INDEKS HARGA PENGELUAR (IHPR) PENGELUARAN TEMPATAN, MALAYSIA FEBRUARI 2025

Indeks Harga Pengeluar Malaysia mencatatkan peningkatan sederhana 0.3 peratus pada Februari 2025

PUTRAJAYA, 27 Mac 2025 – Indeks Harga Pengeluar Malaysia yang mengukur perubahan harga di peringkat pengeluar, mencatatkan peningkatan tahun ke tahun 0.3 peratus pada Februari 2025, sederhana berbanding kenaikan 0.8 peratus yang direkodkan pada Januari 2025. Peningkatan sederhana ini dipengaruhi oleh peningkatan yang berterusan dalam sektor Pertanian, perhutanan & perikanan di sebalik penurunan dalam sektor Perlombongan. Ini dilaporkan dalam laporan bulanan terbaharu **INDEKS HARGA PENGELUAR (IHPR) PENGELUARAN TEMPATAN, FEBRUARI 2025** diterbitkan oleh Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia.

Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, menekankan, "Sektor Pertanian, perhutanan & perikanan kekal sebagai pemacu utama IHPR Pengeluaran Tempatan, mencatatkan peningkatan 15.2 peratus tahun ke tahun, berbanding kenaikan 16.5 peratus pada Januari 2025. Subsektor Penanaman tanaman kekal sebagai faktor utama, meningkat 26.1 peratus. Namun begitu, sektor Perlombongan terus turun, mencatatkan penyusutan 9.7 peratus (January 2024: -1.3%), dengan penurunan dalam Pengekstrakan petroleum mentah (-9.8%) dan Pengekstrakan gas asli (-9.4%). Sektor Pembuatan mencatatkan penurunan perlahan 0.3 peratus, berbanding penyusutan 0.6 peratus pada bulan sebelumnya. Penurunan terbesar disebabkan oleh Pembuatan kok & produk petroleum bertapis (-12.7%) dan Pembuatan komputer, produk elektronik & optikal (-3.2%). Sementara itu, sektor Bekalan elektrik & gas mencatatkan penurunan sederhana

0.2 peratus, manakala sektor Bekalan air meneruskan trend positifnya dengan peningkatan 2.9 peratus.”

Dato’ Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin menjelaskan lagi, “Pada asas bulan ke bulan, IHPR Pengeluaran Tempatan meningkat sederhana 0.1 peratus pada Februari 2025, lebih perlahan berbanding 0.3 peratus pada Januari 2025. Sektor Pertanian, perhutanan & perikanan meningkat 1.4 peratus berbanding penurunan 3.9 peratus pada bulan sebelumnya, disokong oleh peningkatan dalam Perikanan (5.9%) dan Penanaman tanaman kekal (1.6%). Sektor Pembuatan meningkat 0.3 peratus, mengekalkan kadar kenaikan yang sama seperti bulan sebelumnya, disebabkan oleh Pembuatan kok & produk petroleum bertapis (0.9%) dan Pembuatan produk makanan (0.7%). Sebaliknya, sektor Perlombongan menyusut 3.2 peratus (Januari 2025: 5.3%), disebabkan oleh Pengekstrakan gas asli (-3.5%) dan Pengekstrakan petroleum mentah (-3.2%). Dalam sektor utiliti, sektor Bekalan elektrik & gas meningkat 0.3 peratus, manakala sektor Bekalan air mengalami penurunan 1.8 peratus.”

Mengulas lebih lanjut mengenai IHPR Pengeluaran Tempatan mengikut peringkat pemprosesan, Dato’ Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin menjelaskan, “Indeks Bahan mentah untuk diproseskan selanjutnya dan Bahan perantaraan, bekalan & komponen kekal tidak berubah pada asas tahun ke tahun. Sementara itu, indeks Barang siap mencatatkan peningkatan perlahan 0.7 peratus, disokong oleh indeks Kelengkapan modal (1.7%).”

Pada asas bulan ke bulan, kedua-dua indeks Bahan mentah untuk diproseskan selanjutnya dan Barang siap mencatatkan peningkatan sederhana 0.3 peratus. Namun begitu, indeks Bahan perantaraan, bekalan & komponen turun perlahan 0.1 peratus.

Perbandingan dengan negara terpilih menunjukkan trend IHPR yang berbeza pada Februari 2025. IHPR Amerika Syarikat meningkat 3.2 peratus, perlahan berbanding kenaikan 3.7 peratus pada bulan sebelumnya. IHPR Jepun juga meningkat 4.0 peratus, perlahan berbanding kenaikan 4.2 peratus pada Januari 2025, didorong oleh sektor Peralatan pengangkutan dan Petroleum & arang batu. Sebaliknya, harga pengeluar di China terus menurun, mencatatkan penurunan 2.2 peratus selepas turun 2.3 peratus pada dua bulan sebelumnya. Ini merupakan penyusutan paling perlahan sejak Ogos 2024. Namun begitu, deflasi harga pengeluar berterusan selama 29 bulan berturut-turut, dipengaruhi oleh turun naik harga komoditi serta kesan cuti Tahun Baru Cina pada akhir Januari 2025.

