BAGI PERANGKAAN PERDAGANGAN LUAR NEGERI MALAYSIA,
MEI 2022

Eksport dan Import Mengekalkan Pertumbuhan Dua angka pada Mei 2022,
masing-masing Meningkatkan 30.5 peratus dan 37.3 peratus

PUTRAJAYA, 17 Jun 2022 – Prestasi dagangan Malaysia terus kukuh dan mengekalkan momentum menaik pada Mei 2022. Jumlah dagangan meningkat 33.6 peratus, pertumbuhan dua angka bulan yang ke-16 berturut-turut sejak Februari 2021 disokong oleh pertumbuhan tinggi eksport (+30.5%) dan import (+37.3%). Import Malaysia merekodkan nilai tertinggi baharu pada RM107.9 bilion, selari dengan lonjakan barangan perantaraan 34.1 peratus, menandakan aktiviti ekonomi domestik yang lebih baik sebagai mana dilaporkan dalam **BULETIN PERANGKAAN PERDAGANGAN LUAR NEGERI MALAYSIA, MEI 2022** hari ini. Buletin ini turut memaparkan prestasi produk bagi import dan eksport dan rakan dagangannya.

Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin berkata "Eksport Malaysia pada Mei 2022, meningkat 30.5 peratus daripada RM92.3 bilion kepada RM120.5 bilion. Pertumbuhan ini didorong oleh kedua-dua eksport domestik dan eksport semula. Eksport domestik bernilai RM96.0 bilion menyumbang 79.7 peratus kepada jumlah eksport, meningkat 22.1 peratus, tahun ke tahun. Sementara itu, eksport semula mencatatkan RM24.4 bilion, meningkat 79.1 peratus. Selari dengan prestasi eksport, import pada Mei 2022 juga mencatatkan pertumbuhan dua angka 37.3 peratus daripada RM78.6 bilion pada Mei 2021 kepada RM107.9 bilion, pertumbuhan tertinggi sejak November 2021. Lebihan dagangan pada Mei 2022 bernilai RM12.6 bilion, merupakan lebihan dagangan yang ke-25 bulan berturut-turut sejak Mei 2020. Namun begitu, pertumbuhan yang memberangsangkan ini turut dipengaruhi oleh prestasi lemah semasa PKP 3.0 pada Mei 2021. Di samping itu, berbanding April 2022, prestasi jumlah dagangan, eksport dan lebihan dagangan menunjukkan penurunan masing-masing 1.4 peratus, 5.6 peratus dan 46.3 peratus. Sebaliknya, import meningkat 3.6 peratus."

Selaras dengan pertumbuhan tahunan, 167 daripada 256 kumpulan barangan untuk eksport menunjukkan peningkatan berbanding bulan yang sama pada tahun sebelumnya, dipaju oleh injap & tiub termionik. Bagi import, 172 daripada 260 kumpulan mencatatkan pertumbuhan positif.

Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia juga melaporkan bahawa peningkatan eksport disumbangkan terutamanya oleh eksport yang lebih tinggi ke Singapura (+RM5.3 bilion), Hong Kong (+RM2.7 bilion), Kesatuan Eropah (+RM2.3 bilion), Indonesia (+RM1.8 bilion), Amerika Syarikat (+RM1.6 bilion), Taiwan (+RM1.6 bilion), Thailand (+RM1.5 bilion), Bangladesh (+RM1.5 bilion) dan China (+RM1.4 bilion). Sementara itu, penyumbang utama peningkatan import diterajui oleh Singapura dengan nilai peningkatan RM5.2 bilion. Ia diikuti oleh Viet Nam (+RM4.0 bilion), Taiwan (+RM2.6 bilion), China (+RM2.3 bilion), Amerika Syarikat (+RM2.0 bilion), Kesatuan Eropah (+RM1.8 bilion), Indonesia (+RM1.5 bilion), Emiriah Arab Bersatu (+RM1.4 bilion) dan Republik Korea (+RM1.1 bilion).

Mengulas lebih lanjut mengenai eksport, peningkatan mengikut produk didorong oleh barangan elektrik & elektronik (+RM14.3 bilion); keluaran petroleum (+RM5.6 bilion); minyak kelapa sawit & keluaran pertanian berasaskan minyak kelapa sawit (+RM3.1 bilion); gas asli cecair (+RM1.8 bilion); barangan perkilangan berasaskan minyak kelapa sawit (+RM1.6 bilion) dan petroleum mentah (+RM980.3 juta). Sementara itu, kenaikan import dicatatkan bagi barangan elektrik & elektronik (+RM11.5 bilion); keluaran petroleum (+RM5.2 bilion); arang batu (+RM2.5 bilion); kimia & bahan kimia (+RM1.6 bilion); emas (+RM1.3 bilion) dan petroleum mentah (+RM1.3 bilion).

