



KENYATAAN MEDIA BAGI STATISTIK EKSPORT IMPORT MENGIKUT NEGERI, DISEMBER 2021

PULAU PINANG MENCATATKAN JUMLAH DAGANGAN TERTINGGI RM64.3 BILION PADA DISEMBER 2021

PUTRAJAYA, 10 Februari 2022 – Jumlah dagangan Malaysia pada bulan Disember 2021 bernilai RM216.7 bilion, meningkat 26.8% tahun ke tahun, dengan nilai eksport RM123.8 bilion (+29.2% tahun ke tahun) dan import bernilai RM92.9 bilion (+23.6% tahun ke tahun). Di peringkat negeri, Pulau Pinang mencatatkan jumlah dagangan tertinggi RM64.3 bilion pada Disember 2021. Antara produk utama yang menyumbang kepada peningkatan eksport Pulau Pinang ialah Litar elektronik bersepadu (RM16.2 bilion, 38.6%), Barangan elektrik dan elektronik yang lain (RM6.4 bilion, 15.4%) dan Kristal piezo elektrik & alat ganti (RM3.3 bilion, 7.9%) seperti yang dilaporkan hari ini dalam **STATISTIK EKSPORT IMPORT MENGIKUT NEGERI, DISEMBER 2021**.

Dalam satu kenyataan pada hari ini, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia berkata, "Eksport pada bulan Disember 2021 meningkat sebanyak RM28.0 bilion (+29.2%) berbanding bulan yang sama tahun sebelumnya. Eksport lebih tinggi direkodkan bagi kebanyakan negeri iaitu Pulau Pinang (+RM12.4 bilion), Selangor (+RM3.7 bilion), Sarawak (+RM2.9 bilion), Kedah (+RM2.0 bilion), Sabah (+RM1.9 bilion), Johor (+RM1.5 bilion), Terengganu (+RM1.2 bilion), Pahang (+RM843.2 juta), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM828.6 juta), Melaka (+RM466.1 juta), Perak (+RM327.4 juta), Negeri Sembilan (+RM110.5 juta) dan Perlis (+RM8.9 juta). Walau bagaimanapun, eksport menyusut di Kelantan (-RM40.8 juta) dan W.P. Labuan (-RM18.5 juta)".

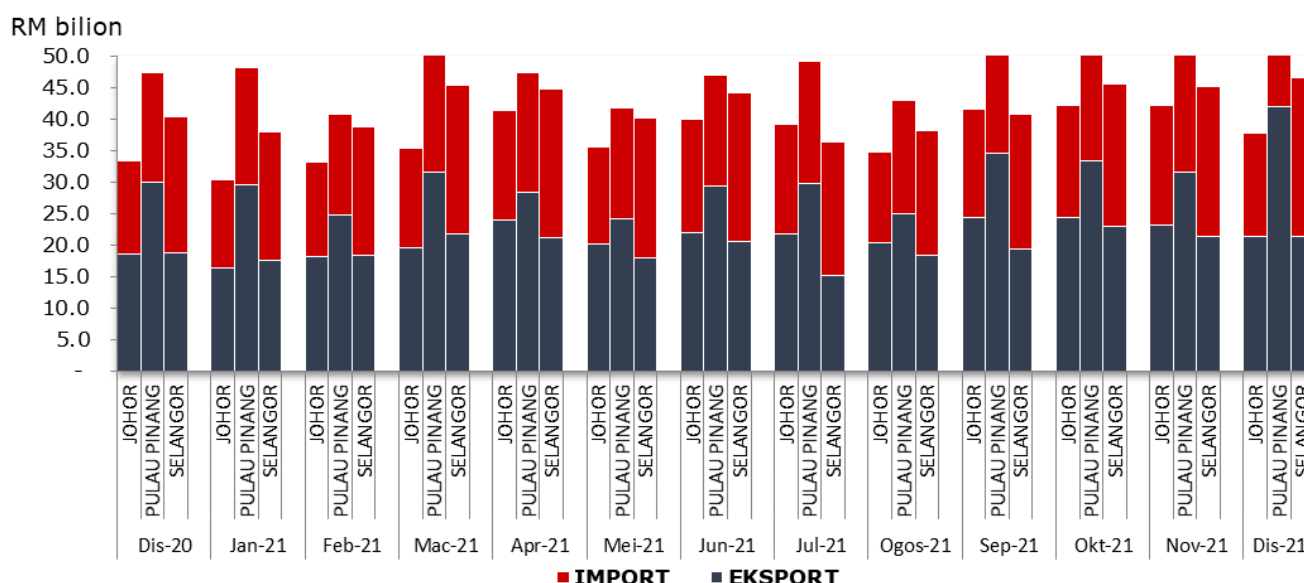
Beralih kepada prestasi import mengikut negeri, Ketua Perangkawan memaklumkan, "Import juga meningkat RM17.7 billion (+23.6%) pada Disember 2021 berbanding bulan yang

