Women surpass men in educational achievement

PUTRAJAYA: Malaysia Gender Gap Index (MGGI) scored 0.707 or 70.7% in 2021 compared to 0.714 or 71.4% 2020, with women's achievement surpassing men in the educational attainment sub-index with a score of 1.060, said the Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM) in conjunction with World Population Day.

MGGI identifies the gap between women and men across four sub-indices encompassing economic participation and opportunity, educational attainment, health and survival and political empowerment.

A score with a value of 1.0 or 100% indicates the equality of women and men has been achieved, reported Bernama.

DOSM said girls are consistently enrolling at higher rates than boys in both prima-

ry and secondary school.

"In 2022, the gross enrolment rate for females in primary and secondary levels were 98.4% and 94.5% respectively. At the tertiary level, women at 47.5% outnumbered men at 33.8%. This achievement supports the country's commitment to providing access to high-quality education," it said.

On economic participation and opportunity with a score of 0.709, DOSM said women's labour force participation rate in Malaysia has risen significantly from 44.5% in 1982 to 55.5% in 2021.

According to World Bank Indicator, the world's labour force participation rate of women stood at 52.5% in 2021.

On political empowerment, DOSM said it recorded 10% or a score of 0.100 which shows that there was potential for increased representation and empowerment of women in the political sphere.