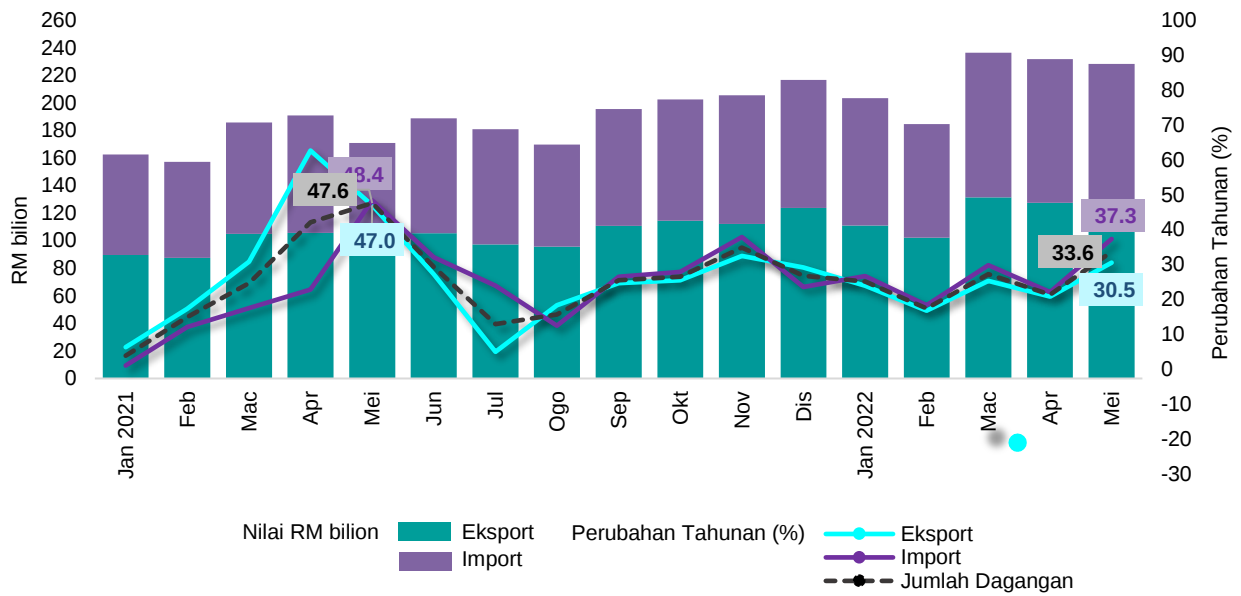
Pertumbuhan import mengikut Penggunaan Akhir disokong oleh permintaan tinggi bagi barangan perantaraan dan barangan penggunaan. Import barangan perantaraan (58.4% daripada jumlah import) berjumlah RM62.9 bilion, meningkat RM16.0 bilion atau 34.1 peratus. Barangan penggunaan (7.9% daripada jumlah import) mencatatkan kenaikan 19.3 peratus daripada RM7.1 bilion pada tahun sebelumnya kepada RM8.5 bilion. Sebaliknya, import barangan modal yang berjumlah RM8.8 bilion, menurun 0.8 peratus berbanding Mei 2021, dan merangkumi 8.2 peratus daripada jumlah import.

Di samping itu, prestasi bagi Januari sehingga Mei 2022, jumlah dagangan, eksport, import dan lebihan dagangan kekal kukuh dengan pertumbuhan dua angka. Jumlah dagangan meningkat 25.1 peratus, disokong oleh perkembangan eksport (+23.5%) serta import (+27.0%). Pada masa yang sama, lebihan dagangan mencatatkan nilai yang lebih tinggi pada RM101.1 bilion.

