**SABAH MENCATATKAN EKSPORT TERTINGGI BAGI MINYAK KELAPA SAWIT SEBANYAK RM1.8 BILION PADA MAC 2022**

**PUTRAJAYA, 10 Mei 2022** – Jumlah dagangan Malaysia pada bulan Mac 2022 bernilai RM236.6 bilion (meningkat 27.3% tahun ke tahun) dengan nilai eksport RM131.6 bilion (meningkat 25.4% tahun ke tahun) dan import bernilai RM104.9 bilion (meningkat 29.9% tahun ke tahun). Eksport minyak kelapa sawit bernilai RM7.5 bilion pada Mac 2022. Di peringkat negeri, Sabah mencatatkan eksport tertinggi bagi minyak kelapa sawit bernilai RM1.8 bilion (23.5%), diikuti Johor (RM1.7 bilion, 23.1%) dan Sarawak (RM1.5 bilion, 20.3%) seperti yang dilaporkan hari ini dalam **STATISTIK EKSPORT IMPORT MENGIKUT NEGERI MAC 2022**.


Dalam satu kenyataan pada hari ini, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia berkata, “Eksport pada bulan Mac 2022 meningkat sebanyak RM26.6 bilion (+25.4%) berbanding bulan yang sama tahun sebelumnya. Eksport lebih tinggi direkodkan bagi kebanyakan negeri iaitu Pulau Pinang (+RM9.6 bilion), Johor (+RM6.5 bilion), Sarawak (+RM3.9 bilion), Selangor (+RM2.2 bilion), Kedah (+RM2.1 bilion), Sabah (+RM1.4 bilion), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM1.3 bilion), W.P. Labuan (+RM1.3 bilion), Negeri Sembilan (+RM90.5 juta) dan Perlis (+RM9.7 juta). Walau bagaimanapun, eksport menyusut di Melaka (-RM672.5 juta), Terengganu (-RM545.5 juta), Perak (-RM174.8 juta), Pahang (-RM92.0 juta) dan Kelantan (-RM78.0 juta)”.

Beralih kepada prestasi import mengikut negeri, Ketua Perangkawan memaklumkan, "Import juga meningkat RM24.1 bilion (+29.9%) pada Mac 2022 berbanding bulan yang sama tahun sebelumnya. Peningkatan import dicatatkan di Johor (+RM4.5 bilion), Pulau Pinang (+RM4.5 bilion), Melaka (+RM4.4 bilion), Selangor (+RM2.7 bilion), Negeri Sembilan (+RM1.9 bilion), Kedah (+RM1.6 bilion), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM1.3 bilion), Pahang (+RM1.1 bilion), Sarawak (+RM964.8 juta), Perak (+RM481.0 juta), W.P. Labuan (+RM108.9 juta), Sabah (+RM106.8 juta) dan Perlis (+RM26.0 juta). Walau bagaimanapun, import menurun di Kelantan (-RM108.5 juta) dan Terengganu (-RM107.8 juta)".

Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin seterusnya memaklumkan "Antara lima negeri pengeksport utama, Pulau Pinang kekal sebagai pengeksport utama dengan sumbangan 31.3 peratus, diikuti oleh Johor (19.8%), Selangor (18.1%), Sarawak (7.5%) dan W.P. Kuala Lumpur (4.1%). Sementara itu, bagi import, Selangor kekal sebagai penyumbang utama dengan 25.2 peratus, diikuti oleh Pulau Pinang (22.4%), Johor (19.3%), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (6.8%) dan Melaka (6.3%)".



**SABAH RECORDED THE HIGHEST EXPORTS OF PALM OIL WORTH RM1.8 BILLION IN MARCH 2022**

**PUTRAJAYA, 10 May 2022** – Malaysia's total trade for March 2022 amounted to RM236.6 billion (increased 27.3% year-on-year) with exports of RM131.6 billion (increased 25.4% year-on-year) and imports worth RM104.9 billion (increased 29.9% year-on-year). Exports of palm oil amounted to RM7.5 billion in March 2022. At the state level, Sabah recorded the highest exports of palm oil worth RM1.8 billion (23.5%), followed by Johor (RM1.7 billion, 23.1%) and Sarawak (RM1.5 billion, 20.3%) as reported today in **EXPORT IMPORT STATISTICS BY STATE MARCH 2022**.


In a statement today, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, Chief Statistician Malaysia said, “Exports in March 2022 increased RM26.6 billion (+25.4%) compared to the same month of the previous year. Higher exports were recorded in most states such as Pulau Pinang (+RM9.6 billion), Johor (+RM6.5 billion), Sarawak (+RM3.9 billion), Selangor (+RM2.2 billion), Kedah (+RM2.1 billion), Sabah (+RM1.4 billion), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM1.3 billion), W.P. Labuan (+RM1.3 billion), Negeri Sembilan (+RM90.5 million) and Perlis (+RM9.7 million). However, exports decreased in Melaka (-RM672.5 million), Terengganu (-RM545.5 million), Perak (-RM174.8 million), Pahang (-RM92.0 million) and Kelantan (-RM78.0 million)”.

*Looking at the performance of imports by state, the Chief Statistician informed, “Imports also increased RM24.1 billion (+29.9%) in March 2022 as compared to the same month of the previous year. Higher imports were mainly from Johor (+RM4.5 billion), Pulau Pinang (+RM4.5 billion), Melaka (+RM4.4 billion), Selangor (+RM2.7 billion), Negeri Sembilan (+RM1.9 billion), Kedah (+RM1.6 billion), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM1.3 billion), Pahang (+RM1.1 billion), Sarawak (+RM964.8 million), Perak (+RM481.0 million). W.P. Labuan (+RM108.9 million), Sabah (+RM106.8 million) and Perlis (+RM26.0 million). However, imports decreased in Kelantan (-RM108.5 million) and Terengganu (-RM107.8 million)”.*


*Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin also informed, “Among the top five major exporting states, Pulau Pinang remained as the top exporter with a share of 31.3 per cent, followed by Johor (19.8%), Selangor (18.1%), Sarawak (7.5%) and W.P. Kuala Lumpur (4.1%). Meanwhile, as for imports, Selangor remained as the largest contributor with a share of 25.2 per cent, followed by Pulau Pinang (22.4%), Johor (19.3%), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (6.8%) and Melaka (6.3%)”.*
