Pengeluaran getah asli Malaysia menurun 26.8 peratus pada November 2021

PUTRAJAYA, 14 Januari 2022 – Pada hari ini, Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia menerbitkan **Perangkaan Getah Bulanan, Malaysia, November 2021**. Penerbitan ini memaparkan statistik pengeluaran, import, eksport, penggunaan domestik, stok, harga, bilangan pekerja, gaji & upah dan produktiviti bagi estet getah.

Memetik kepada laporan, Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, berkata, “Pengeluaran getah asli menurun 26.8 peratus pada bulan November 2021 (31,577 tan metrik) berbanding pada bulan Oktober 2021 (43,127 tan metrik). Perbandingan tahunan turut menunjukkan pengeluaran turun 25.8 peratus (November 2020: 42,554 tan metrik). Penyusutan pengeluaran ini berikutan gangguan bekalan di peringkat penawaran akibat dari ketidaktentuan cuaca serta faktor taburan hujan yang tinggi”. Beliau menambah, pengeluaran getah asli Malaysia pada November 2021 disumbangkan terutamanya oleh sektor pekebun kecil (89.8%) berbanding sektor estet sebanyak (10.2%).

Jumlah stok getah asli menurun 4.2 peratus pada November 2021 kepada 269,757 tan metrik berbanding 281,718 tan metrik pada Oktober 2021. Kilang pemproses getah menyumbang stok akhir sebanyak 92.0 peratus diikuti kilang pengguna getah (7.9%) dan estet getah (0.1%).

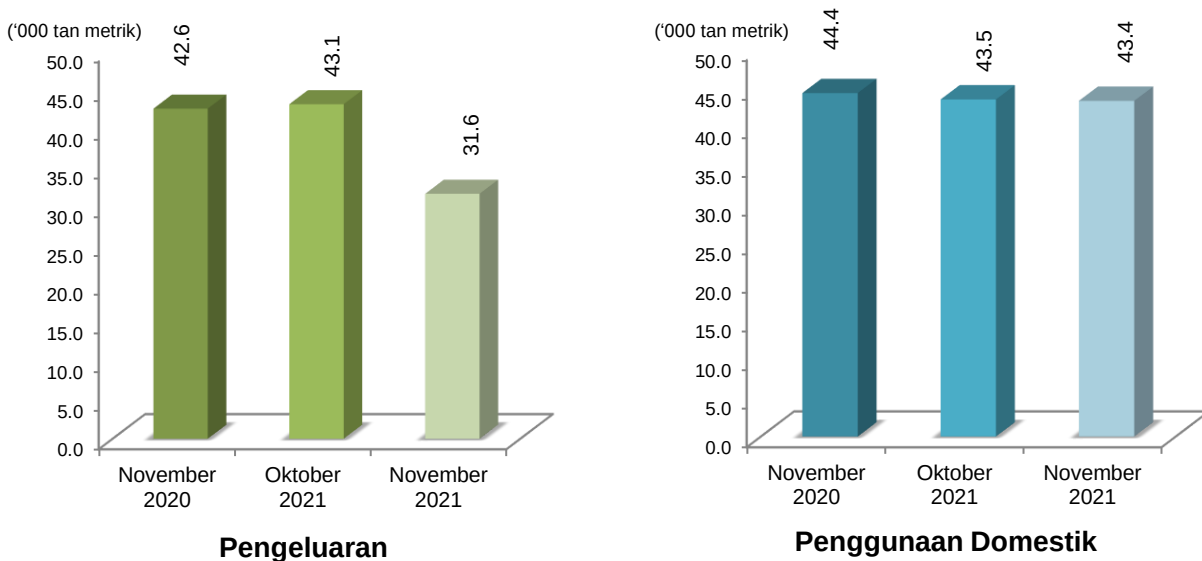
Eksport getah asli Malaysia berjumlah 60,942 tan metrik pada November 2021 menurun 2.0 peratus berbanding Oktober 2021 (62,167 tan metrik). China terus mendominasi sebagai pengimport tertinggi getah asli iaitu 44.6 peratus daripada jumlah keseluruhan eksport pada November 2021 diikuti Amerika Syarikat (11.4%), Jerman (5.1%), Iran (4.0%) dan Finland (3.7%). Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin berkata, “Prestasi eksport disumbangkan oleh produk berasaskan getah asli seperti sarung tangan getah, tayar, tiub, benang getah dan kondom. Produk sarung tangan getah merupakan eksport utama dengan nilai sebanyak RM2.5 billion pada November 2021, menurun sebanyak 4.9 peratus berbanding Oktober 2021 (RM2.6 billion)”.

