Pengeluaran getah asli Malaysia

meningkat 36.7 peratus pada Disember 2021

PUTRAJAYA, 10 Februari 2022 – Pada hari ini, Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia menerbitkan **Perangkaan Getah Bulanan, Malaysia, Disember 2021**. Penerbitan ini memaparkan statistik pengeluaran, import, eksport, penggunaan domestik, stok, harga, bilangan pekerja, gaji & upah dan produktiviti bagi estet getah.

Memetik kepada laporan, Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, berkata, “Pengeluaran getah asli meningkat 36.7 peratus pada bulan Disember 2021 (41,690 tan metrik) berbanding pada bulan November 2021 (30,493 tan metrik). Perbandingan tahunan pula menunjukkan pengeluaran turun 16.3 peratus (Disember 2020: 49,825 tan metrik). Beliau menambah, pengeluaran getah asli Malaysia pada Disember 2021 disumbangkan terutamanya oleh sektor pekebun kecil (91.0%) berbanding sektor estet (9.0%).

Jumlah stok getah asli meningkat 5.9 peratus pada Disember 2021 kepada 285,208 tan metrik berbanding 269,421 tan metrik pada November 2021. Kilang pemproses getah menyumbang stok akhir sebanyak 91.8 peratus diikuti kilang pengguna getah (8.1%) dan estet getah (0.1%).

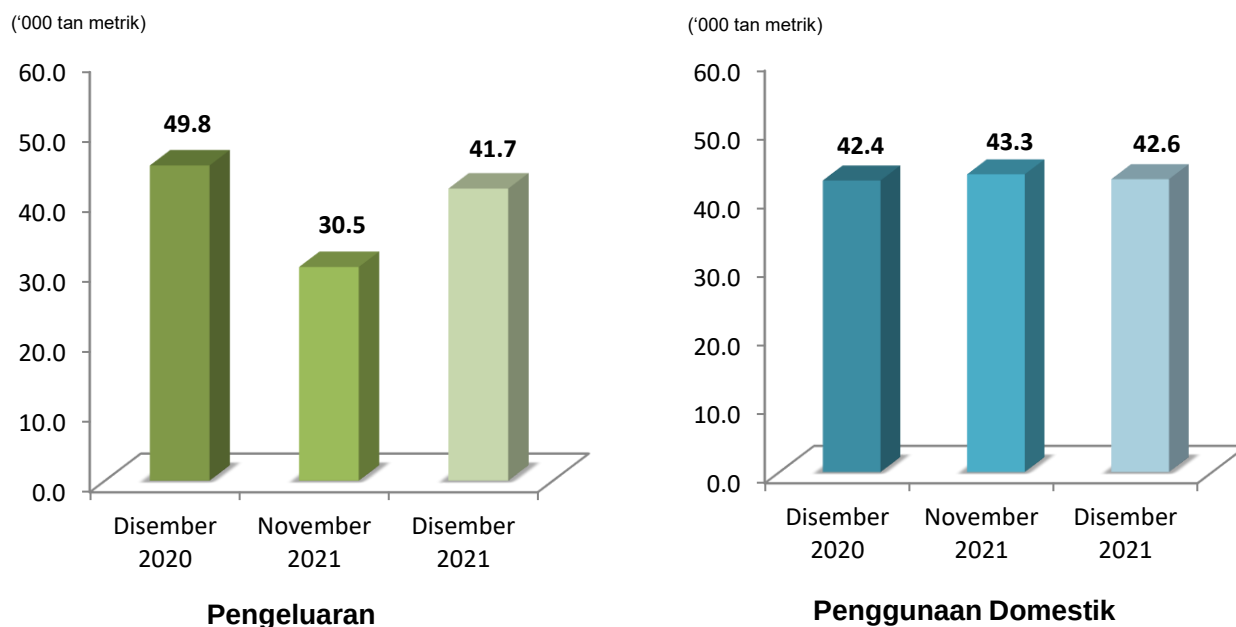
Eksport getah asli Malaysia berjumlah 45,982 tan metrik pada Disember 2021 menurun 24.5 peratus berbanding November 2021 (60,942 tan metrik). China terus mendominasi sebagai pengimport tertinggi getah asli iaitu 41.5 peratus daripada jumlah keseluruhan eksport pada Disember 2021 diikuti Finland (10.7%), Pakistan (4.2%), Turki (3.2%) dan Jerman (2.5%). Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin berkata, "Prestasi eksport disumbangkan oleh produk berasaskan getah asli seperti sarung tangan getah, tayar, tiub, benang getah dan kondom. Produk sarung tangan getah merupakan eksport utama dengan nilai sebanyak RM2.3 billion pada Disember 2021, menurun 6.5 peratus berbanding November 2021 (RM2.5 billion)".

