KENYATAAN MEDIA BAGI STATISTIK EKSPORT IMPORT MENGIKUT NEGERI APRIL 2022

JOHOR MENCATATKAN EKSPORT TERTINGGI BAGI PAKAIAN DAN SEGALA KELENGKAPAN PAKAIAN TERPILIH SEBANYAK RM272.7 JUTA PADA APRIL 2022

PUTRAJAYA, 27 Mei 2022 – Jumlah dagangan Malaysia pada bulan April 2022 bernilai RM231.4 bilion (peningkatan 21.3% tahun ke tahun) dengan nilai eksport RM127.5 bilion (peningkatan 20.7% tahun ke tahun) dan import bernilai RM103.9 bilion (peningkatan 22.0% tahun ke tahun). Pada April 2022, eksport pakaian dan segala kelengkapan pakaian terpilih meningkat 18.5 peratus tahun ke tahun kepada RM499.9 juta. Di peringkat negeri, Johor mencatatkan eksport tertinggi bagi pakaian dan segala kelengkapan pakaian terpilih bernilai RM272.7 juta (54.5%), diikuti Selangor (RM104.3 juta, 20.9%) dan Perlis (RM41.0 juta, 8.2%) seperti yang dilaporkan hari ini dalam **STATISTIK EKSPORT IMPORT MENGIKUT NEGERI APRIL 2022**.

Dalam satu kenyataan pada hari ini, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia berkata, "Eksport pada bulan April 2022 meningkat sebanyak RM21.9 bilion (+20.7%) berbanding bulan yang sama tahun sebelumnya. Eksport lebih tinggi direkodkan bagi kebanyakan negeri iaitu Pulau Pinang (+RM9.0 bilion), Selangor (+RM3.7 bilion), Sarawak (+RM3.4 bilion), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM1.7 bilion), Sabah (+RM1.6 bilion), Johor (+RM1.6 bilion), Kedah (+RM1.3 bilion), Pahang (+RM518.0 juta), W.P. Labuan (+RM456.0 juta), Kelantan (+RM132.5 juta) dan Perlis (+RM15.1 juta). Walau bagaimanapun, eksport menyusut di Melaka (-RM631.4 juta), Terengganu (-RM349.2 juta), Negeri Sembilan (-RM324.0 juta) dan Perak (-RM280.1 juta)."

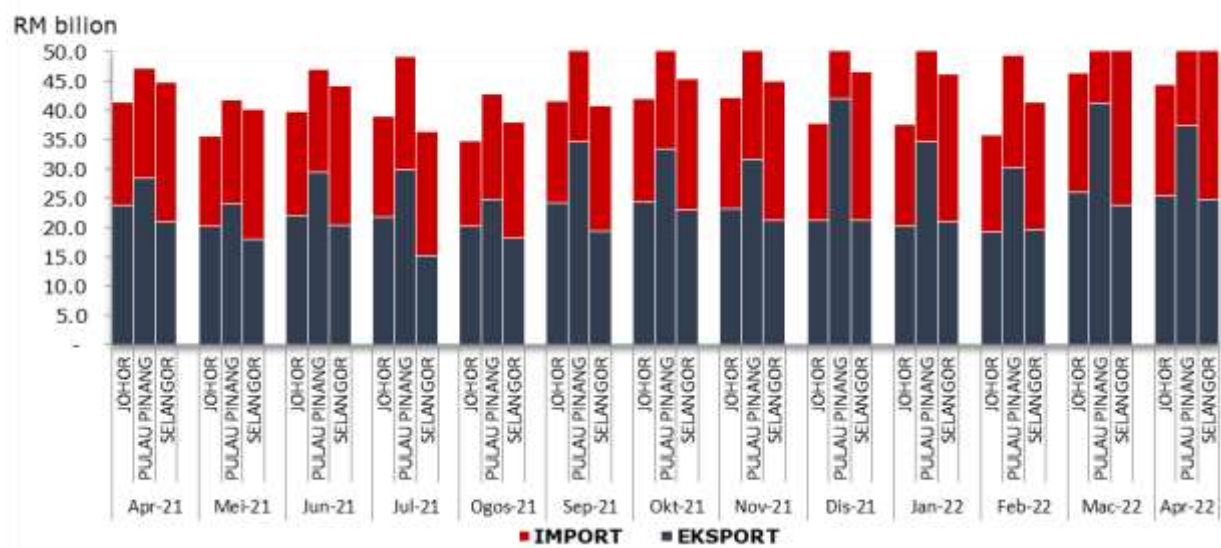
Beralih kepada prestasi import mengikut negeri, Ketua Perangkawan memaklumkan, “Import juga meningkat RM18.7 billion (+22.0%) pada April 2022 berbanding bulan yang sama tahun sebelumnya. Peningkatan import dicatatkan di Pulau Pinang (+RM5.4 bilion), Selangor (+RM3.0 bilion), Melaka (+RM2.2 bilion), Kedah (+RM1.7 bilion), Johor (+RM1.5 bilion), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM1.4 bilion), Sarawak (+RM902.4 juta), Perak (+RM826.1 juta), Negeri Sembilan (+RM674.0 juta), Pahang (+RM527.4 juta), W.P. Labuan (+RM179.2 juta) dan Perlis (+RM13.0 juta). Walau bagaimanapun, import menurun di Kelantan (-RM170.7 juta), Sabah (-RM102.0 juta) dan Terengganu (-RM38.6 juta).”

Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin seterusnya memaklumkan “Antara lima negeri pengeksport utama, Pulau Pinang kekal sebagai pengeksport utama dengan sumbangan 29.3 peratus, diikuti oleh Johor (20.0%), Selangor (19.5%), Sarawak (8.1%) dan W.P. Kuala Lumpur (4.3%). Sementara itu, bagi import, Selangor kekal sebagai penyumbang utama dengan 25.6 peratus, diikuti oleh Pulau Pinang (23.4%), Johor (18.3%), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (7.3%) dan Kedah (5.7%).”

**JOHOR RECORDED THE HIGHEST EXPORTS OF ARTICLES OF
APPAREL & CLOTHING ACCESSORIES WORTH RM272.7 MILLION
IN APRIL 2022**

PUTRAJAYA, 27 May 2022 – Malaysia's total trade for April 2022 amounted to RM231.4 billion, increased 21.3 per cent year-on-year (y-o-y), with exports of RM127.5 billion (+20.7% y-o-y) and imports worth RM103.9 billion (+22.0% y-o-y). In April 2022, exports of articles of apparel & clothing accessories increased by 18.5 per cent y-o-y to RM499.9 million. At the state level, Johor recorded the highest exports of articles of apparel & clothing accessories worth RM272.7 million (54.5%), followed by Selangor (RM104.3 million, 20.9%) and Perlis (RM41.0 million, 8.2%) as reported today in **EXPORT IMPORT STATISTICS BY STATE APRIL 2022**.

In a statement today, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, Chief Statistician Malaysia said, "Exports in April 2022 increased RM21.9 billion (+20.7%) compared to the same month of the previous year. Higher exports were recorded in most states such as Pulau Pinang (+RM9.0 billion), Selangor (+RM3.7 billion), Sarawak (+RM3.4 billion), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM1.7 billion), Sabah (+RM1.6 billion), Johor (+RM1.6 billion), Kedah (+RM1.3 billion), Pahang (+RM518.0 million), W.P. Labuan (+RM456.0 million), Kelantan (+RM132.5 million) and Perlis (+RM15.1 million). However, exports decreased in Melaka (-RM631.4 million), Terengganu (-RM349.2 million), Negeri Sembilan (-RM324.0 million) and Perak (-RM280.1 million)."

Looking at the performance of imports by state, the Chief Statistician informed, “Imports also increased RM18.7 billion (+22.0%) in April 2022 compared to the same month of the previous year. Higher imports were mainly from Pulau Pinang (+RM5.4 billion), Selangor (+RM3.0 billion), Melaka (+RM2.2 billion), Kedah (+RM1.7 billion), Johor (+RM1.5 billion), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM1.4 billion), Sarawak (+RM902.4 million), Perak (+RM826.1 million), Negeri Sembilan (+RM674.0 million), Pahang (+RM527.4 million), W.P. Labuan (+RM179.2 million) and Perlis (+RM13.0 million). However, imports decreased in Kelantan (-RM170.7 million), Sabah (-RM102.0 million) and Terengganu (-RM38.6 million).”

Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin also informed, “Among the top five major exporting states, Pulau Pinang remained as the top exporter with a share of 29.3 per cent, followed by Johor (20.0%), Selangor (19.5%), Sarawak (8.1%) and W.P. Kuala Lumpur (4.3%). Meanwhile, as for imports, Selangor remained as the largest contributor with a share of 25.6 per cent, followed by Pulau Pinang (23.4%), Johor (18.3%), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (7.3%) and Kedah (5.7%).”