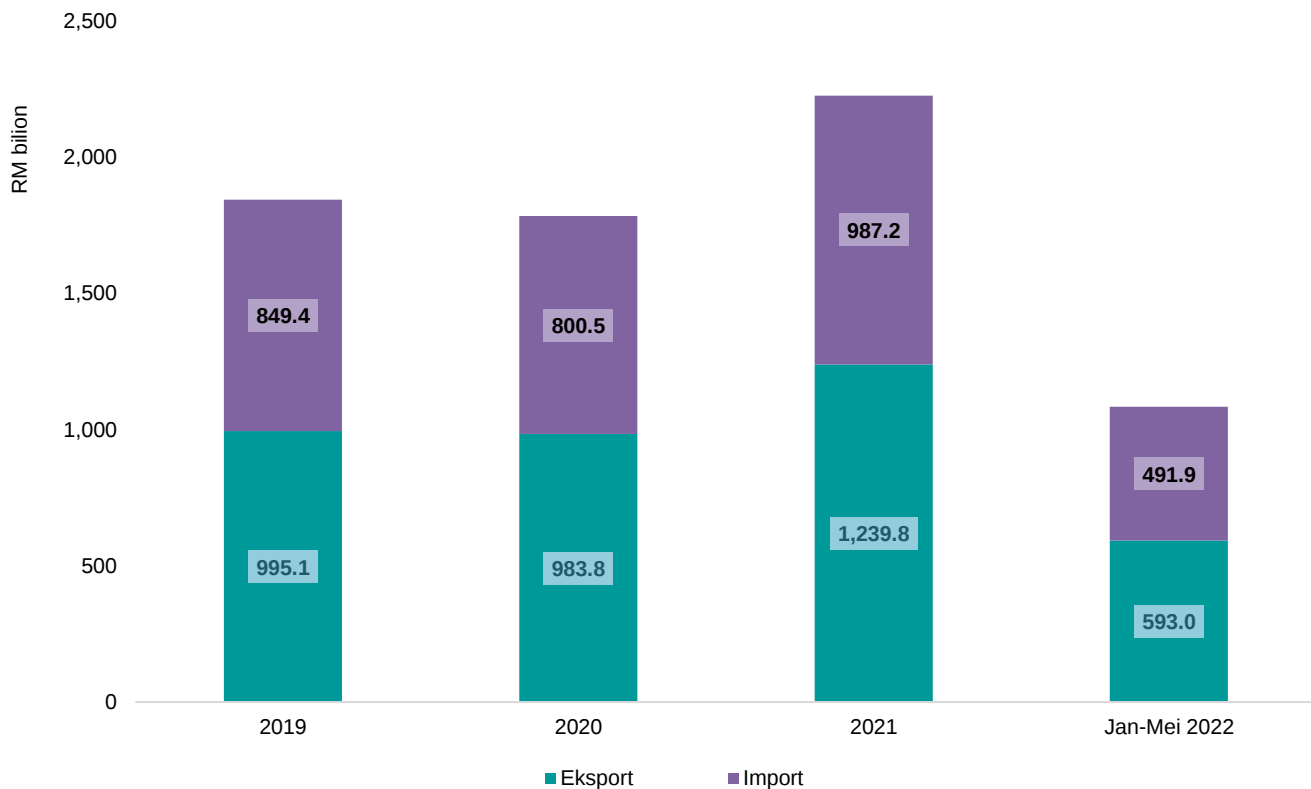

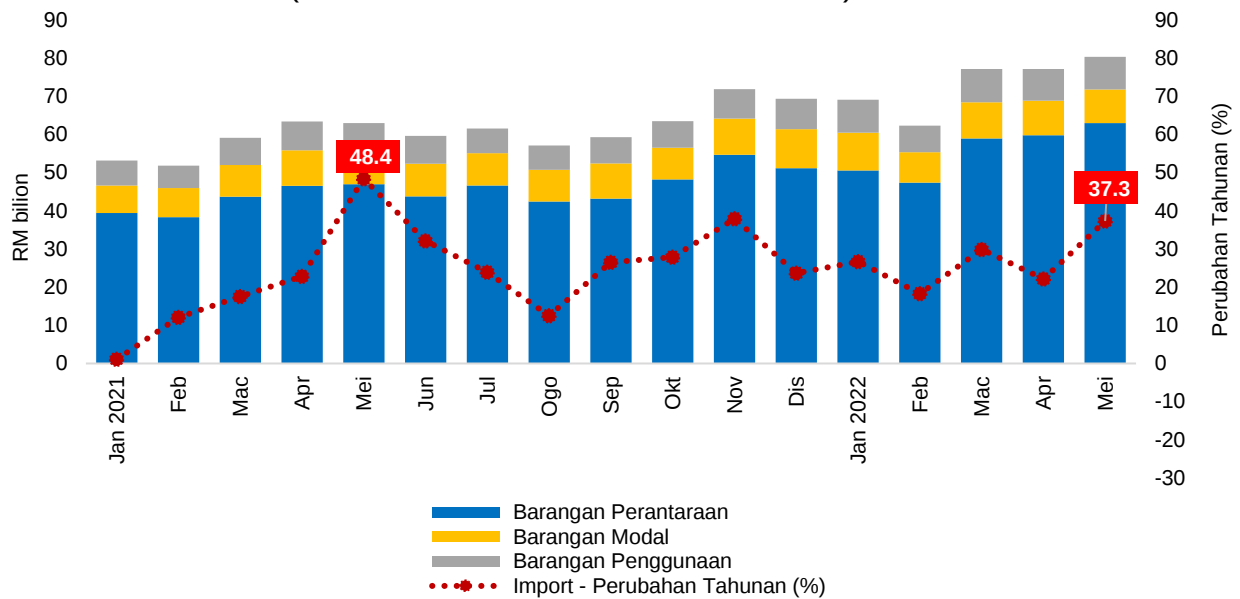
Carta 1: Perangkaan Perdagangan Luar Negeri, Jan 2021 – Mei 2022
(Nilai dan Peratus Perubahan Tahunan)



