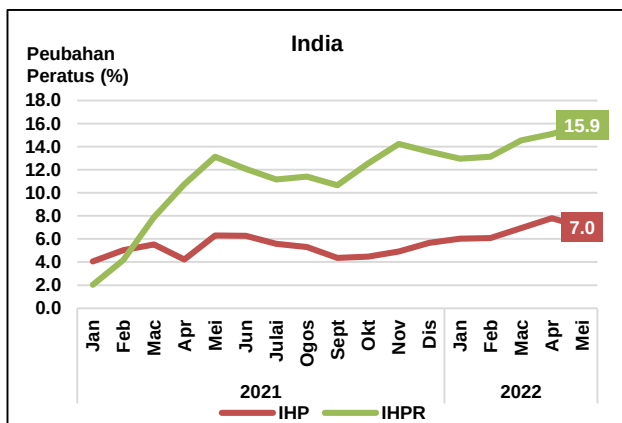

Higher commodity prices pushed Malaysia's Producer Prices to record an increase of 11.2 per cent in May 2022

PUTRAJAYA, 28th June 2022 – The increase in Malaysia's Producer Price Index which measures the prices of goods at factory gate remained high at a rate of 11.2 per cent in May 2022 as compared to 11.0 per cent recorded in April 2022, the Department of Statistics Malaysia reported today in its latest monthly report, the **PRODUCER PRICE INDEX (PPI) LOCAL PRODUCTION, MAY 2022**.

In a statement today, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, the Chief Statistician Malaysia said, "The increase in the PPI local production in May 2022 was attributed by Mining index that increased 20.6 per cent as compared to 18.4 per cent recorded in April 2022. Index of Agriculture, forestry & fishing registered an increase of 16.7 per cent (April 2022: 18.0%) mainly led by an increase in indices of Growing of perennial crops (21.2%), Fishing (11.3%) and Growing of non-perennial crops (7.8%). In May 2022, Manufacturing index registered a double-digit increase of 10.1 per cent for the first time since August 2011 (10.6%), underpinned by an increase in indices of subsectors namely Manufacture of vegetable & animal oils & fats (24.5%), Manufacture of refined petroleum products (22.9%) and Manufacture of basic chemicals, fertilizers & nitrogen compounds, plastics & synthetic rubber in primary forms (13.3%). In addition, the indices of Water supply increased 1.2 per cent, while, Electricity & gas supply decreased 0.6 per cent."

In terms of month-on-month, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin explained, "In May 2022, the PPI local production increased 1.2 per cent as compared to 0.2 per cent recorded in the

previous month. The increase was supported by Mining index that posted 4.0 per cent (April 2022: -6.6%) attributed by the rise in the indices of Crude oil (4.3%) and Natural gas (3.1%). Similarly, Manufacturing index increased 1.0 per cent due to the increase in indices of subsectors namely Manufacture of vegetable & animal oils & fats (2.6%), Manufacture of refined petroleum products (1.3%) and Manufacture of consumer electronics (1.1%). Agriculture, forestry & fishing index also increased 0.9 per cent (April 2022: -2.9%), supported by the increase in the indices of Chicken (3.8%) and Oil palm fresh fruit bunches (0.8%). In addition, the indices of vegetables such as Water spinach, Cucumbers, Chinese mustard, Long beans and Round cabbages also increased. Water supply index increased 0.1 per cent, while, Electricity & gas supply index decreased 0.5 per cent.”

Commenting on the PPI local production by stage of processing, Dato’ Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin said, “The index of Crude materials for further processing increased 17.3 per cent in May 2022 in comparison to 17.1 per cent recorded in April 2022. The increase was contributed by indices of Non-food materials (19.8%) and Foodstuffs & feedstuffs (3.8%). Similarly, index of Intermediate materials, supplies & components continued to post higher increase of 13.5 per cent in May 2022 (April 2022: 13.1%) driven by an increase in indices of Processed fuel & lubricants (18.7%), Materials & components for manufacturing (15.0%) and Supplies (5.7%). Finished goods index also registered an increase in May 2022 with 1.0 per cent (April 2022: 1.1%), attributed by the increase in Finished consumer foods (6.5%) index.”

The Chief Statistician Malaysia also explained that in terms of monthly comparison, index of Crude materials for further processing increased 2.1 per cent as against a 3.5 per cent decline in April 2022. Index of Intermediate materials, supplies & components inclined 1.2 per cent, while Finished goods index rose 0.3 per cent.

