**PULAU PINANG MERUPAKAN PENYUMBANG EKSPORT TERTINGGI
PADA OKTOBER 2022**

PUTRAJAYA, 28 November 2022 – Jumlah dagangan Malaysia pada bulan Oktober 2022 bernilai RM245.2 bilion (+21.1% tahun ke tahun) dengan nilai eksport RM131.6 bilion (+15.0% tahun ke tahun) dan import bernilai RM113.5 bilion (+29.2% tahun ke tahun) seperti yang dilaporkan hari ini dalam **STATISTIK EKSPORT IMPORT MENGIKUT NEGERI OKTOBER 2022**.

Dalam satu kenyataan pada hari ini, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia berkata prestasi eksport mengikut negeri menunjukkan, "Eksport pada bulan Oktober 2022 meningkat sebanyak RM17.1 bilion (+15.0%) berbanding bulan yang sama tahun sebelumnya. Eksport lebih tinggi direkodkan bagi kebanyakan negeri iaitu Pulau Pinang (+RM7.1 bilion), Johor (+RM4.8 bilion), Sarawak (+RM3.7 bilion), W.P. Labuan (+RM1.7 bilion), Sabah (+RM1.4 bilion), Kedah (+RM1.0 bilion), Negeri Sembilan (+RM453.2 juta), Perlis (+RM43.5 juta), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM41.8 juta), Melaka (+RM38.0 juta) dan Kelantan (+RM17.7 juta). Walau bagaimanapun, eksport menyusut di Selangor (-RM1.8 bilion), Terengganu (-RM581.2 juta), Perak (-RM404.6 juta) dan Pahang (-RM330.6 juta)."

Beralih kepada prestasi import mengikut negeri, Ketua Perangkawan memaklumkan, "Import pada bulan Oktober 2022 juga meningkat RM25.6 bilion (+29.2%) berbanding bulan yang sama tahun sebelumnya. Peningkatan import dipacu oleh import yang lebih tinggi oleh kebanyakan negeri iaitu Johor (+RM14.1 bilion), Selangor (+RM4.3 bilion),


Melaka (+RM1.9 bilion), Kedah (+RM1.8 bilion), Pulau Pinang (+RM1.7 bilion), Sarawak (+RM929.3 juta), Negeri Sembilan (+RM353.0 juta), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM164.6 juta), Pahang (+RM144.6 juta), Sabah (+RM107.8 juta), Kelantan (+RM39.8 juta) dan Perlis (+RM26.3 juta). Walau bagaimanapun, import menyusut di Terengganu (-RM346.0 juta), W.P. Labuan (-RM52.5 juta) dan Perak (-RM32.5 juta).”

Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin seterusnya memaklumkan “Antara lima negeri pengeksport utama, Pulau Pinang kekal sebagai pengeksport utama dengan sumbangan 29.6 peratus, diikuti oleh Johor (21.9%), Selangor (17.1%), Sarawak (9.0%) dan W.P. Kuala Lumpur (4.3%). Sementara itu, bagi import, Johor merupakan penyumbang utama dengan 28.0 peratus, diikuti oleh Selangor (24.0%), Pulau Pinang (20.8%), Kedah (6.5%) dan W.P. Kuala Lumpur (5.7%).”

**PULAU PINANG WAS THE LARGEST CONTRIBUTOR OF EXPORTS
IN OCTOBER 2022**

PUTRAJAYA, 28 November 2022 – Malaysia's total trade for October 2022 amounted to RM245.2 billion (+21.1% year-on-year), with exports of RM131.6 billion (+15.0% year-on-year) and imports worth RM113.5 billion (+29.2% year-on-year) as reported today in **EXPORT IMPORT STATISTICS BY STATE OCTOBER 2022**.

In a statement today, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, Chief Statistician Malaysia said export performance by states has shown that, "Exports in October 2022 increased RM17.1 billion (+15.0%) compared to the same month of the previous year. Higher exports were recorded in most states such as Pulau Pinang (+RM7.1 billion), Johor (+RM4.8 billion), Sarawak (+RM3.7 billion), W.P. Labuan (+RM1.7 billion), Sabah (+RM1.4 billion), Kedah (+RM1.0 billion), Negeri Sembilan (+RM453.2 million), Perlis (+RM43.5 million), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM41.8 million), Melaka (+RM38.0 million) and Kelantan (+RM17.7 million). However, exports decreased in Selangor (-RM1.8 billion), Terengganu (-RM581.2 million), Perak (-RM404.6 million) and Pahang (-RM330.6 million)."

Looking at the performance of imports by state, the Chief Statistician informed, "Imports also increased RM25.6 billion (+29.2%) in October 2022 compared to the same month of the previous year. The increase in imports was due to the higher imports in most states such as Johor (+RM14.1 billion), Selangor (+RM4.3 billion), Melaka (+RM1.9 billion), Kedah (+RM1.8 billion), Pulau Pinang (+RM1.7 billion), Sarawak (+RM929.3 million),

Negeri Sembilan (+RM353.0 million), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM164.6 million), Pahang (+RM144.6 million), Sabah (+RM107.8 million), Kelantan (+RM39.8 million) and Perlis (+RM26.3 million). However, imports decreased in Terengganu (-RM346.0 million), W.P. Labuan (-RM52.5 million) and Perak (-RM32.5 million).”

Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin also informed, “Among the top five major exporting states, Pulau Pinang remained as the top exporter with a share of 29.6 per cent, followed by Johor (21.9%), Selangor (17.1%), Sarawak (9.0%) and W.P. Kuala Lumpur (4.3%). Meanwhile, as for imports, Johor was the largest contributor with a share of 28.0 per cent, followed by Selangor (24.0%), Pulau Pinang (20.8%), Kedah (6.5%) and W.P. Kuala Lumpur (5.7%).”

Chart 1: Time Series Data on Exports and Imports in Johor, Pulau Pinang and Selangor, October 2021 – October 2022 (RM Billion)





Exhibit 1: Infographic on Export Import Statistics by State, October 2022