Analisis kepada perbandingan harga purata bulanan menunjukkan Lateks Pekat merekodkan peningkatan sebanyak 6.2 peratus (November 2021: 553.64 sen sekilogram, Oktober 2021: 521.20 sen sekilogram) dan Sekerap sebanyak 1.3 peratus (November 2021: 586.10 sen sekilogram, Oktober 2021: 578.52 sen sekilogram). Keadaan yang sama turut berlaku kepada semua jenis Getah Mutu Malaysia (G.M.M) yang meningkat antara 1.1 hingga 6.1 peratus. Perubahan harga di peringkat global seperti yang dilaporkan oleh *World Bank Commodity Price Data* turut menunjukkan harga bagi getah jenis TSR 20 (*Technically Specified Rubber*) dan SGP/MYS (Singapura/Malaysia) masing-masing meningkat 0.8 peratus (daripada USD1.73/kg kepada USD1.74/kg) dan 3.2 peratus (daripada USD1.87/kg kepada USD1.93/kg). Lembaga Getah Malaysia melaporkan walaupun pasaran getah menunjukkan aliran peningkatan harga, terdapat gangguan dalam pasaran yang disokong oleh kejatuhan dalam pengeluaran getah asli dan pertumbuhan positif ekonomi global terutama perkembangan hubungan antara U.S. dan China.

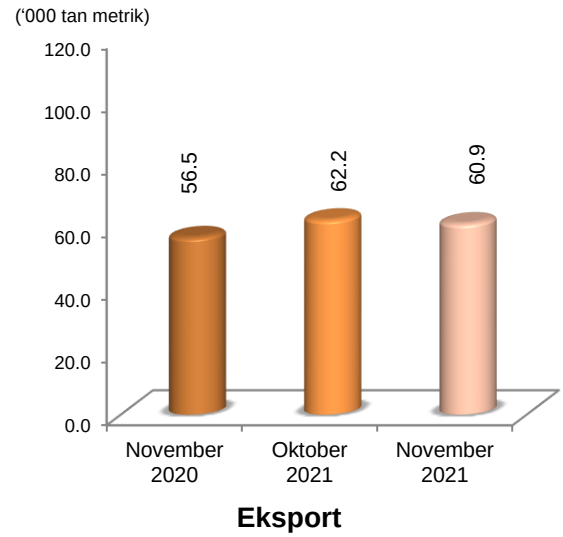
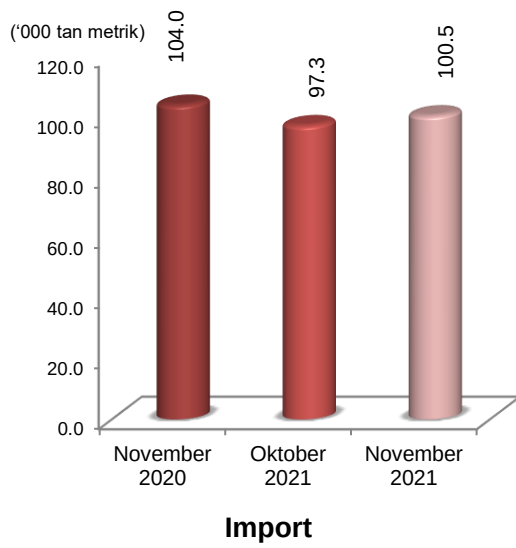

Malaysia rubber production
decreased by 26.8 per cent in November 2021

PUTRAJAYA, January 14, 2022 – The Department of Statistics, Malaysia today released **Monthly Rubber Statistics, Malaysia, November 2021**. This publication consists of statistics on production, imports, exports, domestic consumption, stocks, prices, number of employees, salaries & wages and productivity of rubber estates.

Commenting on the report, Chief Statistician Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, said, "Natural rubber production decreased by 26.8 per cent in November 2021 (31,577 tonnes) as compared to October 2021 (43,127 tonnes). Year-on-year comparison also showed that the production declined by 25.8 percent (November 2020: 42,554 tonnes). The decline in production was due to supply disruptions at the supply level because of weather uncertainties as well as high rainfall distribution factors". He added, production of natural rubber in November 2021 for Malaysia was mainly contributed by smallholders sector (89.8%) as compared to estates sector (10.2%).

Total stocks of natural rubber decreased 4.2 per cent in November 2021 to 269,757 tonnes as compared to 281,718 tonnes in October 2021. Rubber processors factory was contributing 92.0 per cent of the stocks followed by rubber consumers factory (7.9%) and rubber estates (0.1%).

Exports of Malaysia's natural rubber amounted to 60,942 tonnes in November 2021, decreased by 2.0 per cent as against October 2021 (62,167 tonnes). P.R. China continued to dominate as the highest importer of natural rubber with 44.6 per cent from total exports in November 2021 followed by U.S.A (11.4%), Germany (5.1%), Iran (4.0%) and Finland (3.7%). Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin said, "The exports performance was contributed by natural rubber-based product such as gloves, tyre, tube, rubber thread and condom. Gloves were the main exports of rubber-based products with a value of RM2.5 billion in November 2021, a decrease of 4.9 per cent as compared to October 2021 (RM2.6 billion)".

