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PERANGKAAAN PERDAGANGAN LUAR NEGERI MALAYSIA JULAI 2024

**Perdagangan Malaysia melonjak 18.3 peratus kepada RM255.9 bilion
dirangsang oleh eksport yang lebih tinggi (+12.3%) dan import (+25.4%)**

PUTRAJAYA, 19 OGOS 2024 – Ekonomi global yang semakin kukuh melonjakkan prestasi perdagangan Malaysia dengan pertumbuhan dua angka pada Julai 2024. Jumlah dagangan menunjukkan peningkatan 18.3 peratus daripada RM216.2 bilion pada tahun sebelumnya kepada RM255.9 bilion. Prestasi perdagangan ini didorong terutamanya oleh pertumbuhan import 25.4 peratus, mencecah RM124.7 bilion dan eksport 12.3 peratus, bernilai RM131.1 bilion pada Julai 2024 seperti yang dilaporkan hari ini dalam **BULETIN PERANGKAAAN PERDAGANGAN LUAR NEGERI MALAYSIA, JULAI 2024**. Buletin ini juga membentangkan prestasi produk untuk eksport dan import serta rakan dagangannya.

Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin menjelaskan prestasi eksport Malaysia meningkat pada Julai 2024 seiring dengan peningkatan eksport domestik (80.1% daripada jumlah eksport), meningkat 18.0 peratus kepada RM105.0 bilion. Sebaliknya, eksport semula (19.9% daripada jumlah eksport), susut 5.8 peratus berbanding Julai 2023 kepada RM26.1 bilion. Sementara itu, import bernilai RM124.7 bilion, meningkat 25.4 peratus. Lebihan

dagangan menurun 62.9 peratus kepada RM6.4 bilion, lebih bulan ke-51 berturut-turut sejak Mei 2020. Berbanding Jun 2024, eksport, import dan jumlah dagangan masing-masing mencatatkan peningkatan 4.1 peratus, 11.6 peratus dan 7.6 peratus. Manakala, imbalan dagangan menurun 55.1 peratus.

Melihat dari sudut kumpulan barangan, 177 daripada 259 kumpulan eksport dan 192 daripada 258 kumpulan import menunjukkan peningkatan berbanding bulan yang sama pada tahun sebelumnya. Bilangan transaksi yang diproses oleh DOSM pada Julai 2024 melebihi 5 juta, mencatatkan bilangan tertinggi pernah diproses.

Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia turut menekankan bahawa eksport yang lebih tinggi disumbangkan terutamanya ke Amerika Syarikat (+RM4.2 bilion), diikuti oleh Singapura (+RM3.2 bilion), Taiwan (+RM1.9 bilion), Kesatuan Eropah (+RM1.3 bilion), Filipina (+RM808.7 juta), India (+RM696.2 juta), Mexico (+RM690.6 juta), Jepun (+RM682.5 juta) dan Viet Nam (+RM601.1 juta). Selain itu, import yang lebih tinggi disumbangkan terutamanya dari China (+RM6.6 bilion), diikuti oleh Amerika Syarikat (+RM6.3 bilion), Taiwan (+RM4.1 bilion), Singapura (+RM2.7 bilion), Kesatuan Eropah (+RM1.7 bilion), Thailand (+RM833.0 juta), Jepun (+RM752.3 juta), Indonesia (+RM643.1 juta) dan Nigeria (+RM600.9 juta).

Mengulas lebih lanjut mengenai eksport, kenaikan ini sejajar dengan peningkatan dalam keluaran perkilangan lain (+RM2.1 bilion); minyak kelapa sawit & keluaran pertanian berasaskan kelapa sawit (+RM2.0 bilion); jentera, kelengkapan & peralatan (+RM1.7 bilion); keluaran petroleum (+RM1.5 bilion); barangan elektrik & elektronik (+RM1.3 bilion); dan barangan perkilangan logam (+RM844.5 juta). Tambahan pula, peningkatan import dicatatkan untuk barangan elektrik & elektronik (+RM14.9 bilion); jentera, kelengkapan & peralatan (+RM4.1 bilion); keluaran pertanian lain (+RM1.9 bilion); barangan perkilangan logam

(+RM1.3 bilion); keluaran perkilangan lain (+RM626.5 juta); dan kimia & bahan kimia (+RM536.3 juta).