Analisis kepada perbandingan harga purata bulanan menunjukkan Lateks Pekat merekodkan penurunan 2.6 peratus (Disember: 539.45 sen sekilogram, November 2021: 553.64 sen sekilogram) dan Sekerap 0.3 peratus (Disember 2021: 548.07 sen sekilogram, November 2021: 586.10 sen sekilogram). Keadaan yang sama turut berlaku kepada semua jenis Getah Mutu Malaysia (G.M.M) yang menurun antara 1.2 hingga 2.5 peratus. Perubahan harga di peringkat global seperti yang dilaporkan oleh *World Bank Commodity Price Data* turut menunjukkan harga bagi getah jenis TSR 20 (*Technically Specified Rubber*) dan SGP/MYS (Singapura/Malaysia) masing-masing menurun 1.3 peratus (daripada USD1.74/kg kepada USD1.72/kg) dan 0.4 peratus (daripada USD1.93/kg kepada USD1.92/kg). Berdasarkan laporan *Malaysian Rubber Board Digest* keluaran Disember, berlaku penurunan dalam pasaran pada bulan Disember disebabkan oleh kerugian dalam pasaran niaga hadapan getah serantau daripada kebimbangan yang semakin meningkat mengenai penyebaran varian Omicron COVID-19, kelewatan dalam pengeluaran kereta akibat kekurangan cip dan komponen peringkat global yang akan memperlahankan permintaan untuk getah.

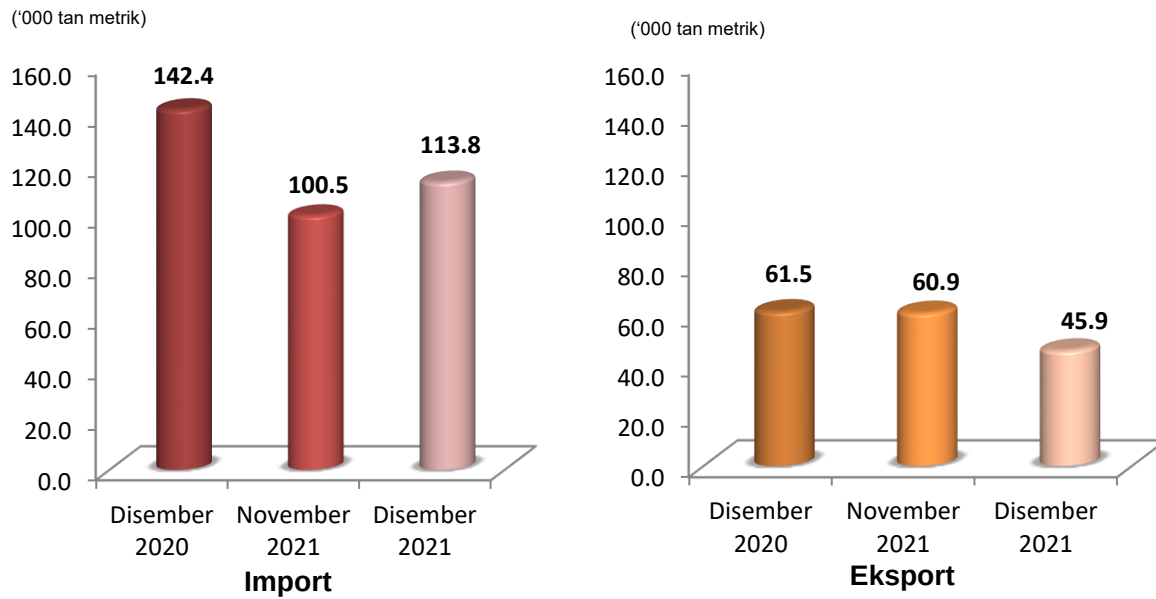
Sementara itu, prestasi suku keempat 2021 menunjukkan pengeluaran getah asli menurun 13.1 peratus kepada 115,310 tan metrik berbanding 132,732 tan metrik pada suku ketiga 2021. Prestasi pertumbuhan pengeluaran getah asli Malaysia pada 2021 pula mencatatkan penyusutan 8.7 peratus berbanding tahun 2020 (2021: 469,669 tan metrik, 2020: 514,702 tan metrik).

