Indeks nilai seunit eksport & import Malaysia kekal positif pada April 2021

PUTRAJAYA, 4 JUN 2021 – Indeks nilai seunit eksport dan import Malaysia terus mencatatkan pertumbuhan positif pada April 2021 walaupun dalam ketidaktentuan aktiviti ekonomi, masing-masing pada 1.7% dan 0.8% bulan ke bulan, sebagai mana dilaporkan dalam laporan **INDEKS PERDAGANGAN LUAR NEGERI (2010=100), APRIL 2021** pada hari ini. Laporan ini memaparkan statistik indeks nilai seunit dan indeks volum mengikut seksyen bagi eksport dan import barang.

Mengulas terhadap laporan tersebut, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia berkata, “Indeks nilai seunit eksport mencatatkan kenaikan 1.7% pada April 2021, disumbangkan oleh pertumbuhan indeks minyak & lemak binatang & sayur-sayuran (+6.1%), minyak galian (+4.7%) dan alat jentera & kelengkapan pengangkutan (+0.6%). Sebaliknya, indeks volum eksport menunjukkan penurunan 1.1% pada bulan yang sama, disumbangkan oleh kejatuhan indeks bahan kimia (-12.5%), alat jentera & kelengkapan pengangkutan (-7.2%) dan barang-barang keluaran kilang (-6.0%). Indeks volum eksport pelarasan bermusim merekodkan pertumbuhan kecil 0.3% daripada 163.2 mata kepada 163.6 mata. Berbanding tahun sebelumnya, kedua-dua indeks nilai seunit dan volum eksport masing-masing meningkat 5.8% dan 54.0%.”

Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin turut berkata “Indeks nilai seunit import naik 0.8% pada April 2021 berbanding bulan sebelumnya. Kenaikan ini disumbangkan oleh

pertumbuhan indeks minyak galian (+2.8%), bahan mentah tidak boleh dimakan (+2.4%) dan barang-barang keluaran kilang (+0.7%). Sementara itu, indeks volum import turut bertambah 4.6% pada April 2021 berbanding bulan sebelumnya, yang disumbangkan oleh pengembangan indeks minyak galian (+57.5%), pelbagai barang keluaran kilang (+6.4%) dan barang-barang keluaran kilang (+5.2%). Indeks volum import pelarasan bermusim pada April 2021 berkembang 2.2% daripada 162.4 mata kepada 166.0 mata. Berbanding tahun sebelumnya, kedua-dua indeks nilai seunit dan volum import masing-masing bertambah 1.5% dan 22.6%.”

Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia (DOSM) turut melaporkan terma perdagangan Malaysia meningkat 0.9% bulan ke bulan daripada 102.8 mata kepada 103.7 mata pada April 2021. Berasaskan tahun ke tahun, terma perdagangan Malaysia turut kekal positif 4.3% daripada 99.4 mata pada April tahun lalu.

***Malaysia's export & import unit value indices remained positive
in April 2021***

PUTRAJAYA, JUNE 4, 2021 – Malaysia's export and import unit value indices continued to record a positive growth in April 2021 despite the uncertainty of economic activities, at 1.7% and 0.8%, respectively on monthly basis, as reported today in **EXTERNAL TRADE INDICES (2010=100), APRIL 2021**. This report presents the unit value and volume index by sections for both exports and imports of goods.

Commenting on the report, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, Chief Statistician Malaysia, said “The export unit value index posted a positive growth at 1.7% in April 2021, reflected by the increases in the index of animal & vegetable oils & fats (+6.1%), mineral fuels (+4.7%) and machinery & transport equipment (+0.6%). On the other hand, the export volume index recorded a decline of 1.1% in the same month, which was attributed to the decreases in the index of chemicals (-12.5%), machinery & transport equipment (-7.2%) and manufactured goods (-6.0%). The seasonally adjusted export volume index registered a marginal increase of 0.3% from 163.2 points to 163.6 points. When compared to the previous year, both the export unit value and volume indices rose 5.8% and 54.0%, respectively.”

Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin also commented, “The import unit value index increased 0.8% in April 2021 as compared with the previous month. The increment was contributed by the increases in the index of mineral fuels (+2.8%), inedible crude materials (+2.4%) and manufactured goods (+0.7%). Meanwhile, the import volume index grew 4.6% in April

2021 as compared to the preceding month, contributed by the expansion in the index of mineral fuels (+57.5%), miscellaneous manufactured articles (+6.4%) and manufactured goods (+5.2%). The seasonally adjusted import volume index in April 2021 expanded 2.2% from 162.4 points to 166.0 points. On a year-on-year basis, both the import unit value and volume indices expanded 1.5% and 22.6%, respectively.”

Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM) also reported that Malaysia’s terms of trade rose 0.9% month-on-month from 102.8 points to 103.7 points in April 2021. On a year-on-year basis, Malaysia’s terms of trade also remained positive at 4.3% from 99.4 points in April of previous year.