Selanjutnya, Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia juga memaklumkan pertambahan import mengikut Penggunaan Akhir adalah seiring dengan permintaan yang lebih tinggi bagi barangan perantaraan, barangan modal dan barangan penggunaan. Import barang perantaraan (55.4% daripada jumlah import), bernilai RM69.1 bilion, mencatatkan peningkatan 41.2 peratus atau RM20.2 bilion berbanding Julai 2023. Barangan modal (12.1% daripada jumlah import) bernilai RM15.1 bilion, meningkat 44.4 peratus. Barangan penggunaan (8.8% daripada jumlah import), meningkat 25.5 peratus daripada RM8.7 bilion pada tahun sebelumnya kepada RM11.0 bilion.

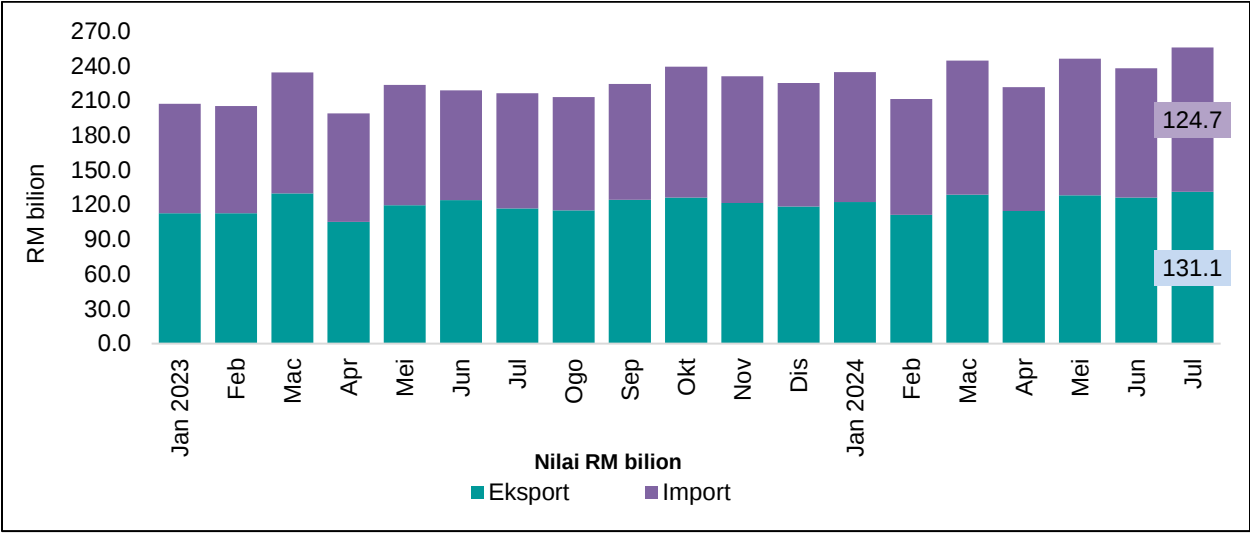
Jumlah dagangan, eksport dan import bagi tempoh Januari hingga Julai 2024 mencatatkan peningkatan. Jumlah dagangan meningkat 9.8 peratus, daripada RM1.5 trilion kepada RM1.7 trilion, sejajar dengan peningkatan dalam eksport (+5.1%) serta import (+15.5%). Sebaliknya, lebih dagangan berkurang 46.9 peratus berbanding tempoh yang sama pada 2023 mencatatkan nilai RM72.5 bilion.