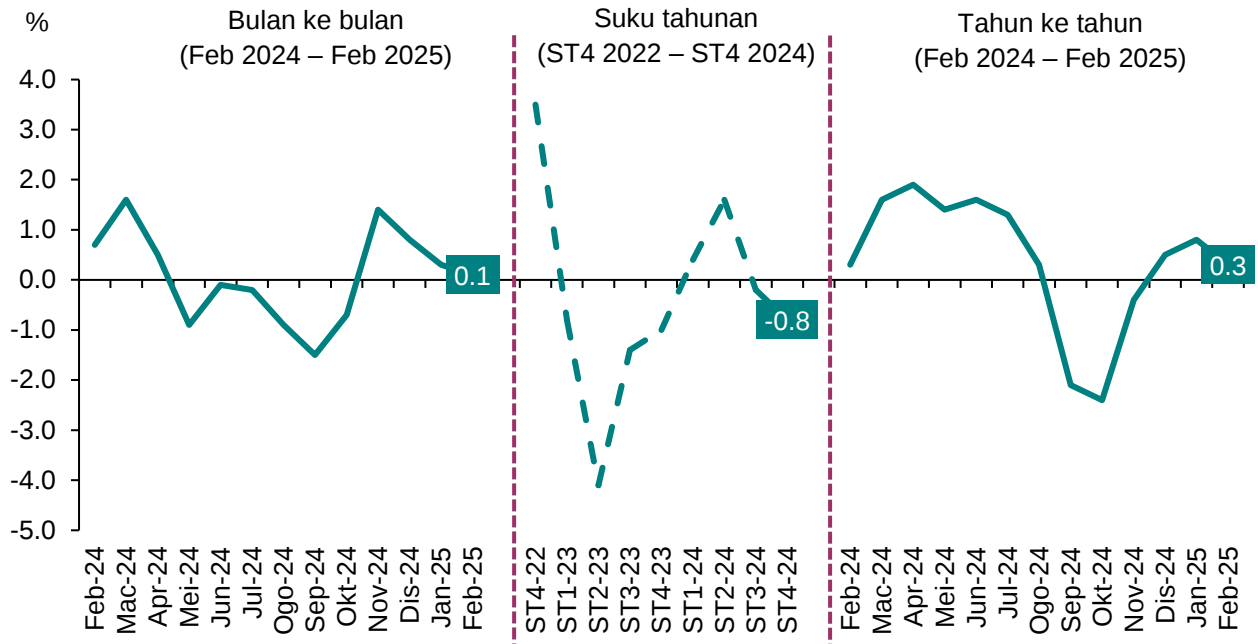
Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin turut memberikan pandangan mengenai harga komoditi terpilih di Malaysia. menyatakan bahawa purata harga minyak mentah Brent berada sekitar \$75 setong pada Februari 2025 turun daripada \$79 setong pada bulan sebelumnya. Penurunan ini disebabkan oleh jangkaan peningkatan bekalan daripada negara anggota OPEC+ yang memberikan tekanan penurunan harga. Sementara itu, harga purata minyak sawit mentah (MSM) meningkat kepada RM4,759 setiap tan, daripada RM4,673 setiap tan pada Januari 2025. Harga MSM Malaysia menunjukkan momentum peningkatan, didorong oleh kekangan bekalan serta peningkatan permintaan. Pada Februari 2025, stok minyak sawit negara mencatatkan penurunan untuk bulan kelima berturut-turut, mencapai paras terendah dalam 22 bulan akibat kejatuhan pengeluaran yang ketara disebabkan oleh banjir, menurut Lembaga Minyak Sawit Malaysia.

Kepengerusian ASEAN-Malaysia 2025: Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia (DOSM) akan mempengerusikan Jawatankuasa Sistem Statistik Komuniti ASEAN Ke-15 (ACSS15) yang bertujuan untuk memperkukuh kerjasama statistik ke arah pembangunan serantau yang mampan.