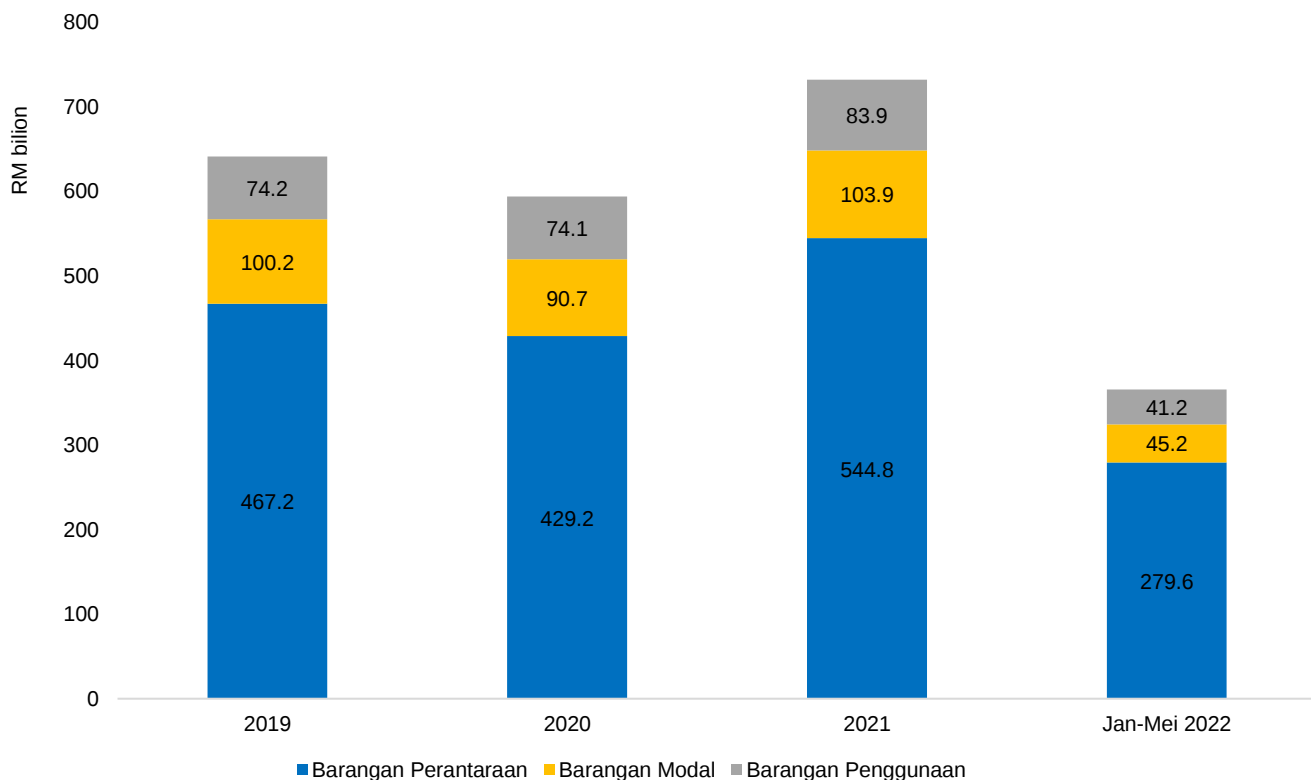
Carta 2: Perangkaan Perdagangan Luar Negeri, 2018 – 2022 (Jan-Mei)



