





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Population Distribution



Selangor is the most populous state


Klang Valley represent 21 % of total population

KL Conurbation consist of 7.5 million (27%) of population








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Population growth and density




Population density and rate population growth rate, by district

More than a third (34.4%) of the national population lives in the **ten most populous** districts:



Ageing population at District Level








Ageing population at Mukim Levels



Median Income, District 2014 & 2016