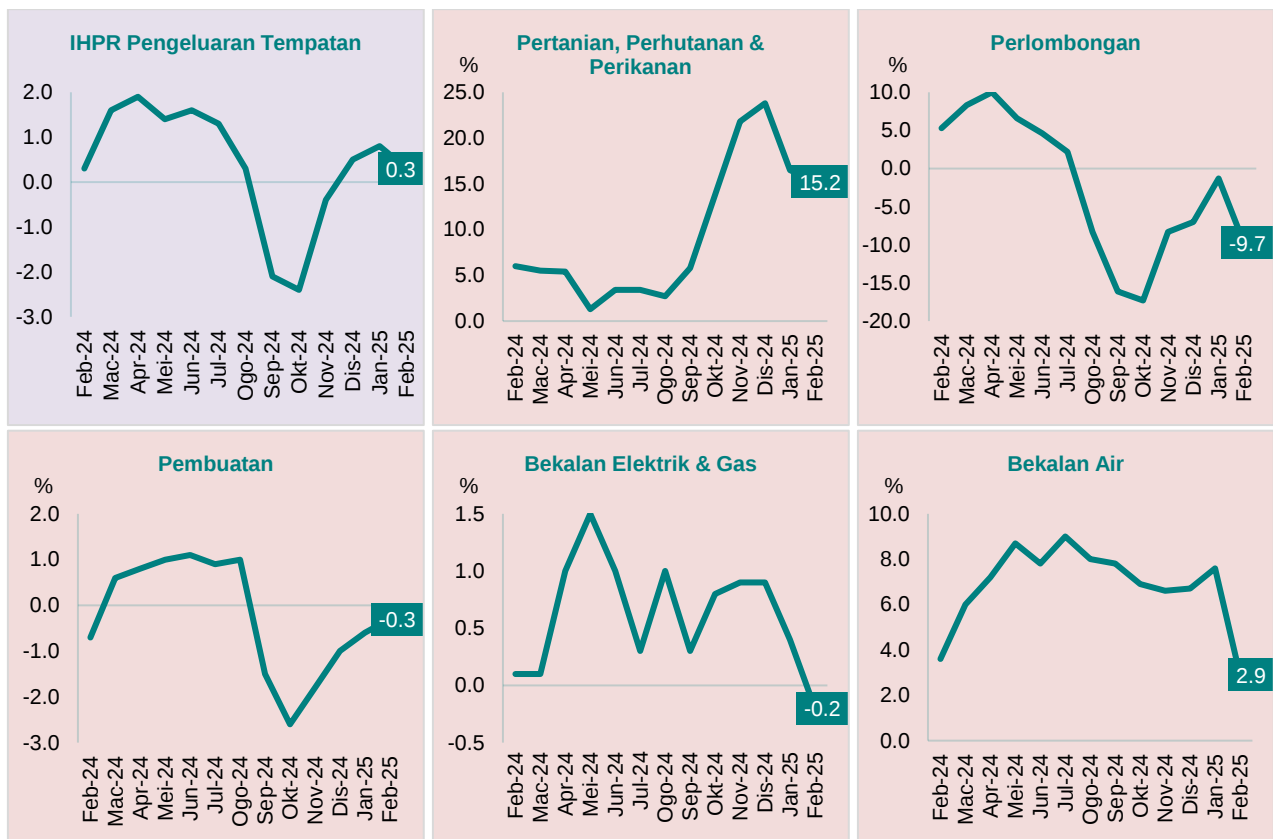

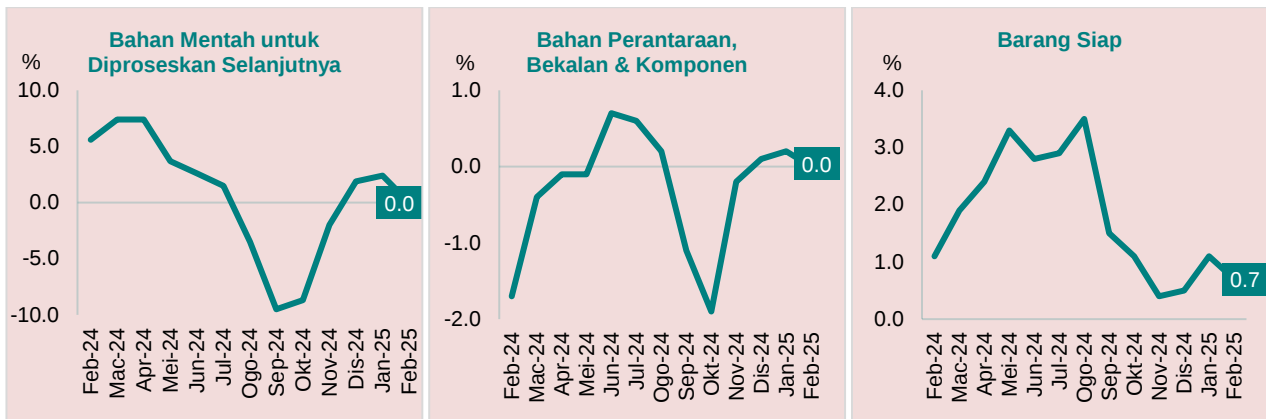
Carta 1: Peratus Perubahan Indeks Harga Pengeluar (IHPR) Pengeluaran Tempatan, Malaysia