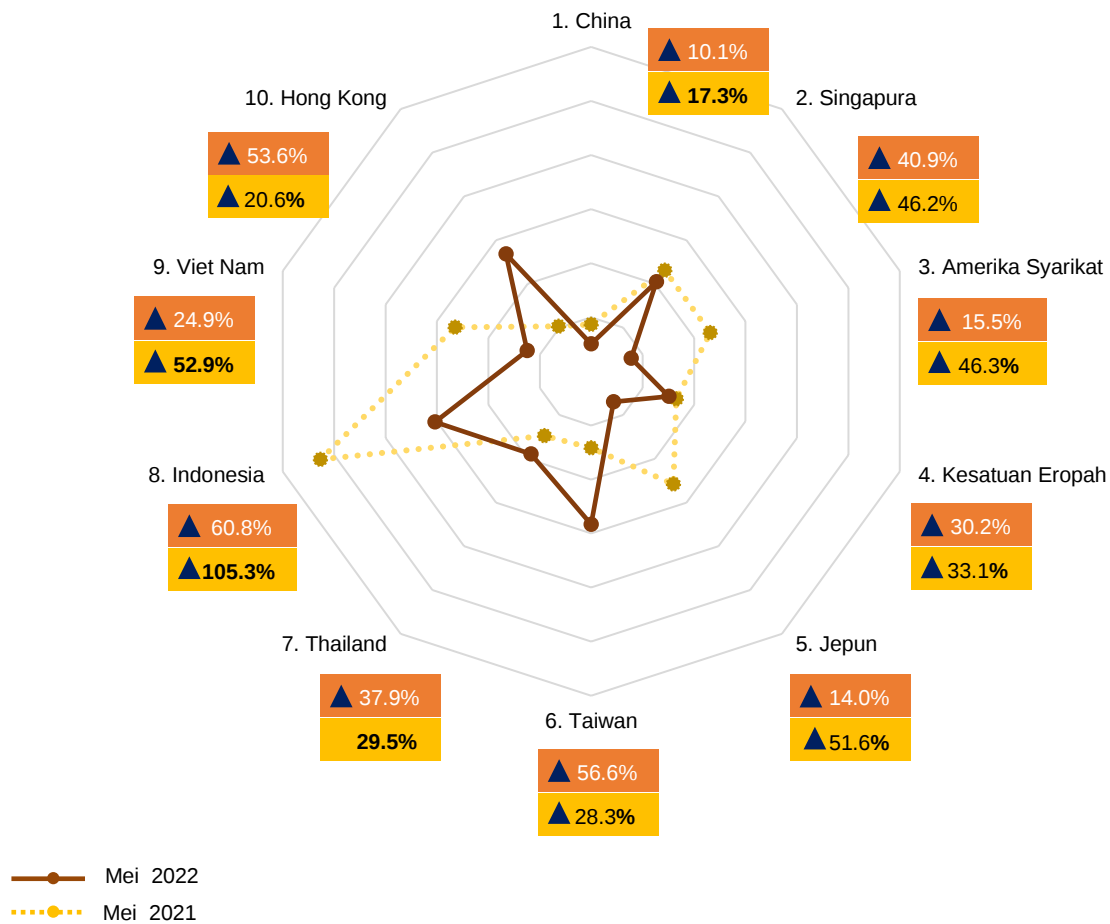

***Exports and Imports Maintained Double-digit Growths in May 2022, Surged
by 30.5 per cent and 37.3 per cent, respectively***

PUTRAJAYA, June 17, 2022 – Malaysia's trade performance remained resilient and maintained its upward momentum in May 2022. Total trade increased by 33.6 per cent making the 16th consecutive month of double-digit growth since February 2021, supported by higher exports (+30.5%) and imports (+37.3%). Malaysia's imports recorded all-time high at RM107.9 billion, in line with the surge in intermediate goods by 34.1 per cent, signified a positive sign of domestic economic activity as reported today in **MALAYSIA EXTERNAL TRADE STATISTICS BULLETIN, MAY 2022**. This bulletin also presents the performance of products for imports and exports and its trading partners.

Chief Statistician Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin said "Malaysia's exports in May 2022, accelerated by 30.5 per cent from RM92.3 billion to RM120.5 billion. Export value growth in May 2022 was supported by both, domestic exports and re-exports. Domestic exports was valued at RM96.0 billion contributed 79.7 per cent to total exports, grew by 22.1 per cent, year-on-year (y-o-y). Meanwhile, re-exports registered RM24.4 billion, increased by 79.1 per cent. Consistent with export performance, imports in May 2022 also registered double-digit growth of 37.3 per cent from RM78.6 billion in May 2021 to RM107.9 billion, the highest growth since November 2021. Trade surplus in May 2022 with a value of RM12.6 billion, marked the 25th consecutive month of trade surplus since May 2020. Nevertheless, this outstanding growth was also influenced from a weak performance during MCO 3.0 in May 2021. In addition, compared with April 2022, the performance of total trade, exports and trade surplus showed declines of 1.4 per cent, 5.6 per cent and 46.3 per cent, respectively. On the other hand, imports increased by 3.6 per cent."

In conjunction to the annual growth, 167 out of 256 commodity groups in exports showed increases as compared to the same month of the previous year and led by thermionic valves & tubes. As for imports, 172 of 260 groups posted positive growths.

Department of Statistics Malaysia also reported, the rise in exports was attributable mainly to the higher exports to Singapore (+RM5.3 billion), Hong Kong (+RM2.7 billion), the European Union (+RM2.3 billion), Indonesia (+RM1.8 billion), the United States (+RM1.6 billion), Taiwan (+RM1.6 billion), Thailand (+RM1.5 billion), Bangladesh (+RM1.5 billion) and China (+RM1.4 billion). On the same note, the top contributor to the increase in imports was led by Singapore with a value of RM5.2 billion increase. It was followed by Viet Nam (+RM4.0 billion), Taiwan (+RM2.6 billion), China (+RM2.3 billion), the United States (+RM2.0 billion), the European Union (+RM1.8 billion), Indonesia (+RM1.5 billion), the United Arab Emirates (+RM1.4 billion) and Republic of Korea (+RM1.1 billion).

Commenting further on exports, the expansion by products was driven by electrical & electronic products (+RM14.3 billion); petroleum products (+RM5.6 billion); palm oil & palm oil-based agriculture products (+RM3.1 billion); liquefied natural gas (+RM1.8 billion); palm oil-based manufactured products (+RM1.6 billion) and crude petroleum (+RM980.3 million). Meanwhile, the rise in imports were noted for electrical & electronic products (+RM11.5 billion); petroleum products (+RM5.2 billion); coal (+RM2.5 billion); chemical & chemical products (+RM1.6 billion); gold (+RM1.3 billion) and crude petroleum (+RM1.3 billion).

On the same note, the expansion in imports by End Use sustained by higher demand primarily for intermediate goods and consumption goods. Imports of intermediate goods (58.4 % of the total imports) totalled RM62.9 billion, expanded by RM16.0 billion or 34.1 per cent. Consumption goods (7.9% of total imports) registered an increase of 19.3 per cent from RM7.1 billion in the preceding year to RM8.5 billion. In contrary, imports of capital goods amounted RM8.8 billion, shrank by 0.8 per cent as compared to May 2021, and comprised of 8.2 per cent of total imports.