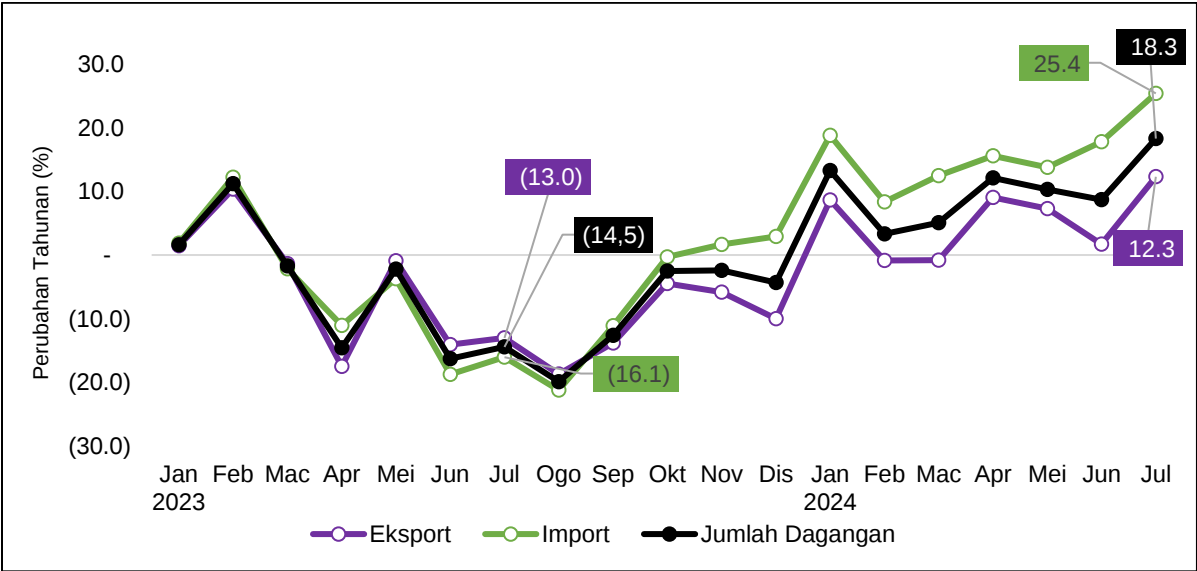

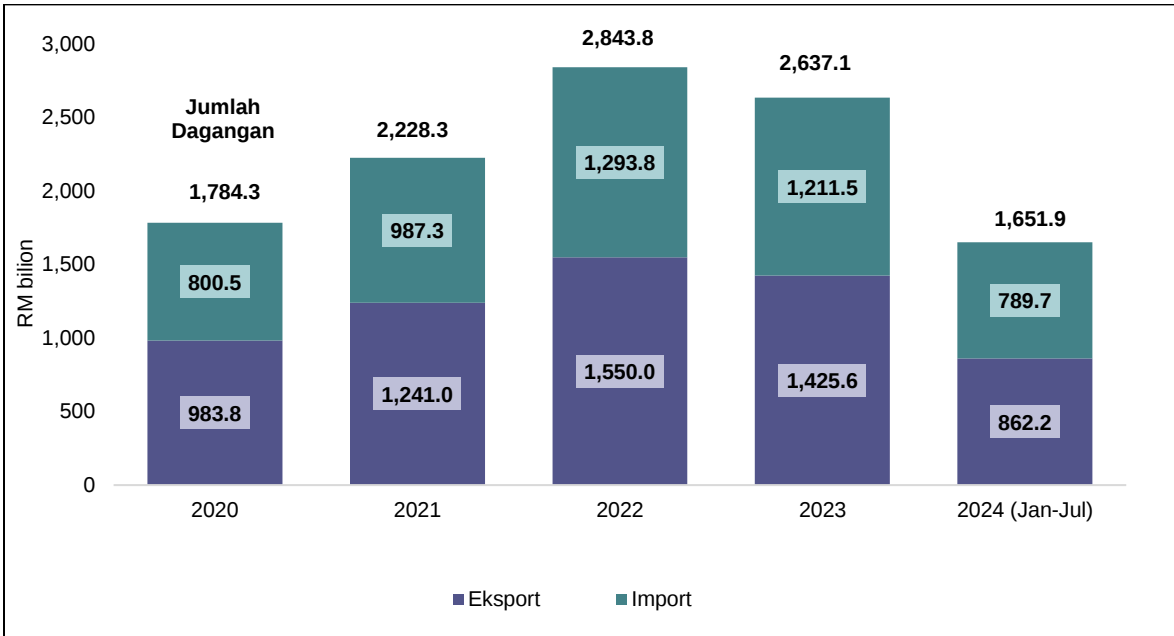
Carta 1: Perangkaan Perdagangan Luar Negeri, Jan 2023 – Jul 2024 (Nilai)