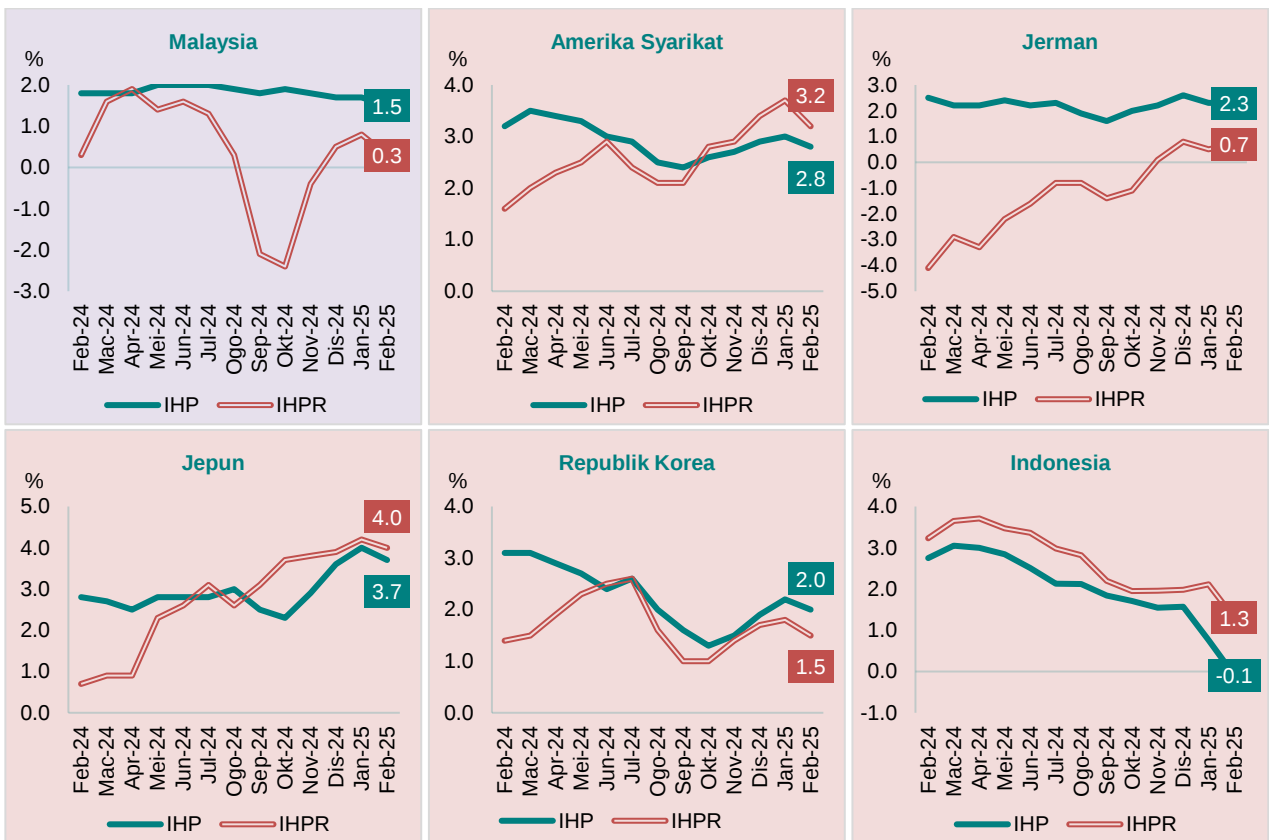

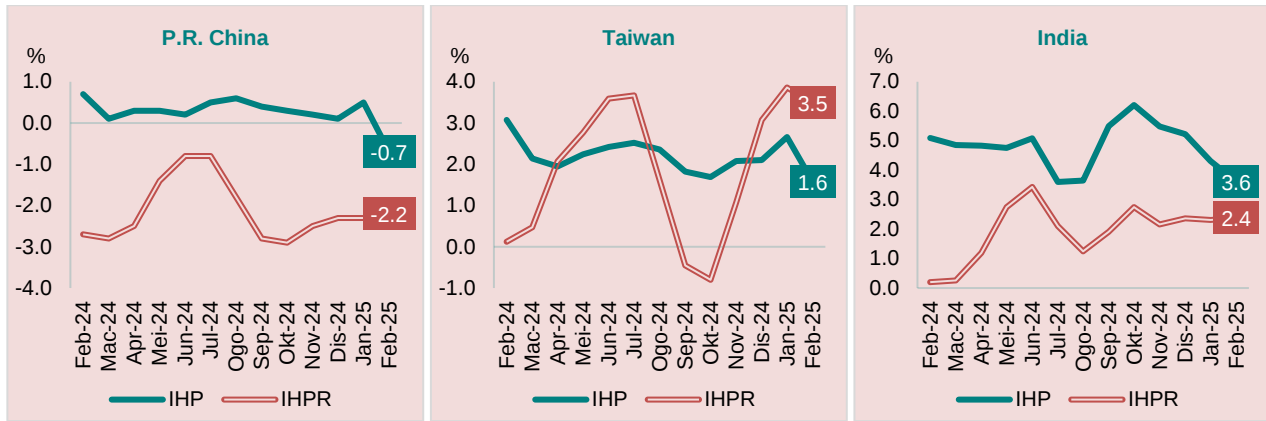

PRODUCER PRICE INDEX (PPI) LOCAL PRODUCTION, MALAYSIA FEBRUARY 2025

The Producer Price Index of Malaysia recorded a modest increase of 0.3 percent in February 2025

PUTRAJAYA, 27th March 2025 – Malaysia's Producer Price Index (PPI), which measures price changes at the producer level, recorded a year-on-year increase of 0.3 per cent in February 2025, easing from the 0.8 per cent rise registered in January 2025. The moderated increase was influenced by continued expansion in the Agriculture, forestry & fishing sector, despite a decline in the Mining sector. This was reported today, in the latest monthly report of ***PRODUCER PRICE INDEX (PPI) LOCAL PRODUCTION, FEBRUARY 2025***, published by the Department of Statistics Malaysia.

The Chief Statistician Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, highlighted, "The Agriculture, forestry & fishing sector remained the primary driver of PPI Local Production, recording a 15.2 per cent increase year-on-year, as compared to 16.5 per cent rise in January 2025. The Growing of perennial crops sub-sector led the growth, rising by 26.1 per cent. However, the Mining sector continued to contract, registering a decline of 9.7 percent (January 2024: -1.3%), with decreases in Extraction of crude petroleum (-9.8%) and Extraction of natural gas (-9.4%). The Manufacturing sector recorded a marginal decline of 0.3 per cent, from the previous month's contraction of 0.6 per cent. The largest downward was attributed to Manufacture of coke & refined petroleum products (-12.7%) and Manufacture of computer, electronic & optical products (-3.2%). Meanwhile, the Electricity & gas supply sector recorded a slight decline of 0.2 per cent, whereas the Water supply sector continued its positive trend with a 2.9 per cent increase."

Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin further explained, "On a month-on-month basis, PPI Local Production recorded a slight increase of 0.1 per cent in February 2025, easing from 0.3 per cent in January 2025. The Agriculture, forestry & fishing sector increased by 1.4 per cent from a decline of 3.9 per cent in the previous month, supported by an increase in Fishing (5.9%) and Growing of perennial crops (1.6%). The Manufacturing sector rising by 0.3 per cent maintaining the same pace as in the previous month, mainly due to Manufacture of coke & refined petroleum products (0.9%) and Manufacture of food products (0.7%). Conversely, the Mining sector declined by 3.2 per cent (January 2025: 5.3%), affected by decreases in Extraction of natural gas (-3.5%) and Extraction of crude petroleum (-3.2%). In the utilities sector, the Electricity & gas supply sector increased by 0.3 per cent, while the Water supply sector experienced a decline of 1.8 per cent."

