


- In 1970, only 5.4% of the population aged 60 years and over while 44.5% of the population aged 14 years and below.
- However, in 2018, only 23.9% of population is 14 years old and younger, while 10.3 % of the population aged 60 years and over.
- By 2040, there will be 1 older person (60 years and over) for every 5 Malaysians

Population Ageing



Refers to the demographic transition of high birth rate and death rate towards a lower rate as the country moves away from pre-industrial/agricultural-based economy to an industrial economic system

CAUSE

- Lower birth rate and decreasing total fertility rate
- Increasing life expectancy

EFFECT

- Change in social structure and increasing need for long-term healthcare
- Uncertainty in economy growth and potential



3 Groups

- Ageing Society when more than 7% of the population aged 65 years and older
- ii. Aged Society when more than 14% of the population aged 65 years and older
- iii. Super-Aged Society when more than 20% of the population aged 65 years and older







MAIN AGE GROUP OF POPULATION, 2018






2. Causes and Effects

Causes of Population Ageing



1. Lower birth rates and declining Total Fertility Rate (TFR)

- Crude birth rate have declined from 32.4 in 1970 to 16.1 per 1000 people in 2016
- TFR declined from 4.9 babies per woman in1970 to 1.9 in 2016, which is **below the replacement level** of 2.1.
- These are attributed to higher education and late marriage. Late marriage leads to less number of children born per family.
- With better education and employment opportunities, percentage of unmarried people rises, a common phenomenon in modern and industrialized countries (Naohiro YASHIRO. 1998)
- Late marriage causes mean age of mother at first live birth to increase from 26.6 in 2001 to 27.7 in 2016

Total fertility rate: The number of children who would be born per woman (or per 1,000 women) during her reproductive years (age 15-49)


Causes of Population Ageing



2. Increasing life expectancy

- Life expectancy at birth have risen from 61.6 years in 1970 to 75.0 years in 2018
- Lindsay et al. (2014) stated that increasing life expectancy in the last 200 years is due to control of infectious diseases, abundant and safer foods, better sanitary conditions, and other nonmedical social improvements.
- Falling tobacco use (for men only) and cardiovascular disease mortality (for both men and women) are the main factors contributing rise of life expectancy (Mensah et al., 2017).
- In high-income countries, avoidable male mortality has fallen since 1980 because of decreases in avoidable cardiovascular deaths (Mathers et al. 2015)


MALAYSIA LIFE EXPECTANCY 1991-2018

Impact on Healthcare



- Increased demand for long-term geriatric healthcare
- Current healthcare system are not well-suited for treating agerelated symptoms
- Increase in government expenditures for healthcare and rehabilitation
- Lack of access to excellent geriatric healthcare and support system in rural areas



Impact on Social Structure



- Increase in dependency ratio, which is the measure showing the ratio of the number of dependents aged zero to 14 and over the age of 65 to the total population aged 15 to 64.
- In 2010, dependency ratio was at 47.8 while it is projected to rise to 49.5 in 2040
- Dependence on younger family members for long term care
- Increase of income inequality and poverty among elderly population.



Impact on **Economy**



- Decreasing workforce to sustain growing economy
- Financial difficulties among elderly population
- Increased expenditure on social security
- Population have to save more money to prepare for longer life expectancy
- Shift away economic activity in the more productive private manufacturing sector to the service sector due to shrinking work force
- Less taxable income due to shrinking work force, thus increasing government's burden
- Low financial literacy will cause population to be unprepared financially for increasing years after retirement



3. Solutions and Recommendations

Best Practices from Abroad







- Long term care insurance
- High labor force participation rate of elderly population
- Age-friendly environment and infrastructure
- Increase women participation in labor force and improve worklife balance



EUROPEAN UNION

- Increase labor participation rate of elderly population
- Invest in research and education to boost productivity and economy/labor
- Receive and integrate migrants into Europe
- Ensure sustainable public finances to guarantee social security, and long term care.



WHO

- Develop age-friendly environment
- Align healthcare needs to older population
- Develop sustainable long term health care system
- Improve measurement, monitoring, research on Healthy Ageing


Recommendations



Cash & tax incentives to encourage early marriage among youths and for financially able homes to have more children

Increase retirement age and improve labor participation rate for women

Design **education system** to prepare for innovative, multiskilled, and highly adaptable workforce



Encourage households to increase retirement savings, especially for women since they have higher life expectancy



4. Conclusion




- Focus on developing an elderly population - maintain functional ability that also enables general well-being.
- Priority to ensure our elderly population lives a healthy and fulfilling life while sustainably growing our nation towards a greater height.
- Population policies on the elderly need to be segregated into short term and long term development - consideration of the population dynamics in terms size, distribution and location.
- Recommended that under the next Malaysia Plan, development programs need to focus on monitoring specific needs of the aged, especially for citizen aged 60 years and above



Malaysian population aged 60 years and above, 2018^e













Top ethnic group of citizens, by sex and aged 60 years and above, 2018e






