Prestasi Perdagangan Malaysia Terus Mencatatkan Pertumbuhan

Kukuh pada April 2021 dengan Eksport Melonjak 63 peratus

PUTRAJAYA, 28 MEI 2021 – Di sebalik ketidaktentuan aktiviti ekonomi, eksport dan import Malaysia sekali lagi mengatasi rekod tertinggi pada April 2021, masing-masing mencecah RM105.6 bilion dan RM85.1 bilion. Lebihan dagangan dicatatkan pada RM20.5 bilion, meneruskan trend pemulihan daripada kesan wabak COVID-19 sebagai mana dilaporkan dalam **BULETIN PERANGKAAN PERDAGANGAN LUAR NEGERI MALAYSIA, APRIL 2021** hari ini. Laporan ini turut memaparkan prestasi import dan eksport mengikut produk dan rakan dagangan.

Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin berkata "Eksport Malaysia kekal memberangsangkan, melonjak 63.0 peratus tahun ke tahun kepada RM105.6 bilion pada April 2021 berbanding kenaikan 31.1 peratus pada Mac 2021. Peningkatan ini disumbangkan oleh eksport domestik dan eksport semula. Eksport domestik berjumlah RM85.0 bilion yang menyumbang 80.5 peratus kepada jumlah eksport, meningkat ketara 84.0 peratus. Sementara itu, eksport semula bernilai RM20.6 bilion, meningkat 11.0 peratus. Import pada April 2021 bernilai RM85.1 bilion, meningkat 24.4 peratus tahun ke tahun. Jumlah dagangan Malaysia pada April 2021 melonjak 43.2 peratus, mencecah RM190.8 bilion berbanding April 2020.

Selaras dengan pertumbuhan perdagangan, 222 daripada 255 kumpulan barang untuk eksport menunjukkan peningkatan berbanding tahun sebelumnya. Bagi import, 209 daripada 259 kumpulan merekodkan pertumbuhan positif."

Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia juga melaporkan bahawa peningkatan eksport disumbangkan terutamanya oleh eksport yang lebih tinggi ke Amerika Syarikat (+RM6.8 bilion), Singapura (+RM5.5 bilion), Kesatuan Eropah (+RM4.1 bilion), China (+RM3.4 bilion) dan India (+RM2.7 bilion). Sementara itu, import yang lebih tinggi direkodkan terutamanya dari China (+RM6.0 bilion), Singapura (+RM4.0 bilion), Jepun (+RM2.3 bilion), Indonesia (+ RM1.8 bilion) dan Thailand (+ RM1.6 bilion).


Pertumbuhan eksport juga didorong oleh barang elektrik dan elektronik (+RM11.2

bilion); keluaran getah(+RM5.1 bilion); keluaran petroleum (+RM4.6 bilion); barang perkilangan logam (+RM3.0 bilion); jentera, kelengkapan dan peralatan (+RM2.8 bilion); minyak kelapa sawit dan keluaran pertanian berasakan minyak kelapa sawit (+RM2.5 bilion) dan barang optik dan saintifik (+1.9 bilion). Sementara itu, kenaikan import dicatatkan bagi barang elektrik dan elektronik (+RM5.8 bilion); keluaran petroleum (+RM4.3 bilion); kimia dan bahan kimia (+RM2.0 bilion); petroleum mentah (+RM1.4 bilion); barang perkilangan logam (+RM1.3 bilion) dan barang besi dan keluli (+RM1.0 bilion).


Pada masa yang sama, import mengikut Penggunaan Akhir mencatatkan peningkatan bagi barang perantaraan dan penggunaan. Import barang perantaraan (54.6% daripada jumlah import) meningkat ketara RM18.2 bilion atau 64.4 peratus. Barang penggunaan (8.9% daripada jumlah import) mencatatkan kenaikan 29.9 peratus daripada RM5.8 bilion pada tahun sebelumnya kepada RM7.6 bilion. Sebaliknya, import barang modal yang berjumlah RM9.3 bilion, menurun RM5.7 bilion atau 38.2 peratus berbanding April 2020, dan merangkumi 10.9 peratus daripada jumlah import.


**Carta 1: Perangkaan Perdagangan Luar Negeri, Jan 2019 – April 2021

Malaysia Continued to Record a Sturdy Trade Performance in April 2021 with Exports Soared by 63 per cent

PUTRAJAYA, May 28, 2021 – Amidst of uncertainties on economic activities, Malaysia's exports and imports once again broke the record in April 2021 to reach RM105.6 billion and RM85.1 billion, respectively. Trade surplus was noted at RM20.5 billion, continues its recovery from the impact of COVID-19 pandemic as reported today in **MALAYSIA EXTERNAL TRADE STATISTICS BULLETIN, APRIL 2021**. This report also presents the performance of imports and exports by product and trading partner.

Chief Statistician Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin said “Malaysia’s exports continued to be vibrant, soared by 63.0 per cent year-on-year to RM105.6 billion in April 2021 compared to an increase of 31.1 per cent in March 2021. The expansion was driven by both domestic exports and re-exports. Domestic exports stood at RM85.0 billion contributed 80.5 per cent to the total exports, rose significantly by 84.0 per cent. While, the re-exports which was valued at RM20.6 billion, grew by 11.0 per cent. Imports in April 2021 amounted to RM85.1 billion, increased by 24.4 per cent year-on-year. Malaysia’s total trade in April 2021 surged 43.2 per cent, reaching RM190.8 billion as compared to April 2020.

In conjunction to the growth, 222 out of 255 commodity groups for exports showed increases as compared to the previous year. As for imports, 209 of 259 groups posted positive growths.”


The Department of Statistics Malaysia also reported that the expansion in exports mainly as a consequence of higher exports to the United States (+RM6.8 billion), Singapore (+RM5.5 billion), the European Union (+RM4.1 billion), China (+RM3.4 billion) and India (+RM2.7 billion). Meanwhile, higher imports were noted mainly from China (+RM6.0 billion), Singapore (+RM4.0 billion), Japan (+RM2.3 billion), Indonesia (+RM1.8 billion) and Thailand (+RM1.6 billion).

The export expansion was also driven by electrical and electronic products (+RM11.2 billion); rubber products (+RM5.1 billion); petroleum products (+RM4.6 billion); manufacture of metal (+RM3.0 billion); machinery, equipment and parts (+RM2.8 billion); palm oil and palm oil-based agriculture products (+RM2.5 billion) and optical and scientific equipment products (+RM1.9 billion). Meanwhile, rise in imports were noted for electrical and electronic products (+RM5.8 billion); petroleum products (+RM4.3 billion), chemical and chemical products (+RM2.0 billion); crude petroleum (+RM1.4 billion); manufacture of metal (+RM1.3 billion) and iron and steel products (+RM1.0 billion).


On the same note, imports by End Use showed increases for intermediate and consumption goods. Imports of intermediate goods (54.6% of the total imports) increased significantly by RM18.2 billion or 64.4 per cent. Consumption goods (8.9% of total imports) registered an increase of 29.9 per cent from RM5.8 billion in the preceding year to RM7.6 billion. In contrast, imports of capital goods which amounted to RM9.3 billion, declined by RM5.7 billion or 38.2 per cent as compared to April 2020, and comprised 10.9 per cent of total imports.


**Chart 1: External Trade Statistics, Jan 2019 – Apr 2021