Elaborating further on the PPI Local Production by stage of processing, the Chief Statistician Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, explained, "Crude materials for further processing and Intermediate materials, supplies & components indices remained unchanged on a year-on-year basis. Meanwhile, the Finished goods index recorded a slight increase of 0.7 per cent, supported the Capital equipment index (1.7%)."

On a month-on-month basis, both Crude materials for further processing index and Finished goods indices recorded a moderate increase of 0.3 per cent. However, the Intermediate materials, supplies & components index declined by 0.1 per cent.

A comparison of selected countries showed mixed trends in the PPI for February 2025. The United States' PPI increased by 3.2 per cent, slowing from the 3.7 per cent rise in the previous month. Japan's PPI also increased by 4.0 per cent, slightly lower than the 4.2 percent increase in January 2025, primarily driven by Transport equipment and Petroleum & coal sectors. In contrast, China's producer prices continued to decline by 2.2 per cent following a 2.3 per cent drop in the preceding two months. This marked the slowest decrease since August 2024. However, producer deflation persisted for the 29th consecutive month, influenced by commodity price fluctuations and the impact of the Lunar New Year break in late January 2025.

Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin provided insights into Malaysia's current selected commodity prices, noting that Brent crude averaged approximately \$75 per barrel in February 2025, down from \$79 per barrel in the previous month. This decline was attributed to expectations of higher supply from OPEC+ countries, which exerted downward pressure on prices. Meanwhile, the average price of crude palm oil (CPO) increased to RM4,759

per tonne, from RM4,673 per tonne in January 2025. Malaysia's CPO prices have shown upward momentum, driven by supply constraints and increased demand. In February 2025, the country's palm oil stocks fell for the fifth consecutive month, reaching a 22-month low due to a significant drop in production caused by flooding, according to Malaysian Palm Oil Board.