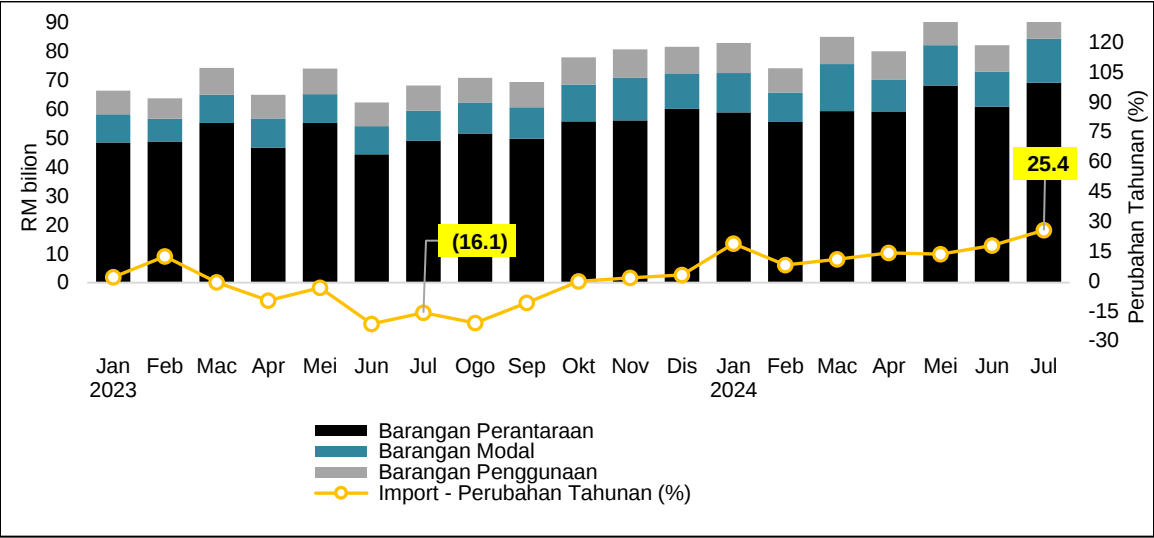
Carta 2: Perangkaan Perdagangan Luar Negeri, Jan 2023 – Jul 2024
(Peratus Perubahan Tahunan)



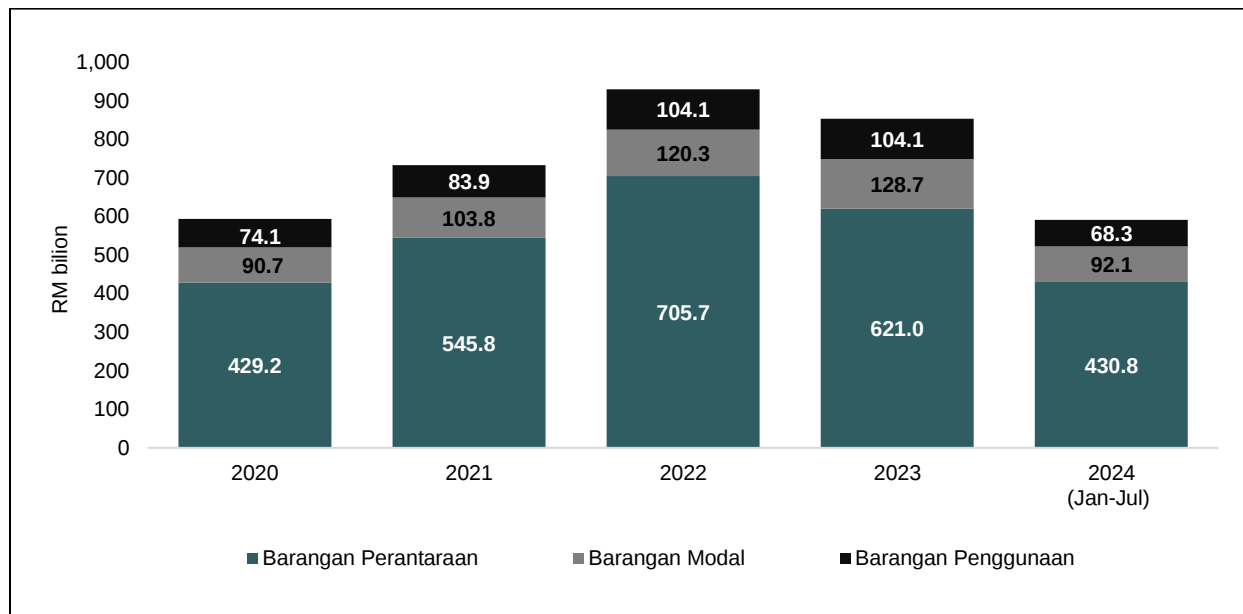
Carta 3: Perangkaan Perdagangan Luar Negeri, 2020 – 2024 (Jan-Jul)

