BAGI STATISTIK PERDAGANGAN MALAYSIA MENGIKUT NEGERI 2023

TUJUH NEGERI MENCATATKAN PENINGKATAN DUA DIGIT BAGI EKSPORT DAN IMPORT PADA TAHUN 2022

PUTRAJAYA, 12 Jun 2023 – Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia (DOSM) telah mengeluarkan Statistik Perdagangan Malaysia Mengikut Negeri 2023 bagi tahun rujukan 2022. Pada tahun 2022, Malaysia mencatatkan jumlah perdagangan bernilai RM2.8 trilion dengan nilai eksport RM1.6 trilion dan import bernilai RM1.3 trilion. Tujuh (7) negeri yang mencatatkan peningkatan dua digit bagi eksport dan import pada tahun 2022 ialah W.P. Labuan, Sarawak, Kedah, Johor, Perlis, Pulau Pinang dan Sabah seperti yang dilaporkan hari ini dalam **STATISTIK PERDAGANGAN MALAYSIA MENGIKUT NEGERI 2023**.

Menurut Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia, prestasi eksport Malaysia pada tahun 2022 bernilai RM1.6 trilion, meningkat sebanyak 25.0 peratus berbanding RM1.2 trilion pada tahun sebelumnya. Eksport lebih tinggi direkodkan bagi kebanyakan negeri iaitu Pulau Pinang (+RM107.7 bilion, +30.3%), Johor (+RM84.7 bilion, +35.2%), Sarawak (+RM45.4 bilion, +52.7%), Selangor (+RM22.4 bilion, +8.8%), Kedah (+RM14.4 bilion, +36.1%), Sabah (+RM8.8 bilion, +27.0%), W.P. Labuan (+RM8.2 bilion, +75.3%), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM2.9 bilion, +4.5%), Pahang (+RM2.9 bilion, +8.9%), Negeri Sembilan (+RM2.2 bilion, +9.4%), Melaka (+RM1.2 bilion, +4.1%), Kelantan (+RM1.2 bilion, +42.1%), Perlis (+RM392.1 juta, +34.2%) dan Terengganu (+RM325.7 juta, +1.9%). Walau bagaimanapun, eksport Perak menyusut RM2.2 bilion atau 5.6 peratus kepada RM37.1 bilion.

Pulau Pinang kekal sebagai pengeksport utama Malaysia dengan sumbangan 29.9 peratus, diikuti oleh Johor (21.0%) dan Selangor (17.8%). Pertumbuhan eksport disokong oleh eksport litar elektronik bersepadu yang kukuh di Pulau Pinang dan Selangor. Di samping itu, keluaran petroleum bertapis merupakan penyumbang utama eksport di Johor.

Beralih kepada prestasi import mengikut negeri, Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia memaklumkan import pada tahun 2022 bernilai RM1.3 trillion, meningkat 31.3 peratus berbanding RM987.3 billion pada tahun sebelumnya. Peningkatan import dipacu oleh import yang lebih tinggi oleh kesemua negeri iaitu Johor (+RM96.3 bilion, +49.7%), Pulau Pinang (+RM61.1 bilion, +26.4%), Selangor (+RM56.0 bilion, +20.2%), Kedah (+RM16.2 bilion, +28.0%), Melaka (+RM15.6 bilion, +61.4%), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM15.5 bilion, +21.0%), Negeri Sembilan (+RM12.9 bilion, +41.2%), Sarawak (+RM10.8 bilion, +46.0%), Pahang (+RM7.3 bilion, +47.7%), Perak (+RM4.8 bilion, +14.9%), Sabah (+RM2.1 bilion, +25.8%), W.P. Labuan (+RM1.4 bilion, +71.2%), Terengganu (+RM1.1 bilion, +21.9%), Perlis (+RM425.0 juta, +50.9%) dan Kelantan (+RM191.0 juta, +9.9%).

Selangor terus mendominasi import Malaysia dengan 25.7 peratus, diikuti oleh Pulau Pinang (22.6%) dan Johor (22.4%). Import yang tinggi dicatatkan di Selangor disumbangkan oleh barang elektrik dan elektronik lain. Di samping itu, litar elektronik bersepadu merupakan penyumbang utama import di Pulau Pinang. Manakala keluaran petroleum bertapis merupakan penyumbang utama import di Johor.

Penerbitan ini mengandungi statistik Perdagangan Antarabangsa (barang) berkaitan eksport dan import di peringkat negeri dengan seluruh dunia dari tahun 2017 hingga 2022. Penerbitan ini juga menyediakan statistik terperinci bagi setiap negeri mengikut komoditi utama/terpilih, negara asal dan negara destinasi bagi tahun 2020 hingga 2022.