Dato’ Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin added, “The double-digit increase in PPI in Malaysia was in line with the rise in inflation at the producer level for selected countries which was affected by supply shortages factor, mainly raw materials due to lockdown ease, opening of economy as well as the war between Russia and Ukraine. Inflation at the producer level for the United Kingdom increased 15.7 per cent in May 2022, up from 14.7 per cent recorded in April 2022. The increase was driven by higher prices for fuel and raw materials which rose

more than 22.0 per cent annually. Similarly, rising prices of gasoline and energy products contributed to a 10.8 per cent increase in the inflation at the producer level for United States in May 2022. A similar situation happened in Southeast Asia countries such as Thailand, where its producer-level inflation recorded a 13.3 per cent increase in May 2022 (April 2022: 12.8%). The increase was contributed by increases in the Manufacturing and Mining sectors.”

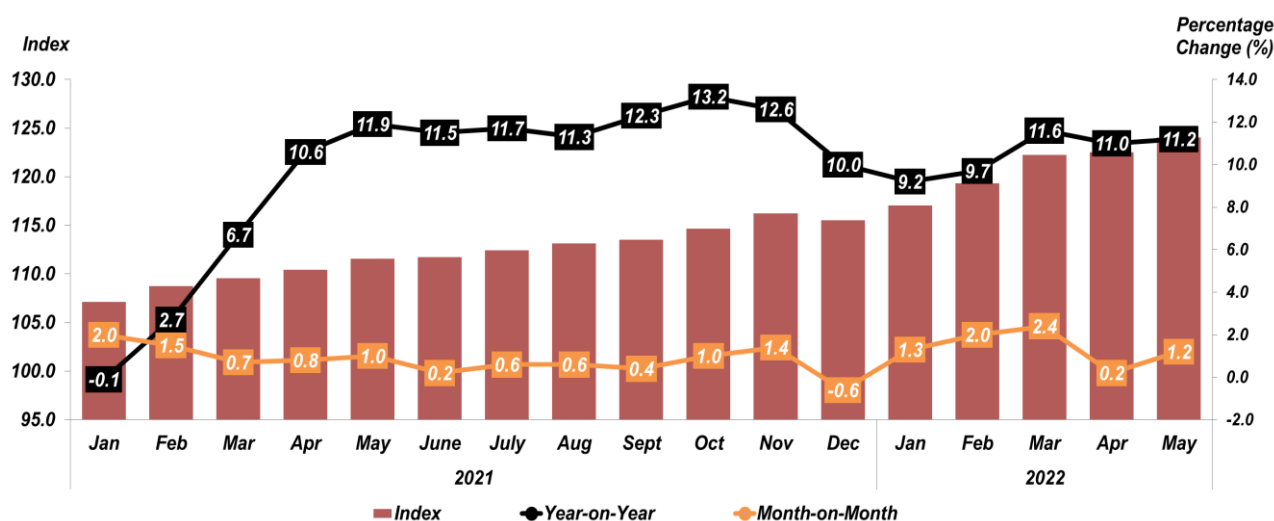

Local Production, January 2021 – May 2022**

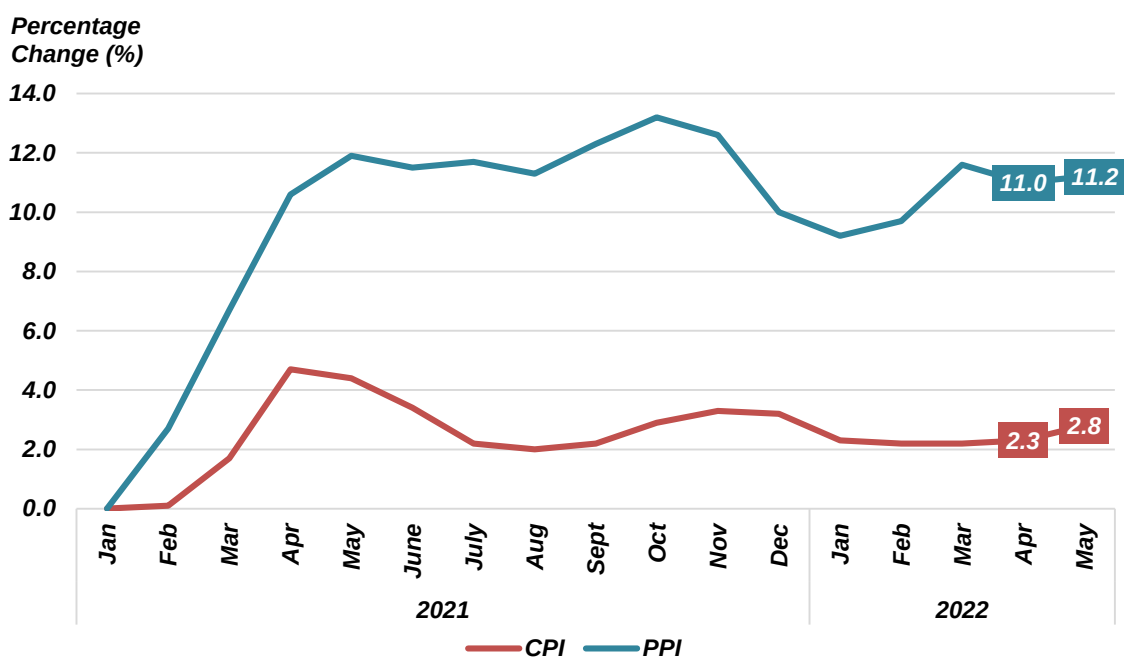

Chart 3: Producer Price Index (PPI) Local Production by Stage of Processing, January 2021 – May 2022