In addition, the performance for January to May 2022, total trade, exports, imports and trade surplus continued to record strong double-digit growths. Total trade went up by 25.1 per cent, supported by the expansion in exports (+23.5%) as well as imports (+27.0%). Consequently, trade surplus recorded a higher value of RM101.1 billion.

(Value and Annual Percentage Change)

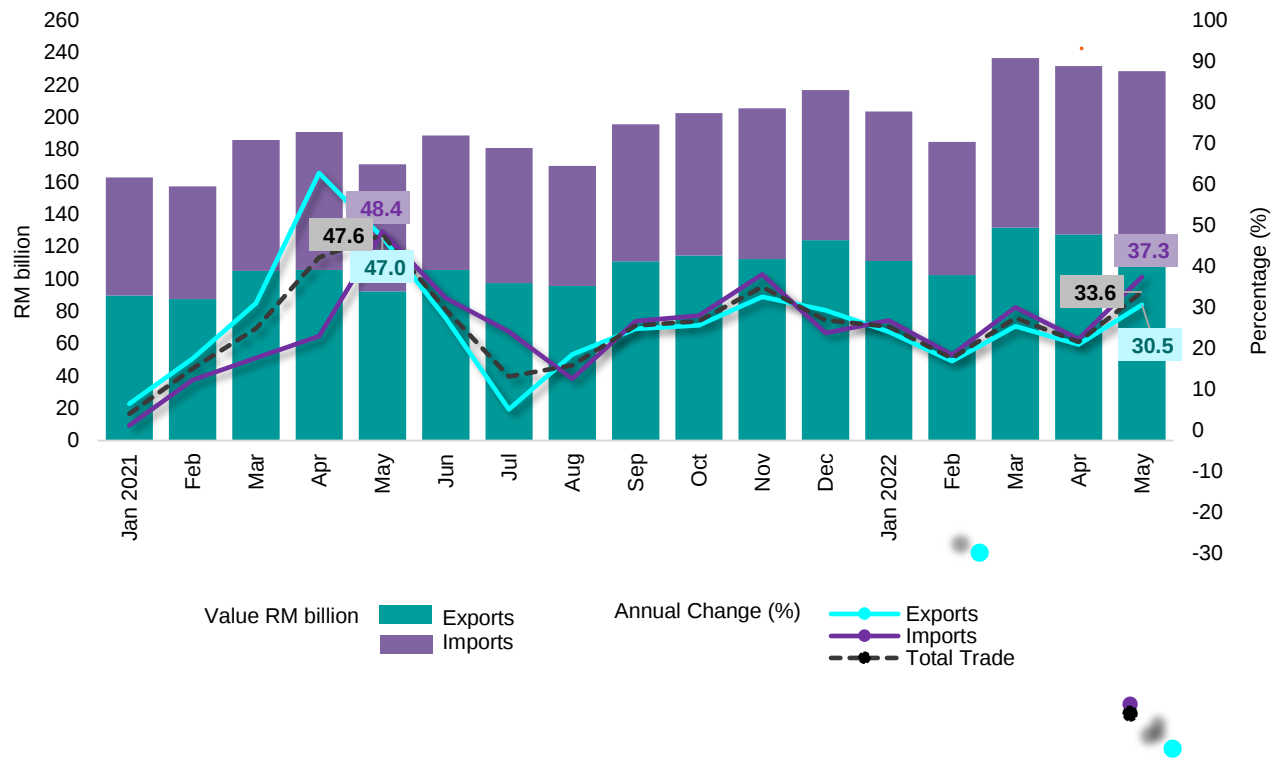
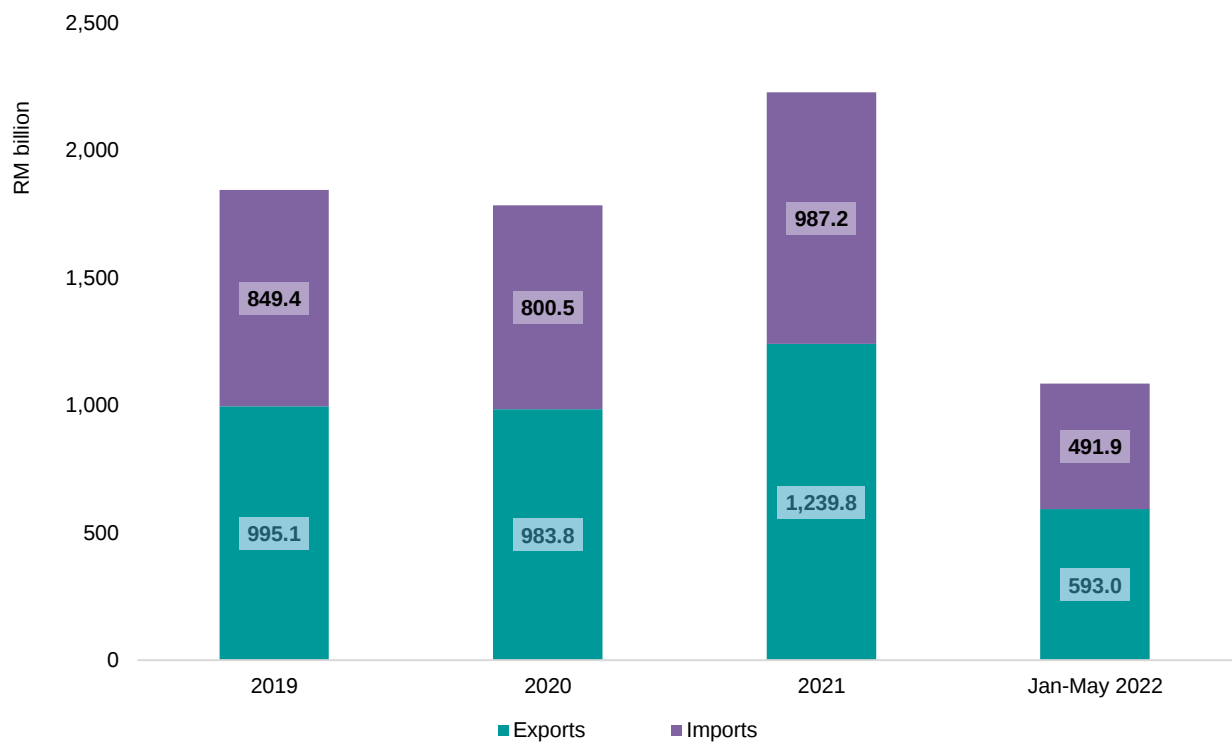
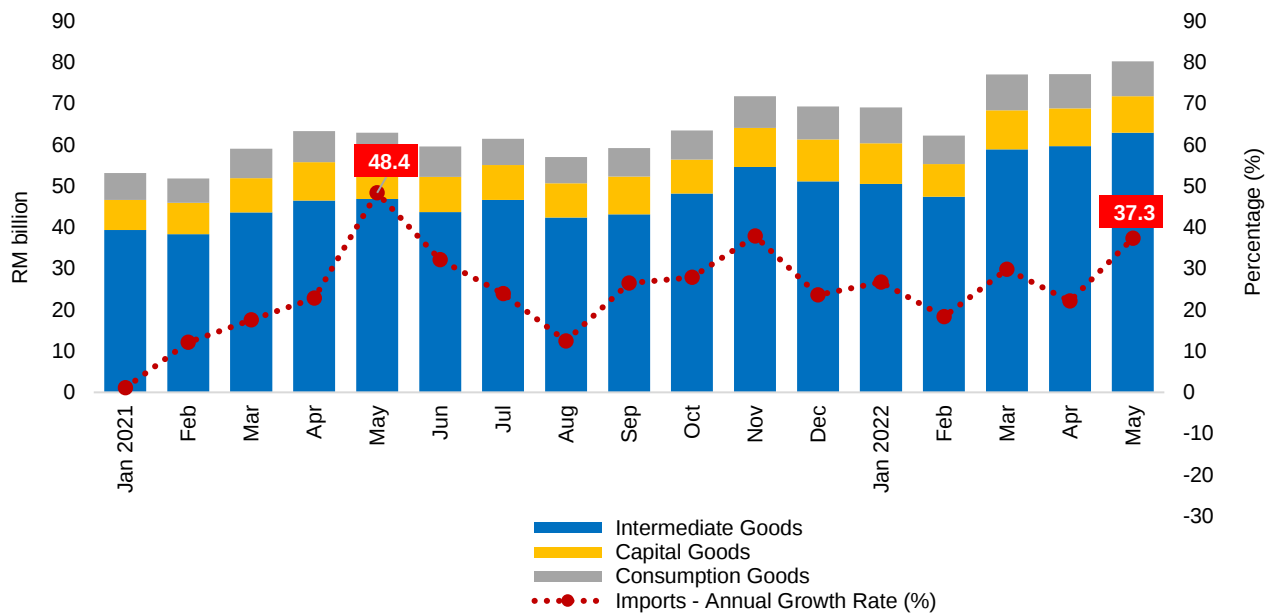