ASEAN-Malaysia 2025 Chairmanship: Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM) will chair the 15th ASEAN Community Statistical System Committee (ACSS15) which aims to strengthen the statistical cooperation towards sustainable regional development.

The Government of Malaysia has declared October 20th as National Statistics Day (MyStats Day), with the theme 'Statistics is the Essence of Life.' Meanwhile, the Fourth World Statistics Day will be celebrated on 20 October 2025, with the theme 'Driving Change with Quality Statistics and Data for Everyone'.

Chart 1: Percentage Change of Producer Price Index (PPI) Local Production, Malaysia

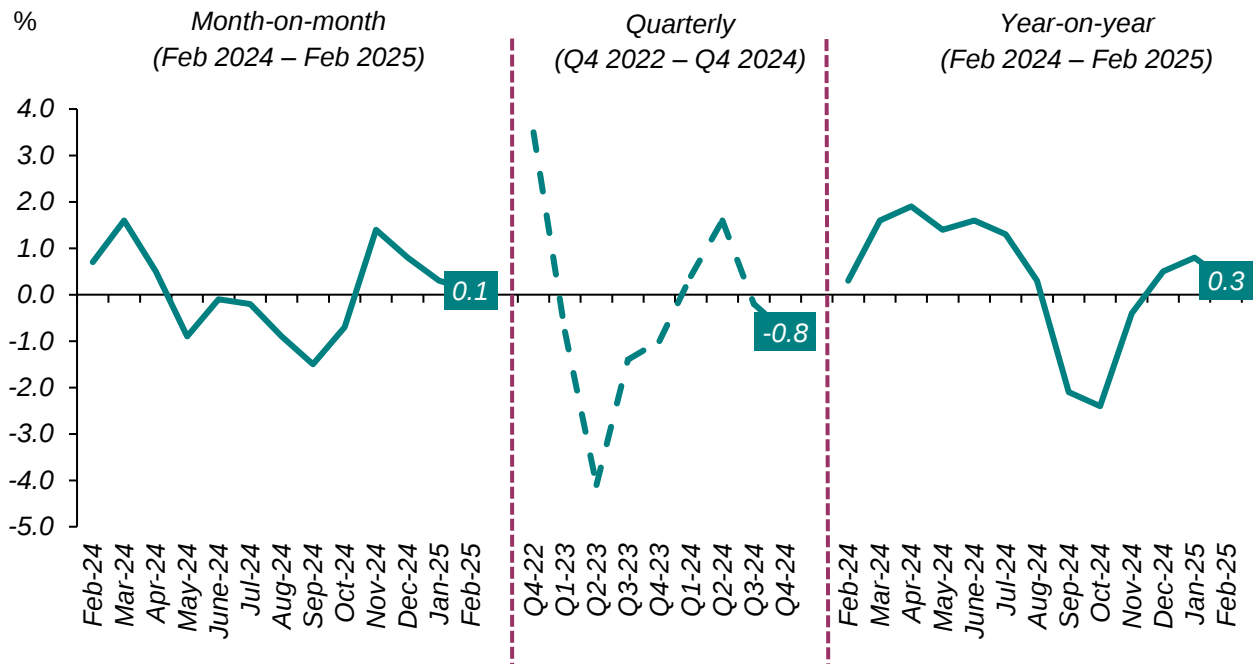


Chart 2: Percentage Change of Producer Price Index (PPI) Local Production by Sector (Year-on-Year), Malaysia