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MALAYSIA EXTERNAL TRADE STATISTICS JULY 2024

Malaysia's trade escalated by 18.3 per cent to RM255.9 billion boosted by higher exports (+12.3%) and imports (+25.4%)

PUTRAJAYA, 19 AUGUST 2024 – A strengthening global economy boosted Malaysia's trade performance with a double-digit growth in July 2024. Total trade exhibited an increase of 18.3 per cent from RM216.2 billion in the previous year to RM255.9 billion. This performance primarily driven by growth in imports by 25.4 per cent, reaching RM124.7 billion and exports by 12.3 per cent, valued at RM131.1 billion in July 2024 as reported today in **MALAYSIA EXTERNAL TRADE STATISTICS BULLETIN, JULY 2024**. This bulletin also presents the performance of export and import products with its trading partners.

Chief Statistician Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin highlighted Malaysia's exports increased in July 2024 in tandem with the rise in domestic exports (80.1% to total exports), rose by 18.0 per cent to RM105.0 billion. On the other hand, re-exports (19.9% to total exports) was down by 5.8 per cent as compared to July 2023, worth RM26.1 billion. Meanwhile, imports worth RM124.7 billion, increased by 25.4 per cent. Trade surplus decreased by 62.9 per cent to RM6.4 billion, 51st consecutive month of surplus since May 2020. Comparing with

June 2024, exports, imports and total trade recorded an increase of 4.1 per cent, 11.6 per cent and 7.6 per cent, respectively. Nonetheless, trade balance decreased by 55.1 per cent.

From the perspective of the commodity group, 177 out of 259 export groups and 192 out of 258 import groups showed an increase as compared to the same month of the previous year along. The number of transactions processed by DOSM in July 2024 exceeded 5 million, marking the highest ever processing.

Chief Statistician Malaysia further explained higher exports was attributable mainly to the United States (+RM4.2 billion), followed by Singapore (+RM3.2 billion), Taiwan (+RM1.9 billion), the European Union (+RM1.3 billion), Philippines (+RM808.7 million), India (+RM696.2 million), Mexico (+RM690.6 million), Japan (+RM682.5 million) and Viet Nam (+RM601.1 million). Moreover, higher imports were mainly contributed from China (+RM6.6 billion), followed by the United States (+RM6.3 billion), Taiwan (+RM4.1 billion), Singapore (+RM2.7 billion), the European Union (+RM1.7 billion), Thailand (+RM833.0 million), Japan (+RM752.3 million), Indonesia (+RM643.1 million) and Nigeria (+RM600.9 million).

Commenting further on exports, the rise was in line with the increase in other manufactures (+RM2.1 billion); palm oil & palm-based agriculture products (+RM2.0 billion); machinery, equipment & parts (+RM1.7 billion); petroleum products (+RM1.5 billion); electrical & electronic products (+RM1.3 billion); and manufacture of metal (+RM844.5 million). Furthermore, the increase in imports was logged for electrical & electronic products (+RM14.9 billion); machinery, equipment & parts (+RM4.1 billion); other agriculture (+RM1.9 billion); manufacture of metal (+RM1.3 billion); other manufactures (+RM626.5 million); and chemical & chemical products (+RM536.3 million).

Adding to this, the Chief Statistician Malaysia also emphasised the upsurge in imports by End Use which was in accordance with higher demand for intermediate goods, capital goods and consumption goods. Imports of intermediate goods (55.4% of total imports), valued at RM69.1 billion, registered an increase of 41.2 per cent or RM20.2 billion as compared to July 2023. Capital goods (12.1% of total imports) with a value of RM15.1 billion, rose by 44.4 per cent. Consumption goods (8.8% of total imports), grew by 25.5 per cent from RM8.7 billion in the previous year to RM11.0 billion.