Malaysia natural rubber production
increased by 36.7 per cent in December 2021

PUTRAJAYA, February 10, 2022 – The Department of Statistics, Malaysia today released **Monthly Rubber Statistics, Malaysia, December 2021**. This publication consists of statistics on production, imports, exports, domestic consumption, stocks, prices, number of employees, salaries & wages and productivity of rubber estates.

Commenting on the report, Chief Statistician Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, said, "Natural rubber production increased by 36.7 per cent in December 2021 (41,690 tonnes) as compared to November 2021 (30,493 tonnes). Year-on-year comparison showed that the production declined by 16.3 percent (December 2020: 49,825 tonnes). He added, production of natural rubber in December 2021 for Malaysia was mainly contributed by smallholders sector (91.0%) as compared to estates sector (9.0%).

Total stocks of natural rubber increased 5.9 per cent in December 2021 to 285,208 tonnes as compared to 269,421 tonnes in November 2021. Rubber processors factory was contributing 91.8 per cent of the stocks followed by rubber consumers factory (8.1%) and rubber estates (0.1%).

Exports of Malaysia's natural rubber amounted to 45,982 tonnes in December 2021, decreased by 24.5 per cent as against November 2021 (60,942 tonnes). P.R. China continued to dominate as the highest importer of natural rubber with 41.5 per cent from

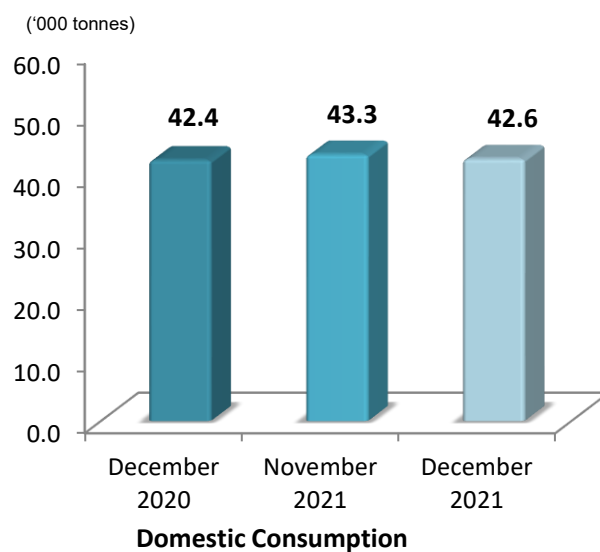
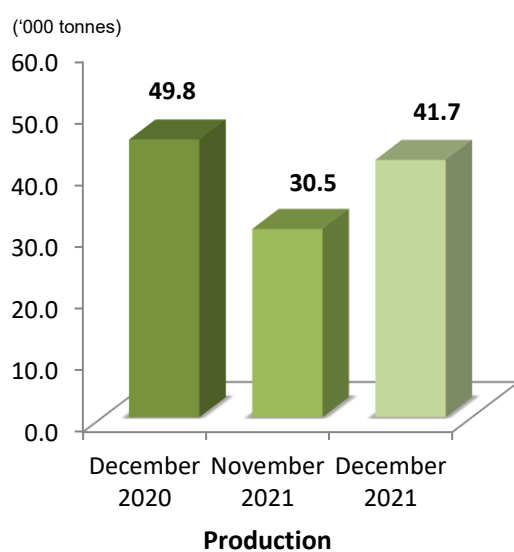
total exports in December 2021 followed by Finland (10.7%), Pakistan (4.2%), Turkey (3.2%) and Germany (2.5%). Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin said, "The exports performance was contributed by natural rubber-based product such as gloves, tyre, tube, rubber thread and condom. Gloves were the main exports of rubber-based products with a value of RM2.3 billion in December 2021, a decrease of 6.5 per cent as compared to November 2021 (RM2.5 billion)".