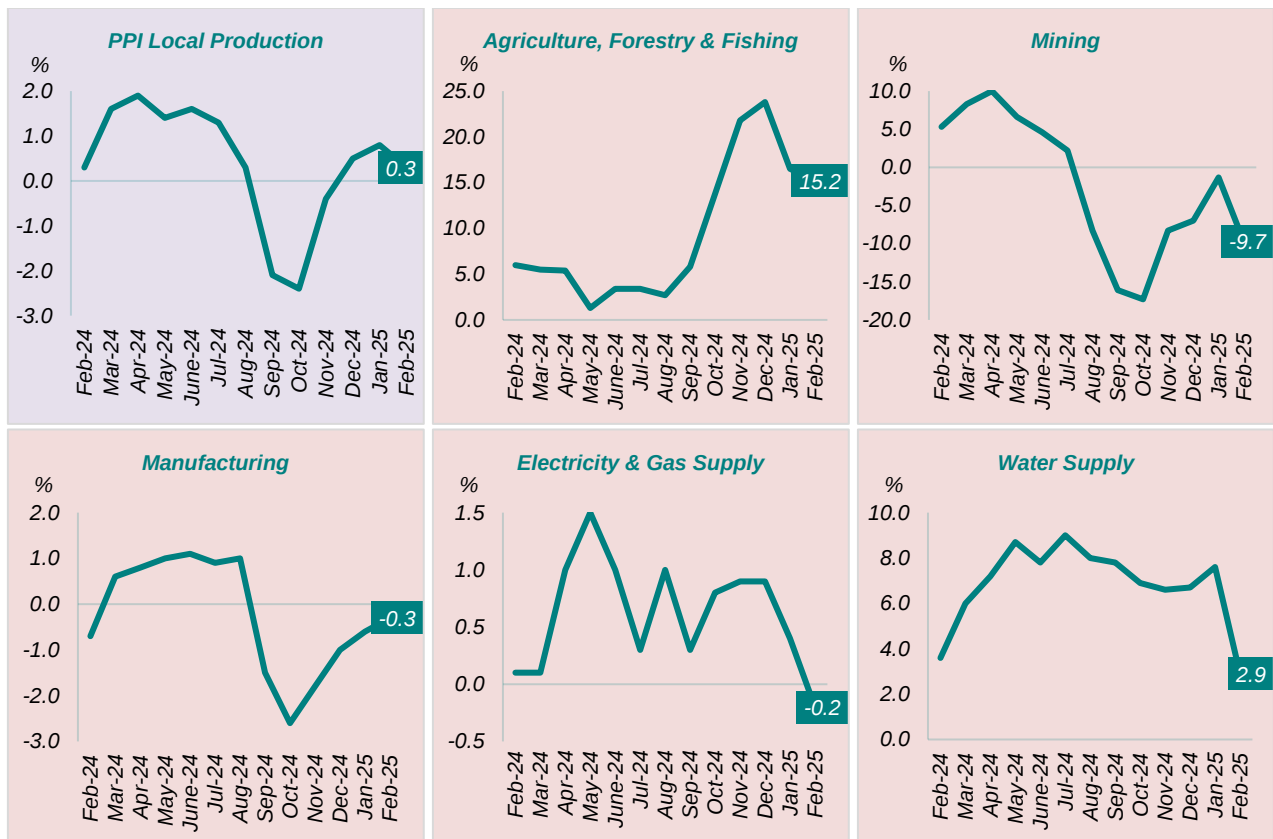


Chart 3: Percentage Change of Producer Price Index (PPI) Local Production by Stage of Processing (Year-on-Year), Malaysia