Statistik Perdagangan Malaysia mengikut Negeri 2023 bertujuan untuk menyediakan statistik terperinci di peringkat negeri kepada pihak berkepentingan. Statistik komprehensif ini dihasilkan daripada modul *Trade Enterprise Characteristics* (TEC), iaitu salah satu inisiatif Jabatan di bawah *Statistics Big Data Analytics* (STATSBDA). TEC mengintegrasikan dua domain statistik yang berbeza iaitu pangkalan data perdagangan barang antarabangsa dan *Malaysia Statistical Business Register* (MSBR). Statistik ini memberikan maklumat penting kepada penggubal dasar untuk merangka perancangan strategik bagi negeri-negeri yang terlibat dalam perdagangan antarabangsa.



DOSM akan mengeluarkan Anggaran KDNK Awalan bermula pada suku tahun kedua 2023. Anggaran awalan ini merupakan inisiatif yang dilaksanakan oleh DOSM untuk memberikan gambaran prestasi ekonomi empat (4) minggu awal sebelum KDNK Suku Tahunan dikeluarkan.



SEVEN STATES REGISTERED A DOUBLE DIGIT GROWTH FOR EXPORTS AND IMPORTS IN 2022

PUTRAJAYA, 12 June 2023 – Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM) has released *Malaysia Trade Statistics by State 2023* for reference year 2022. In 2022, Malaysia's total trade amounted to RM2.8 trillion with exports of RM1.6 trillion and imports worth RM1.3 trillion. Seven (7) states registered a double digit growth for exports and imports in 2022 were W.P. Labuan, Sarawak, Kedah, Johor, Perlis, Pulau Pinang and Sabah as reported today in **MALAYSIA TRADE STATISTICS BY STATE 2023**.

According to the Department of Statistics Malaysia, export performance has shown that Malaysia's exports valued at RM1.6 trillion in 2022, weighed up 25.0 per cent as compared to RM1.2 trillion in the previous year. Higher exports were recorded in most states such as Pulau Pinang (+RM107.7 billion, +30.3%), Johor (+RM84.7 billion, +35.2%), Sarawak (+RM45.4 billion, +52.7%), Selangor (+RM22.4 billion, +8.8%), Kedah (+RM14.4 billion, +36.1%), Sabah (+RM8.8 billion, +27.0%), W.P. Labuan (+RM8.2 billion, +75.3%), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM2.9 billion, +4.5%), Pahang (+RM2.9 billion, +8.9%), Negeri Sembilan (+RM2.2 billion, +9.4%), Melaka (+RM1.2 billion, +4.1%), Kelantan (+RM1.2 billion, +42.1%), Perlis (+RM392.1 million, +34.2%) and Terengganu (+RM325.7 million, +1.9%). However, exports decreased in Perak by RM2.2 billion or 5.6 per cent to RM37.1 billion.

Pulau Pinang remained as the top exporter with a share of 29.9 per cent, followed by Johor (21.0%) and Selangor (17.8%). The export expansion was underpinned by strong exports of electronic integrated circuits in Pulau Pinang and Selangor. Meanwhile, refined petroleum products were the main contributors of exports in Johor.

Looking at the performance of imports by state, the Department of Statistics Malaysia informed imports in 2022 amounted RM1.3 trillion, increased 31.3 per cent as compared to RM987.3 billion in the previous year. The increase in imports was due to higher imports by all states namely Johor (+RM96.3 billion, +49.7%), Pulau Pinang (+RM61.1 billion, +26.4%), Selangor (+RM56.0 billion, +20.2%), Kedah (+RM16.2 billion, +28.0%), Melaka (+RM15.6 billion, +61.4%), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (+RM15.5 billion, +21.0%), Negeri Sembilan (+RM12.9 billion, +41.2%), Sarawak (+RM10.8 billion, +46.0%), Pahang (+RM7.3 billion, +47.7%), Perak (+RM4.8 billion, +14.9%), Sabah (+RM2.1 billion, +25.8%), W.P. Labuan (+RM1.4 billion, +71.2%), Terengganu (+RM1.1 billion, +21.9%), Perlis (+RM425.0 million, +50.9%) and Kelantan (+RM191.0 million, +9.9%).

Selangor continued to dominate Malaysia's imports with a share of 25.7 per cent, followed by Pulau Pinang (22.6%) and Johor (22.4%). Higher imports recorded in Selangor was contributed by other electrical and electronic products. In addition, electronic integrated circuits were the main contributors of imports in Pulau Pinang. Meanwhile, refined petroleum products were the main contributors of imports in Johor.

This publication contains statistics of Malaysia's External Trade (merchandise) on imports and exports at the state level with the rest of the world from 2017 to 2022. In addition, this publication provides detailed statistics for each state according to major/selected commodities, country of origin and destination from 2020 to 2022.

Malaysia Trade Statistics by State 2023 aims to provide detailed statistics at the state level to the stakeholders. These comprehensive statistics are generated from the Trade Enterprise Characteristics (TEC) module which is one of the Department's initiatives under the Statistics Big Data Analytics (STATSBDA). TEC integrates two different statistics domains: the international merchandise trade database and Malaysia Statistical Business

Register (MSBR). These statistics provide imperative information to policymakers to formulate strategic planning for states involved in international trade.



Exhibit 1: Malaysia Trade Statistics by State, 2022



Exhibit 2: Top 3 Export and Import Commodities by State, 2022