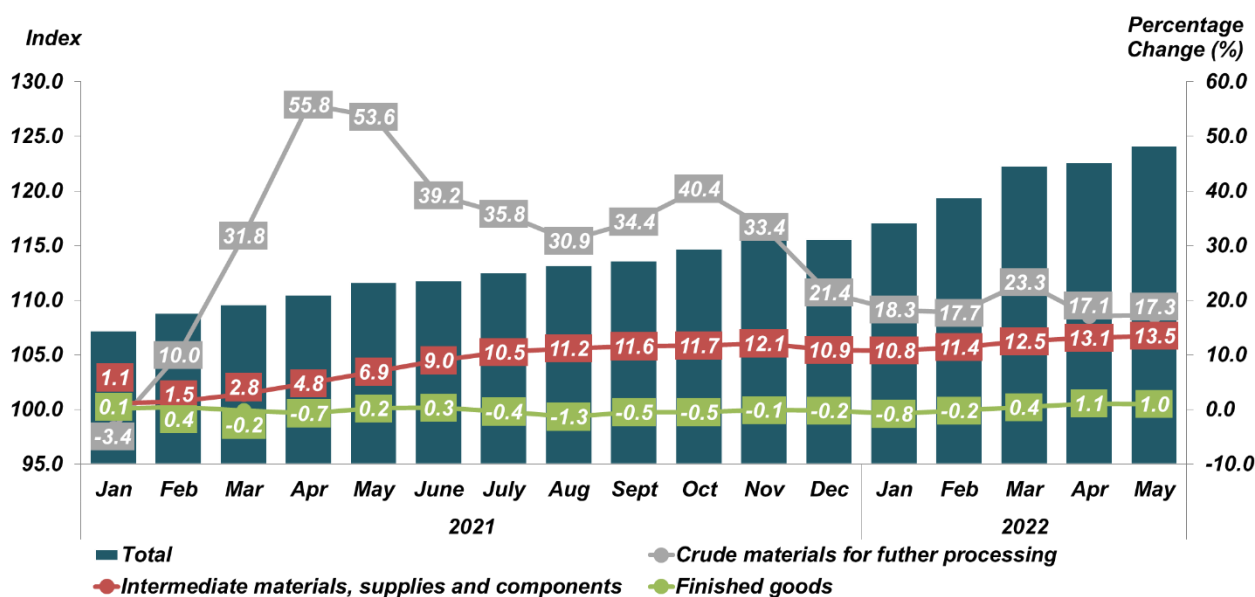
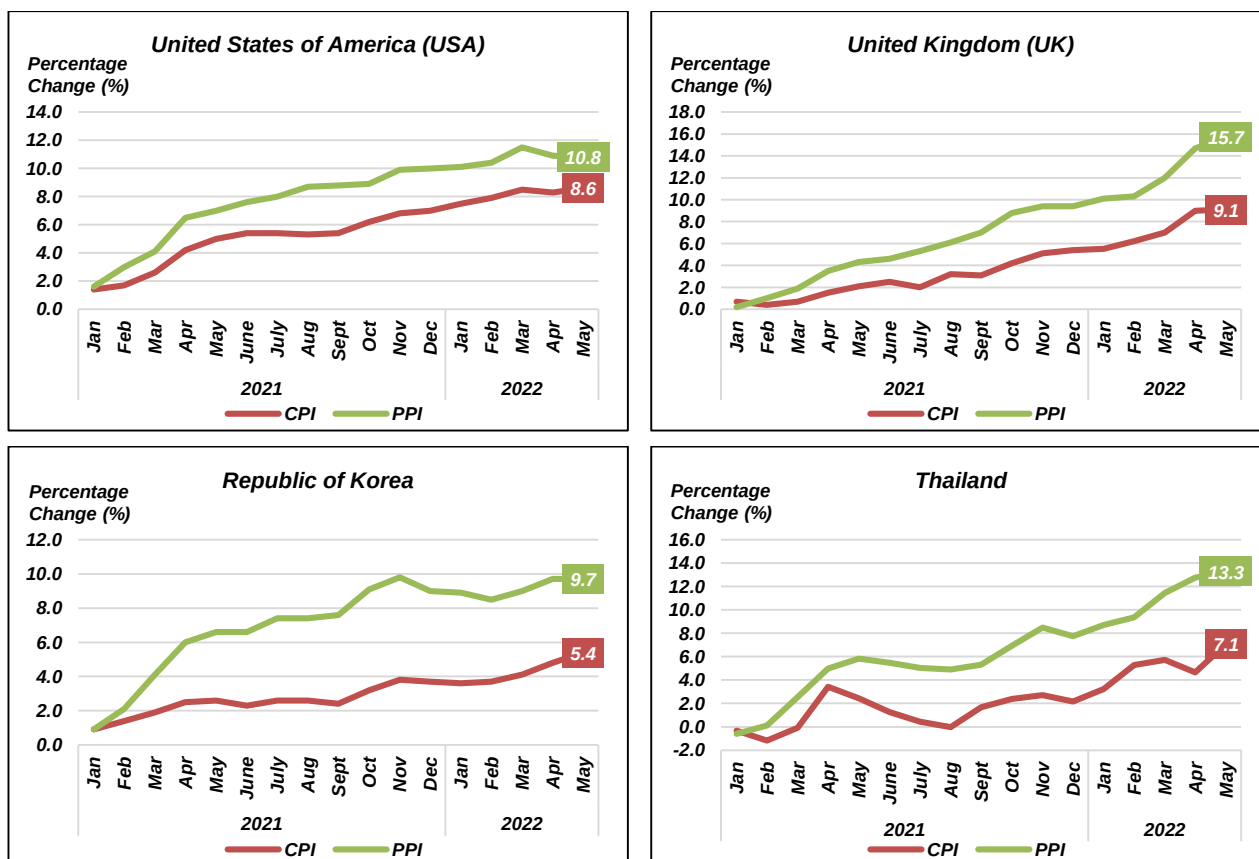
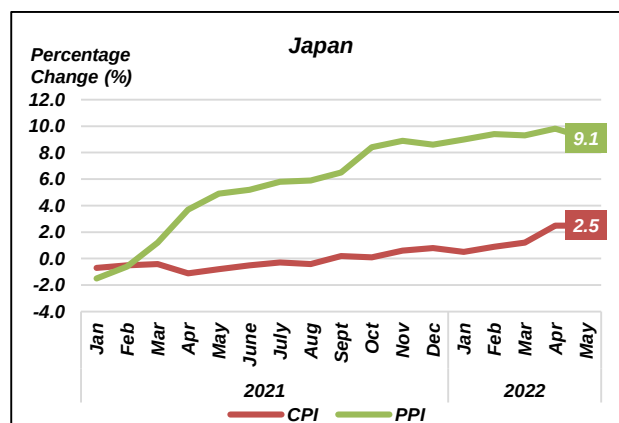
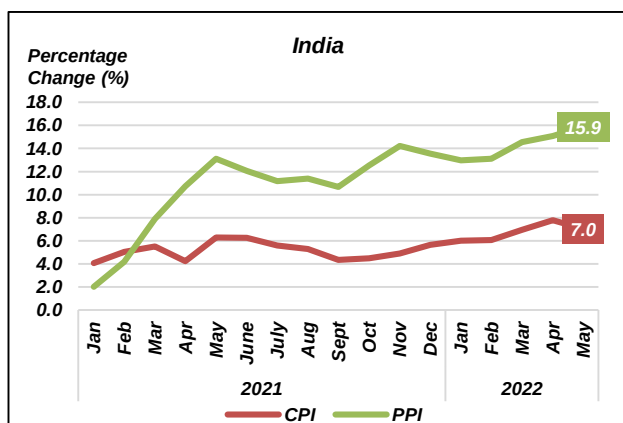


Chart 4: Consumer Price Index (CPI) and Producer Price Index (PPI) of Selected Countries, January 2021 – May 2022