Total trade, exports and imports for the period of January to July 2024 registered an increase. Total trade grew by 9.8 per cent, from RM1.5 trillion to RM1.7 trillion, in line with the rise in exports (+5.1%) as well as imports (+15.5%). On the contrary, trade surplus decreased by 46.9 per cent as compared to the same period in 2023 to post a value of RM72.5 billion.

Chart 1: External Trade Statistics, Jan 2023 – Jul 2024 (Value)

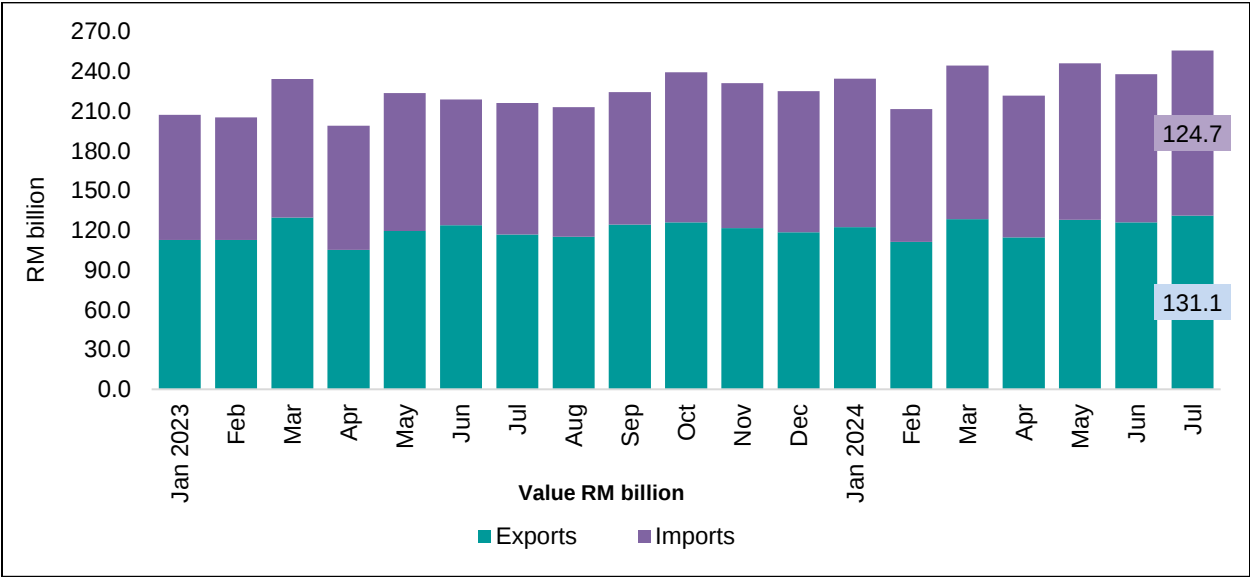


Chart 2: External Trade Statistics, Jan 2023 – Jul 2024
(Annual Percentage Change)