sama tahun sebelumnya. Peningkatan import dicatatkan di Pulau Pinang (+RM4.9 bilion), Selangor (+RM3.6 bilion), Kedah (+RM2.2 bilion), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM2.0 bilion), Johor (+RM1.5 bilion), Negeri Sembilan (+RM1.4 bilion), Sarawak (+RM902.5 juta), Pahang (+RM764.5 juta), Perak (+RM541.6 juta), Sabah (+RM206.1 juta), Terengganu (+RM114.0 juta) dan Perlis (+RM6.9 juta). Walau bagaimanapun, import menurun di Melaka (-RM552.8 juta), Kelantan (-RM108.9 juta) dan W.P. Labuan (-RM10.7 juta)".

Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin seterusnya memaklumkan "Antara lima negeri pengekspor utama, Pulau Pinang kekal sebagai pengekspor utama dengan sumbangan 33.9 peratus, diikuti oleh Selangor (17.2%), Johor (17.2%), Sarawak (7.6%) dan Sabah (3.8%). Sementara itu, bagi import, Selangor kekal sebagai penyumbang utama dengan 27.3 peratus, diikuti oleh Pulau Pinang (24.0%), Johor (17.8%), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (7.5%) dan Kedah (6.6%)".

FOR EXPORT IMPORT STATISTICS BY STATE, DECEMBER 2021

PULAU PINANG RECORDED THE HIGHEST TOTAL TRADE OF RM64.3 BILLION IN DECEMBER 2021

PUTRAJAYA, 10 February 2022 – Malaysia's total trade for December 2021 amounted to RM216.7 billion, increased 26.8% year-on-year (y-o-y), with exports of RM123.8 billion (+29.2% y-o-y) and imports worth RM92.9 billion (+23.6% y-o-y). At the state level, Pulau Pinang recorded the highest total trade of RM64.3 billion in December 2021. Among the main products spearheading the increase in exports of Pulau Pinang were Electronic integrated circuits (RM16.2 billion, 38.6%), Other electrical & electronic products (RM6.4 billion, 15.4%) and Piezo - electric crystals & parts (RM3.3 billion, 7.9%), as reported today in **EXPORT IMPORT STATISTICS BY STATE, DECEMBER 2021**.

In a statement today, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, Chief Statistician Malaysia said, "Exports in December 2021 increased RM28.0 billion (+29.2%) compared to the same month of the previous year. Higher exports were recorded in most states such as Pulau Pinang (+RM12.4 billion), Selangor (+RM3.7 billion), Sarawak (+RM2.9 billion), Kedah (+RM2.0 billion), Sabah (+RM1.9 billion), Johor (+RM1.5 billion), Terengganu (+RM1.2 billion), Pahang (+RM843.2 million), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM828.6 million), Melaka (+RM466.1 million), Perak (+RM327.4 million), Negeri Sembilan (+RM110.5 million) and Perlis (+RM8.9 million). However, exports decreased in Kelantan (-RM40.8 million) and W.P. Labuan (-RM18.5 million)."