Analysis of the average monthly price showed that Latex Concentrated recorded an increase of 6.2 per cent (November 2021: 553.64 sen per kg, October 2021: 521.20 sen per kg) and Scrap 1.3 per cent (November 2021: 586.10 sen per kg, October 2021: 578.52 sen per kg). A similar trend is also observed for all Standard Malaysian Rubber (S.M.R) which increased between 1.1 to 6.1 per cent. The movement of global prices as reported by World Bank Commodity Price Data also showed that the prices for TSR 20 (Technically Specified Rubber) and SGP/MYS (Singapore/Malaysia) type increased 0.8 per cent (from USD1.73/kg to USD1.74/kg) and 3.2 per cent (from USD1.87/kg to USD1.93/kg) respectively. Malaysian Rubber Board reported although the rubber market exhibited an uptrend, there is some hiccups in the market bolstered by declines in natural rubber production and positive developments surrounding the global economy especially between U.S. and China relations progress.

The performance of Malaysia's natural rubber production in the first eleven months of 2021 fell 7.7 per cent as compared to the same period in 2020 (January-November 2021: 429,062 tonnes, January-November 2020: 464,878 tonnes).

('000 onnes)

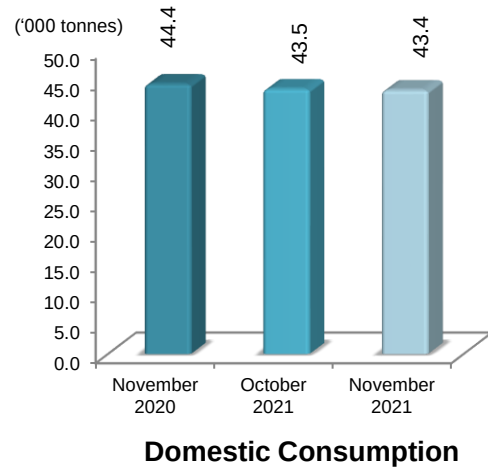
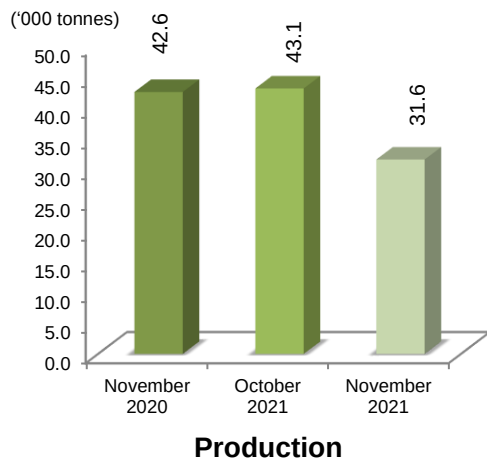
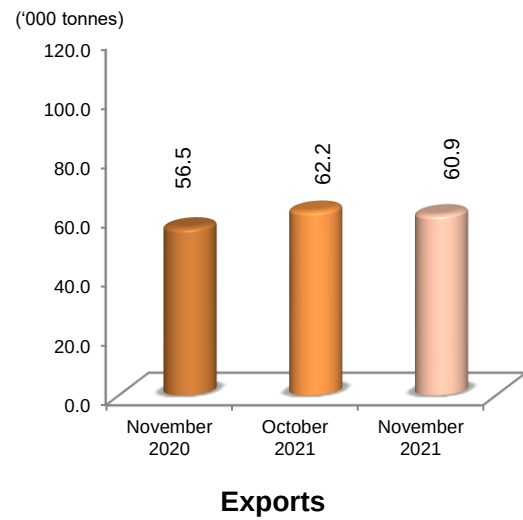
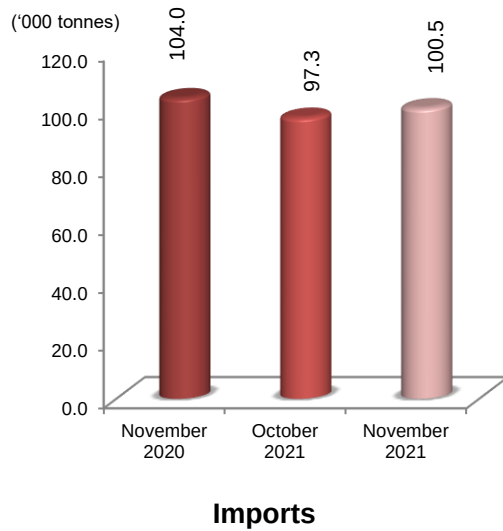


Chart 2 : Imports and exports of natural rubber November 2020, October - November 2021