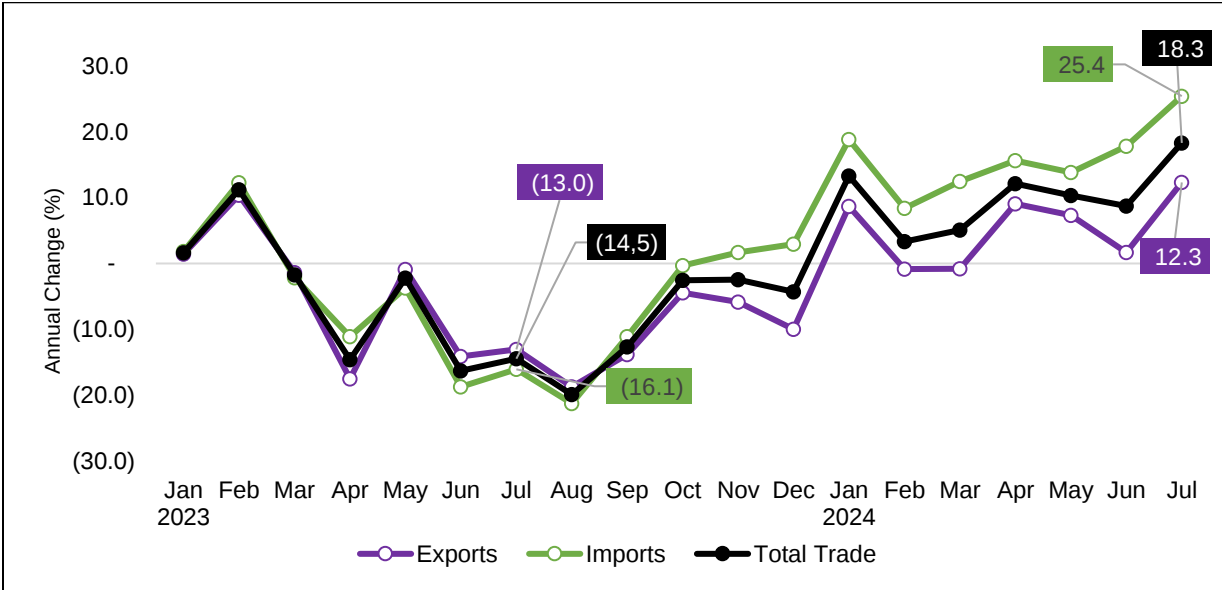


Chart 3: External Trade Statistics, 2020 – 2024 (Jan-Jul)