Chart 2: External Trade Statistics, 2018 – 2022 (Jan-May)

2019 – 2022 (Jan-May)*

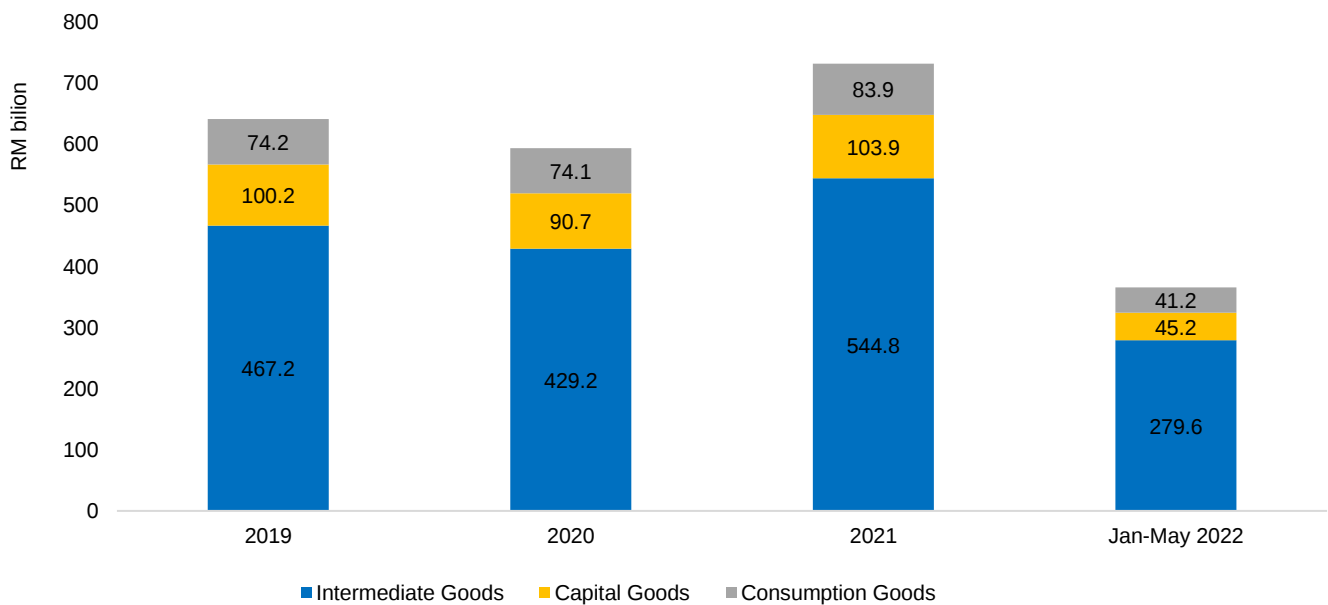
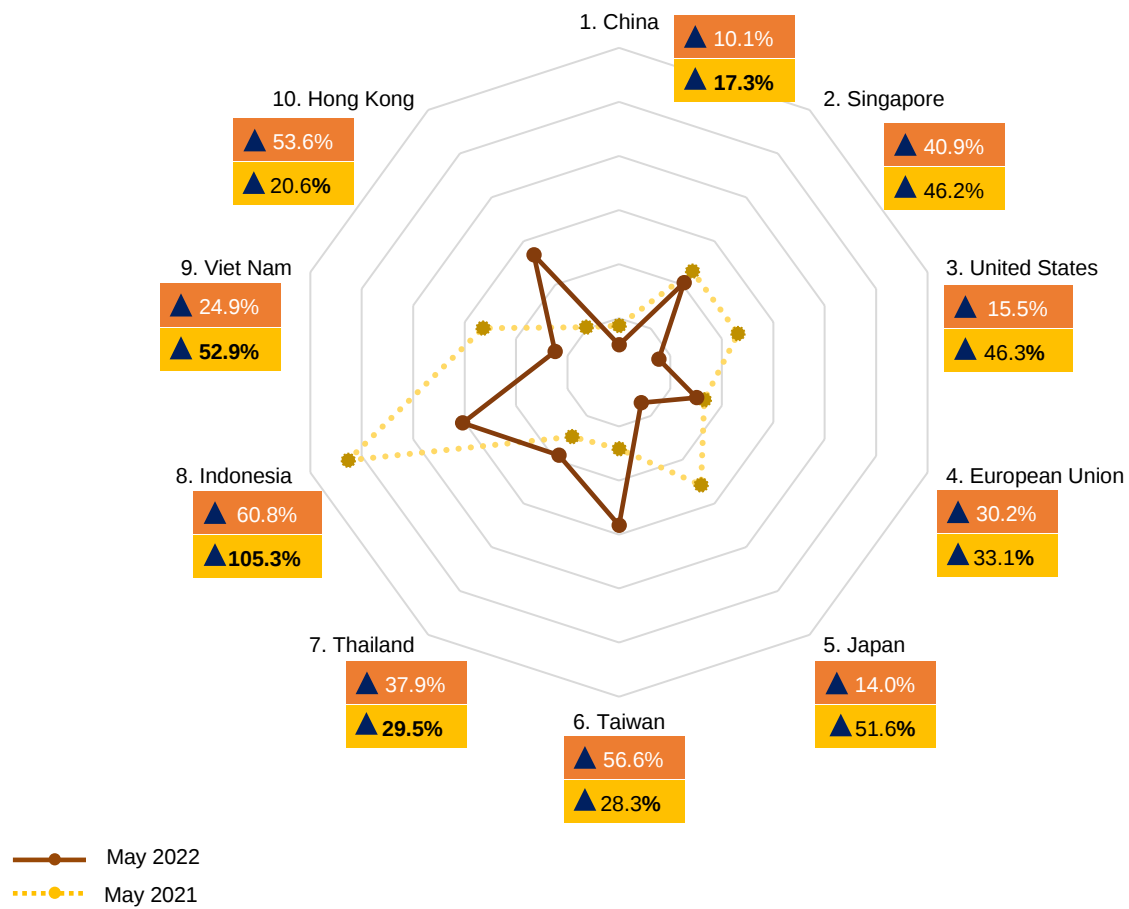


Chart 5: Performance of Exports for Major Trading Partners, May 2021 and May 2022
