Indeks Nilai Seunit Eksport & Import masing-masing merosot 0.2 peratus

PUTRAJAYA, 28 JUN 2023 – Indeks nilai seunit eksport dan import susut 0.2 peratus pada Mei 2023, dengan eksport jatuh daripada 141.9 mata pada bulan sebelumnya kepada 141.7 mata manakala import jatuh daripada 128.2 mata kepada 127.9 mata. Sementara itu, terma perdagangan Malaysia meningkat 0.1 peratus bulan ke bulan kepada 110.8 mata pada Mei 2023, sebagaimana dipaparkan oleh laporan **INDEKS PERDAGANGAN LUAR NEGERI (2010=100), Mei 2023** pada hari ini. Penerbitan ini memaparkan statistik indeks nilai seunit, indeks volum dan terma perdagangan meliputi 10 seksyen komoditi produk barang selaras dengan Klasifikasi Standard Perdagangan Antarabangsa (SITC).

Menurut Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia, “Indeks nilai seunit eksport jatuh 0.2 peratus pada Mei 2023 berbanding bulan sebelumnya, disumbangkan oleh kejatuhan indeks minyak & lemak binatang & sayur-sayuran (-1.9%), minyak galian (-0.1%) dan pelbagai barang keluaran kilang (-0.1%). Dalam pada itu, indeks volum eksport meningkat 13.9 peratus pada bulan yang sama, selaras dengan kenaikan indeks minyak galian (+29.5%), pelbagai barang keluaran kilang (+25.2%) dan alat jentera & kelengkapan pengangkutan (+8.0%). Indeks volum eksport pelarasan bermusim

berkembang 24.9 peratus daripada 136.3 mata kepada 170.3 mata. Merujuk kepada perbandingan tahunan, indeks nilai seunit jatuh 4.7 peratus manakala indeks volum eksport meningkat 4.2 peratus.”

Indeks nilai seunit import turut merosot pada Mei 2023 dengan 0.2 peratus, disumbangkan oleh kejatuhan indeks minyak galian (-4.5%), minyak & lemak binatang & sayur-sayuran (-1.8%) dan bahan kimia (-0.2%). Manakala, indeks volum import meningkat 12.8 peratus pada Mei 2023 berbanding bulan sebelum, disumbangkan oleh peningkatan indeks minyak galian (+24.4%), bahan kimia (+19.1%) dan alat jentera & kelengkapan pengangkutan (+6.7%). Indeks volum import pelarasan bermusim turut meningkat 18.8 peratus daripada 157.6 mata kepada 187.2 mata. Perbandingan tahun ke tahun menunjukkan indeks nilai seunit import susut 3.5 peratus manakala indeks volum meningkat 0.4 peratus.


Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia (DOSM) turut melaporkan terma perdagangan Malaysia meningkat 0.1 peratus bulan ke bulan kepada 110.8 mata pada Mei 2023, didorong oleh kenaikan indeks minyak galian (+4.7%), barang-barang keluaran kilang (+0.9%) dan bahan mentah tidak boleh dimakan (+0.8%). Terma perdagangan Malaysia jatuh 1.2 peratus tahun ke tahun daripada 112.1 mata pada Mei tahun lalu.

Export & Import Unit Value Indices declined by 0.2 per cent respectively

PUTRAJAYA, JUNE 28, 2023 – Export and import unit value indices declined 0.2 per cent in May 2023, with exports falling from 141.9 points in the preceding month to 141.7 points while imports fell from 128.2 points to 127.9 points. In the meantime, Malaysia's terms of trade rose by 0.1 per cent month-on-month to 110.8 points in May 2023 as reported today in **EXTERNAL TRADE INDICES (2010=100), May 2023**. This publication presents the unit value and volume index and terms of trade for 10 commodity sections of merchandise products in accordance with the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC).

According to the Department of Statistics Malaysia, “The export unit value index fell by 0.2 per cent in May 2023 as compared to the previous month, attributed to the decrease in the index of animal & vegetable oils & fats (-1.9%), mineral fuels (-0.1%) and miscellaneous manufactured articles (-0.1%). Meanwhile, the export volume index increased by 13.9 per cent in the same month, in line with the increase in the index of mineral fuels (+29.5%), miscellaneous manufactured articles (+25.2%) and machinery & transport equipment (+8.0%). The seasonally adjusted export volume index grew by 24.9 per cent from 136.3 points to 170.3 points. For year-on-year comparison, the export unit value index plummeted 4.7 per cent while the volume index increased by 4.2 per cent.”

The import unit value index also dropped by 0.2 per cent in May 2023, led by the decrease in the index of mineral fuels (-4.5%), animal & vegetable oils & fats (-1.8%) and chemicals (-0.2%). While, the import volume index increased by 12.8 per cent in May 2023 as compared to the previous month, attributed to the rise in the index of mineral fuels (+24.4%), chemicals (+19.1%) and machinery & transport equipment (+6.7%). The seasonally adjusted import volume index also went up by 18.8 per cent from 157.6 points to 187.2 points. For year-on-year comparison, the import unit value index fell 3.5 per cent, while the volume index increased by 0.4 per cent.

The Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM) also reported that Malaysia's terms of trade rose by 0.1 per cent month-on-month to 110.8 points in May 2023, in accordance with the increase in the index of mineral fuels (+4.7%), manufactured goods (+0.9%) and inedible crude materials (+0.8%). Malaysia's terms of trade shrank by 1.2 per cent year-on-year from 112.1 points in May of the previous year.




Chart 1: Month-on-Month Percentage Change of Export & Import Unit Value Indices