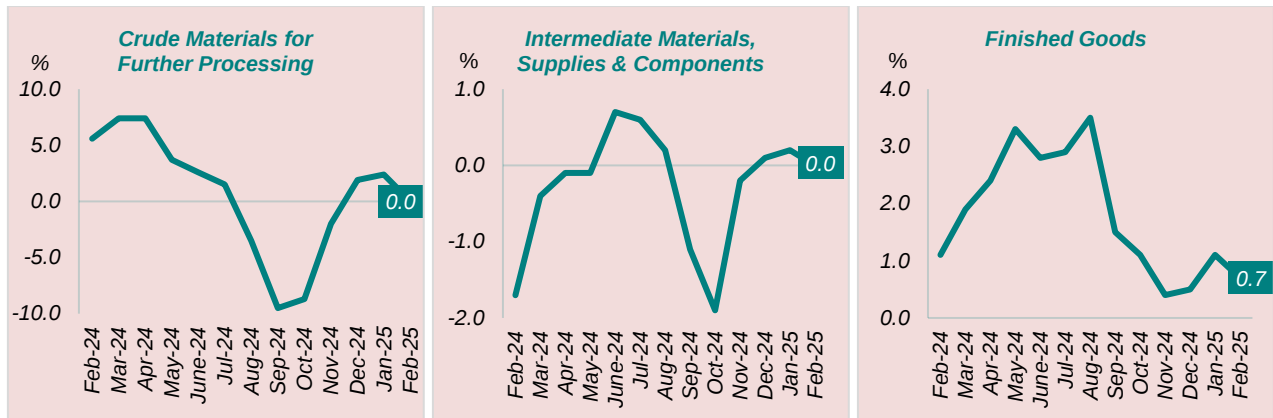
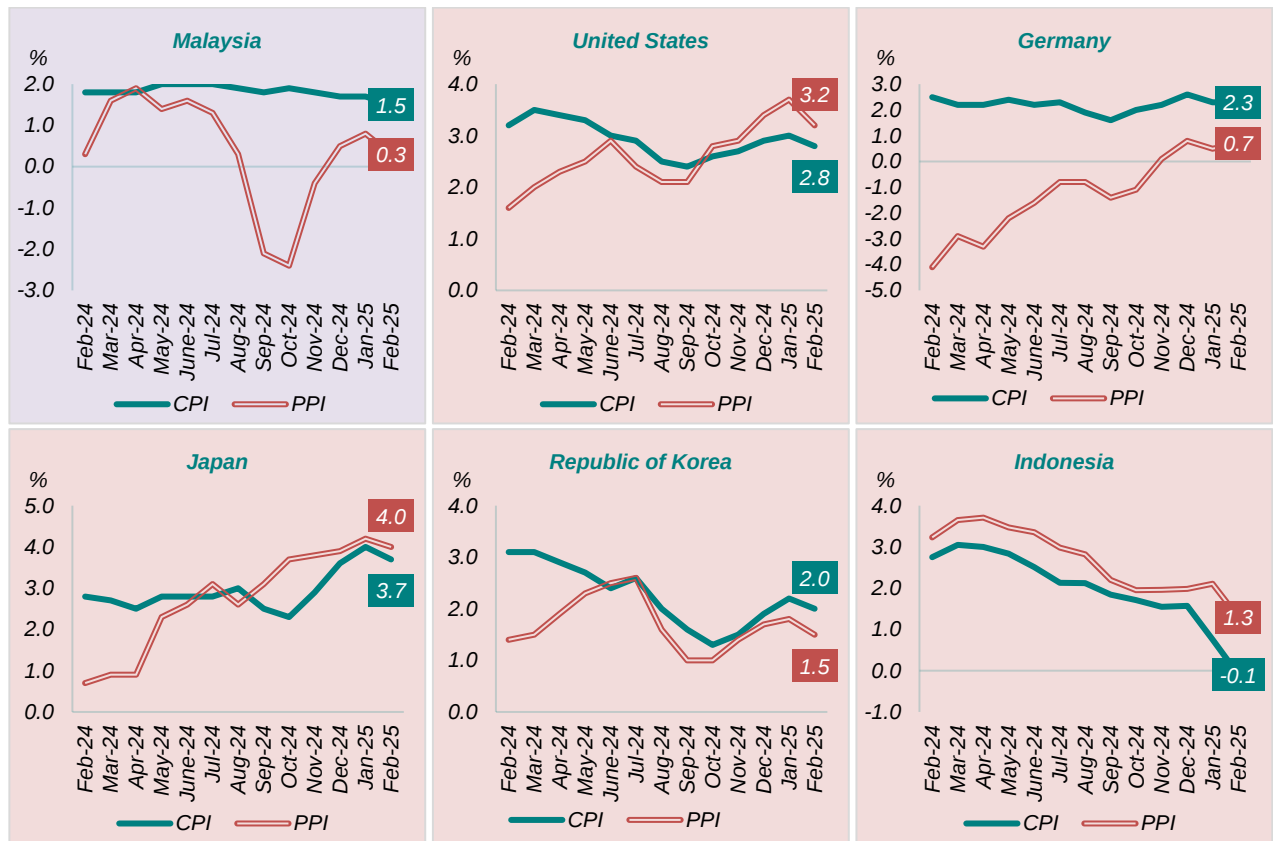
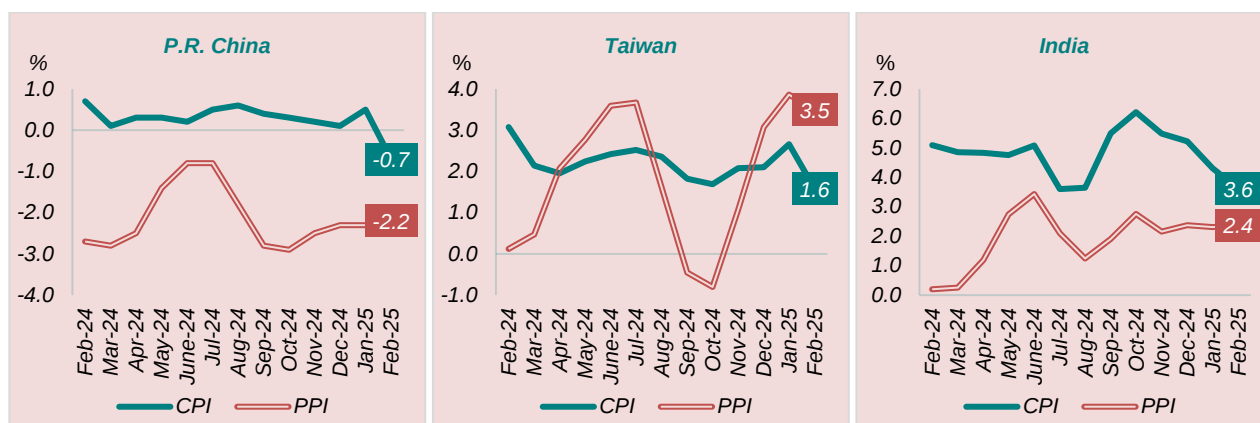


Chart 4: Percentage Change of Consumer Price Index (CPI) and Producer Price Index (PPI) of Selected Countries (Year-on-Year)