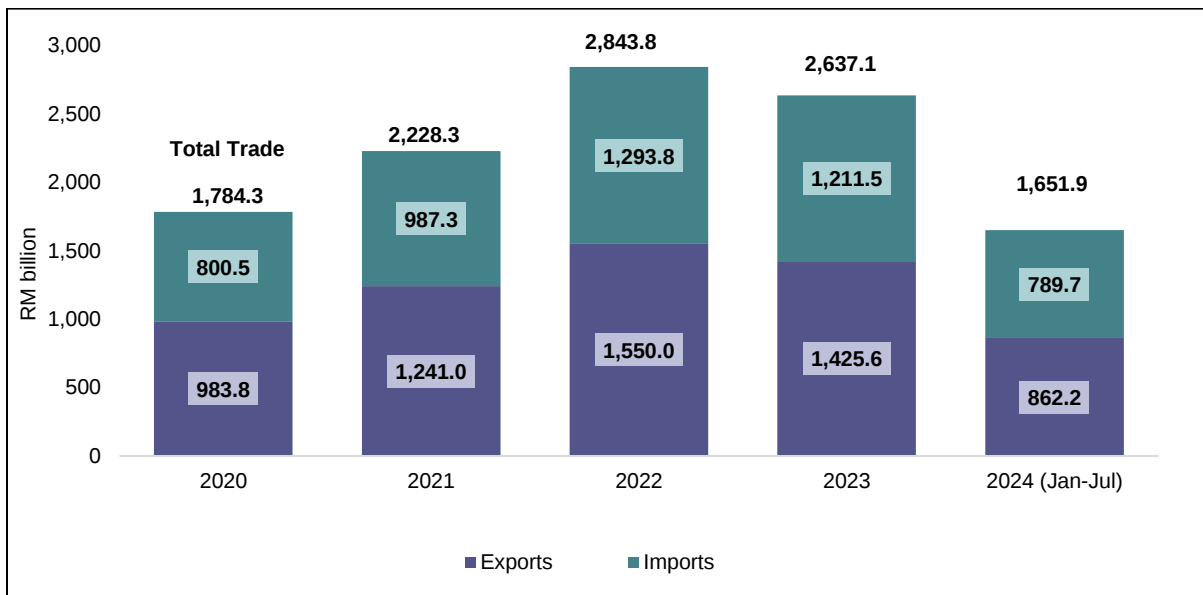
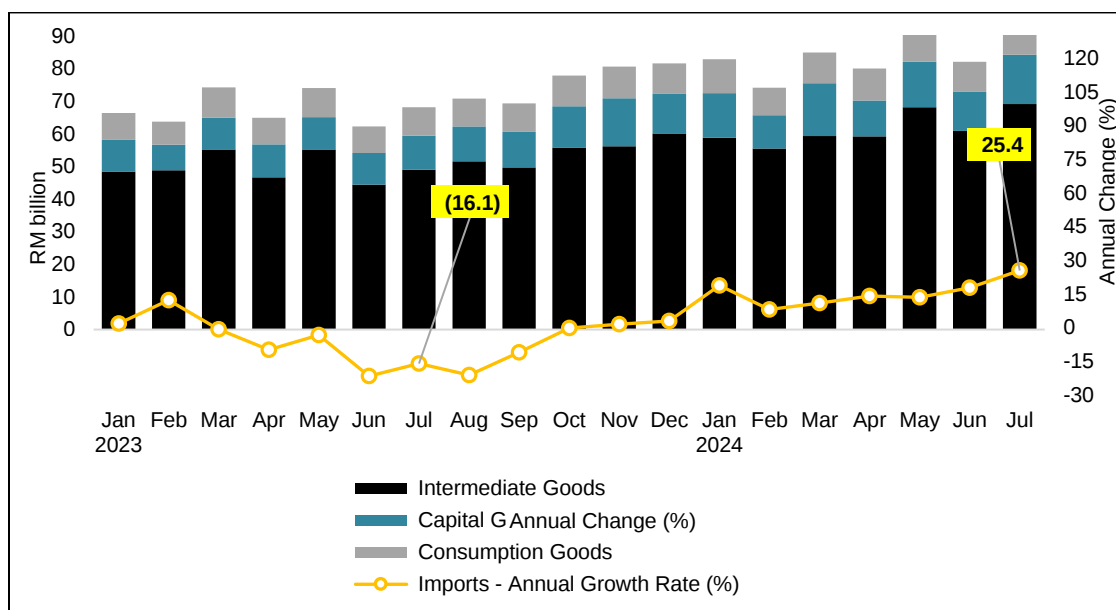
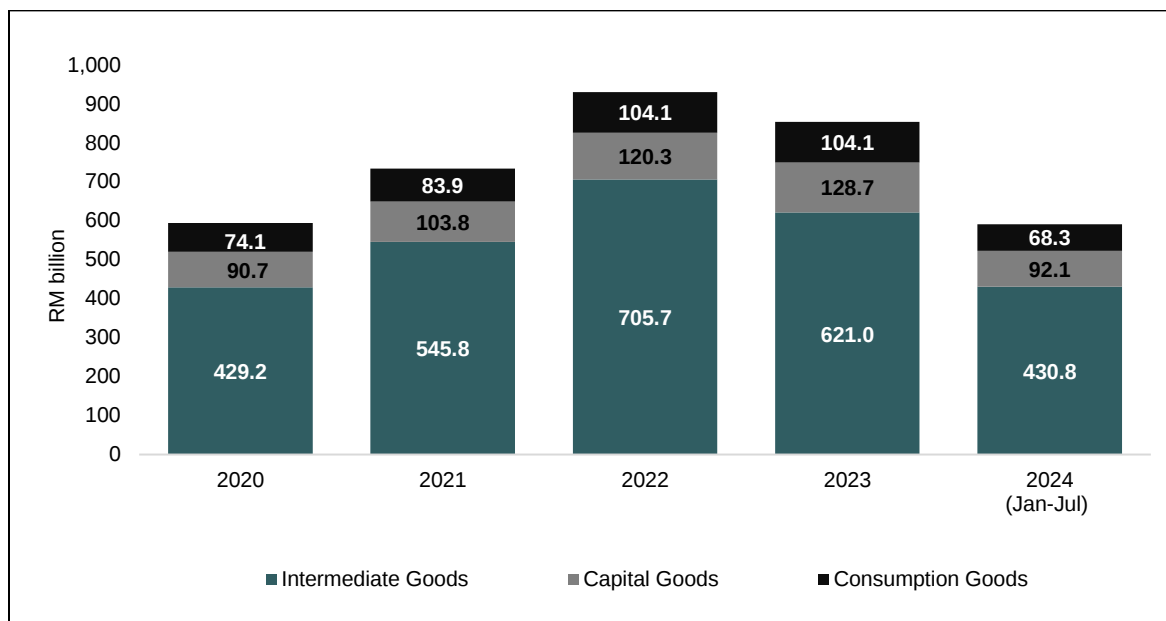


Chart 4: Imports for End Use & Broad Economic Categories (BEC) Classification, Jan 2023 – Jul 2024