Chart 1: Time Series Data on Exports and Imports in Johor, Pulau Pinang and Selangor, April 2021 – April 2022 (RM Billion)

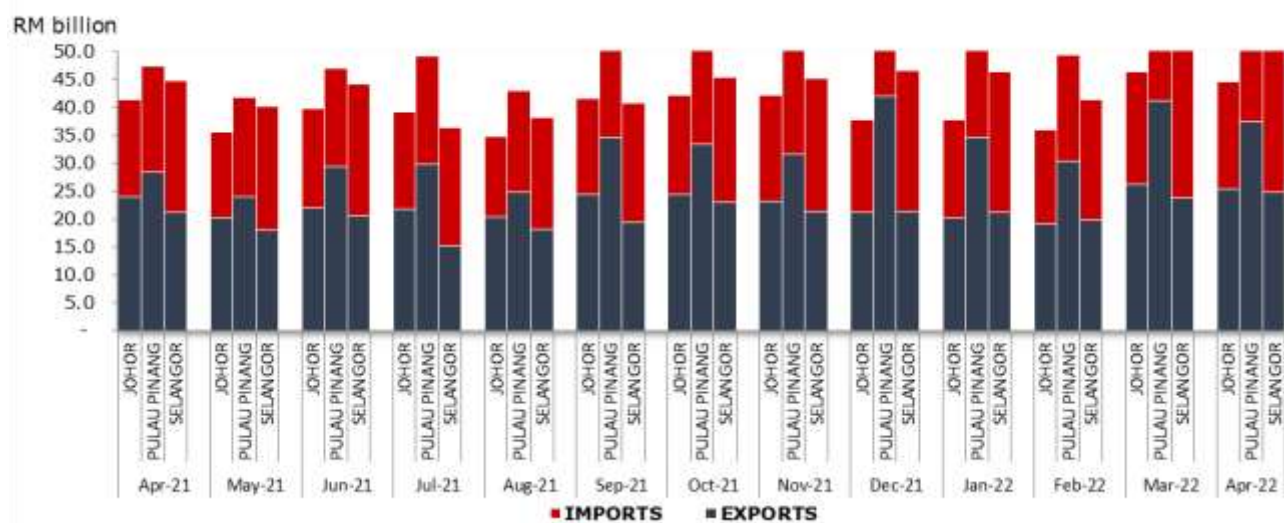
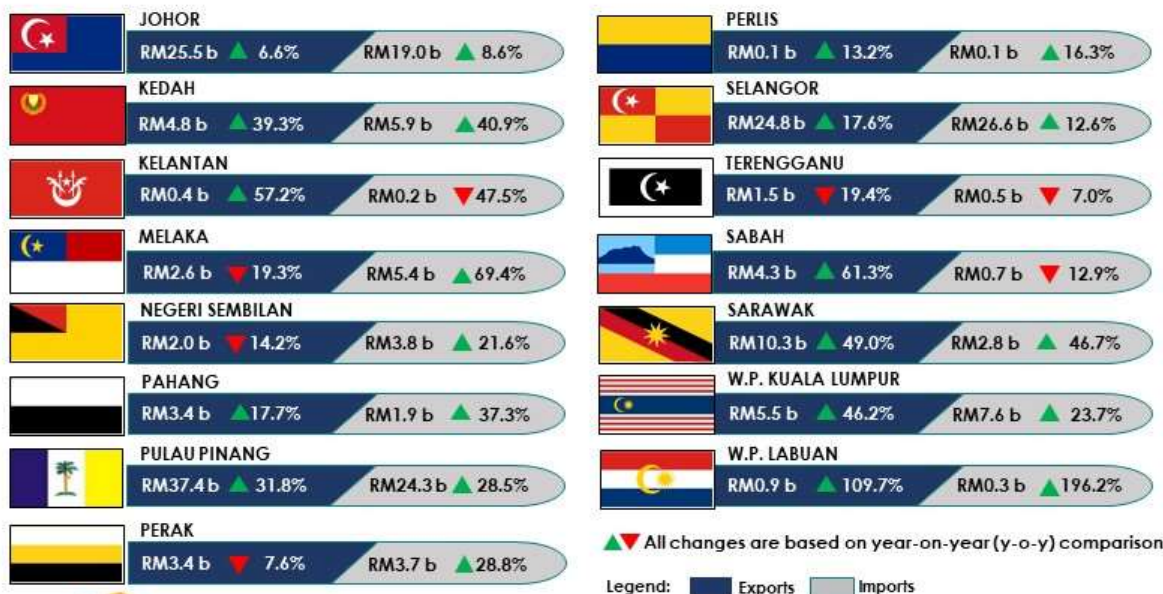


Exhibit 1: Infographic on Export Import Statistics by State April 2022