Analysis of the average monthly price showed that Latex Concentrated recorded a decrease of 2.6 per cent (December 2021: 539.45 sen per kg, November 2021: 553.64 sen per kg) and Scrap 0.3 per cent (December 2021: 584.07 sen per kg, November 2021: 586.10 sen per kg). A similar trend is also observed for all Standard Malaysian Rubber (S.M.R) which decreased between 1.2 to 2.5 per cent. The movement of global prices as reported by World Bank Commodity Price Data also showed that the prices for TSR 20 (Technically Specified Rubber) and SGP/MYS (Singapore/Malaysia) type decreased 1.3 per cent (from USD1.74/kg to USD1.72/kg) and 0.4 per cent (from USD1.93/kg to USD1.92/kg) respectively. Based on Malaysian Rubber Board Digest report released in December, there was a decline in the market in December due to losses in the regional rubber futures market from growing concerns surrounding the Omicron COVID-19 variant's spread, a delay in automobile production from global shortages of chips and components that would slow demand for rubber.

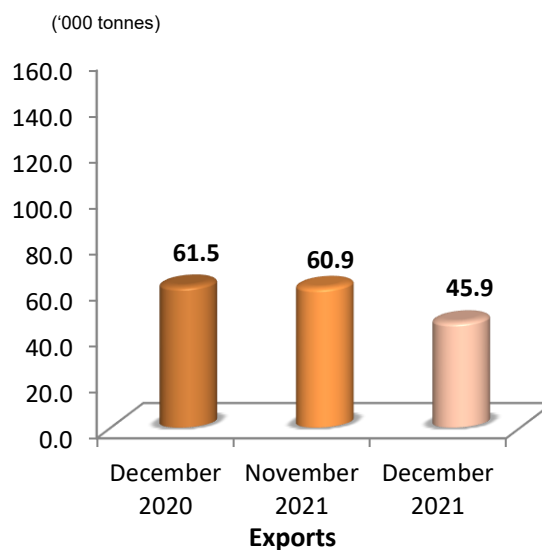
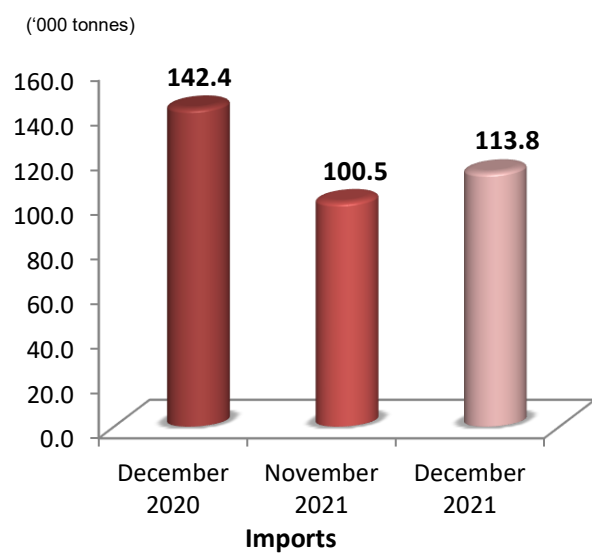
On the other hand, the performance of the fourth quarter of 2021 showed that the natural rubber production fell 13.1 per cent to 115,310 tonnes as compared to 132,732 tonnes in the third quarter of 2021. The performance of Malaysia's natural rubber production in 2021 recorded a decrease of 8.7 per cent as compared to 2020 (2021: 469,669 tonnes, 2020: 514,702 tonnes).