Looking at the performance of imports by state, the Chief Statistician informed, “Imports also increased RM17.7 billion (+23.6% in December 2021 compared to the same month of the previous year. Higher imports were mainly from Pulau Pinang (+RM4.9 billion), Selangor (+RM3.6 billion), Kedah (+RM2.2 billion), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM2.0 billion), Johor (+RM1.5 billion), Negeri Sembilan (+RM1.4 billion), Sarawak (+RM902.5 million), Pahang (+RM764.5 million), Perak (+RM541.6 million), Sabah (+RM206.1 million), Terengganu (+RM114.0 million) and Perlis (+RM6.9 million). However, imports decreased in Melaka (-RM552.8 million), Kelantan (-RM108.9 million) dan W.P. Labuan (-RM10.7 million).”

Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin also informed, “Among the top five major exporting states, Pulau Pinang remained as the top exporter with a share of 33.9 per cent, followed by Selangor (17.2%), Johor (17.2%), Sarawak (7.6%) and Sabah (3.8%). Meanwhile, as for imports, Selangor remained as the largest contributor with a share of 27.3 per cent, followed by Pulau Pinang (24.0%), Johor (17.8%), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (7.5%) and Kedah (6.6%).

Chart 1: Time Series Data on Exports and Imports in Johor, Pulau Pinang and Selangor, December 2020 – December 2021 (RM Billion)

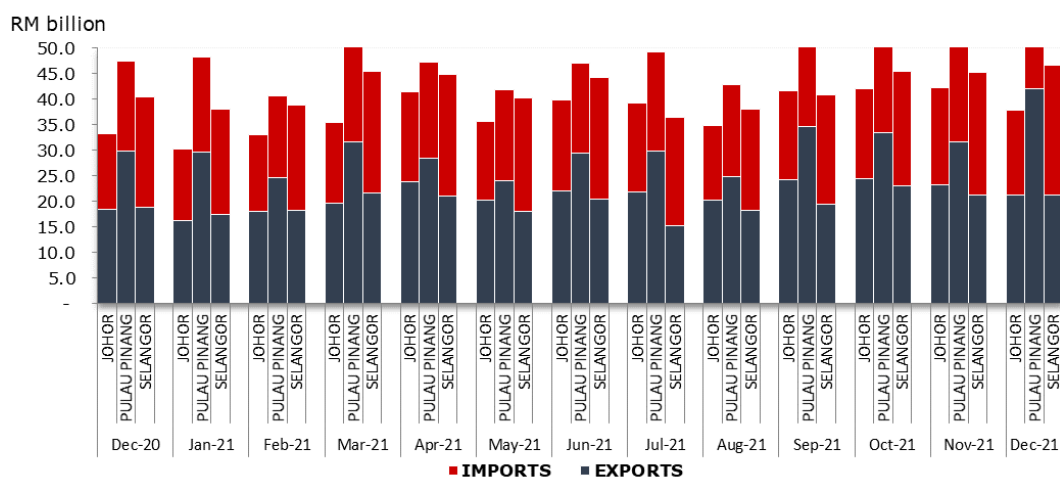

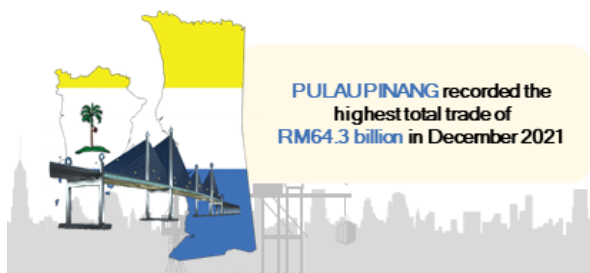
