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INDEKS PENGELUARAN PERINDUSTRIAN, MALAYSIA MAC 2025

Indeks Pengeluaran Perindustrian berkembang 3.2 peratus pada Mac 2025, dipacu pertumbuhan output sektor Pembuatan dan Perlombongan

PUTRAJAYA, 8 Mei 2025 – Indeks Pengeluaran Perindustrian pada Mac 2025 merekodkan pertumbuhan 3.2 peratus dipacu oleh pertumbuhan output sektor Pembuatan dan Perlombongan. Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia melaporkan dalam keluaran **Indeks Pengeluaran Perindustrian (IPP), Malaysia, Mac 2025** pada hari ini. Penerbitan ini memaparkan statistik IPP yang terdiri daripada tiga sektor iaitu Perlombongan, Pembuatan dan Elektrik.

Menurut Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, "Peningkatan IPP kepada 3.2 peratus pada Mac 2025 disumbangkan oleh pertumbuhan output sektor Pembuatan dan Perlombongan masing-masing merekodkan pada kadar 4.0 peratus dan 1.9 peratus. Manakala, pengeluaran output sektor Elektrik masih berada dalam jajaran negatif pada kadar 2.7 peratus. Dari sudut perbandingan bulanan, IPP mencatatkan peningkatan sebanyak 9.3 peratus (Februari 2025: -6.8%).

Peningkatan dalam pengeluaran sektor Pembuatan pada Mac 2025 disokong oleh pengeluaran dalam industri berorientasikan eksport yang tumbuh kepada 4.8 peratus berbanding 5.7 peratus yang direkodkan pada Februari 2025. Pertumbuhan ini didokong terutamanya oleh pertumbuhan dalam industri Pembuatan komputer, produk elektronik dan optikal yang mencatatkan peningkatan 9.0 peratus; diikuti oleh Pembuatan minyak dan lemak daripada sayuran dan haiwan (10.6%). Selain itu, Pembuatan kimia dan produk kimia turut menyumbang pada kadar 4.9 peratus.

Tambahan pula, industri berorientasikan eksport berkembang sebanyak 10.1 peratus berbanding bulan sebelumnya (Februari 2025: -5.6%).

Industri berorientasikan domestik berkembang 2.3 peratus pada Mac 2025 berbanding pertumbuhan 2.9 peratus yang direkodkan pada bulan sebelumnya. Peningkatan positif ini disumbangkan oleh Pembuatan produk prosesan makanan (7.8%); Pembuatan produk logam yang direka, kecuali mesin dan kelengkapan (4.2%); dan Pembuatan produk galian bukan logam lain (3.7%). Berbanding bulan sebelumnya, industri berorientasikan domestik meningkat 1.3 peratus.”

Mengulas mengenai prestasi sektor Perlombongan, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin berkata, “Pertumbuhan 1.9 peratus dalam sektor Perlombongan pada Mac 2025 adalah didorong oleh peningkatan pengeluaran output Petroleum Mentah & Kondensat dan pengeluaran output Gas Asli yang masing – masing mencatatkan peningkatan sebanyak 2.2 peratus dan 1.8 peratus. Dari sudut perbandingan bulanan, indeks Perlombongan meningkat kepada 17.8 peratus berbanding negatif 12.5 peratus yang dicatatkan pada Februari 2025.”

Sementara itu, indeks Elektrik kekal pada kadar negatif 2.7 peratus pada Mac 2025 berbanding negatif 2.8 peratus yang direkodkan pada bulan lalu. Secara perbandingan bulan ke bulan, indeks Elektrik meningkat kepada 11.2 peratus.

Di peringkat global, IPP bagi beberapa negara lain menunjukkan trend penurunan pada Mac 2025, termasuk Taiwan (13.6%), Vietnam (9.3%), Korea Selatan (5.3%), Amerika Syarikat (1.3%) dan Jepun (-0.3%). Sebaliknya, China (7.7%), Singapura (5.8%) dan Thailand (-0.7%) menunjukkan peningkatan yang memberangsangkan pada Mac 2025.

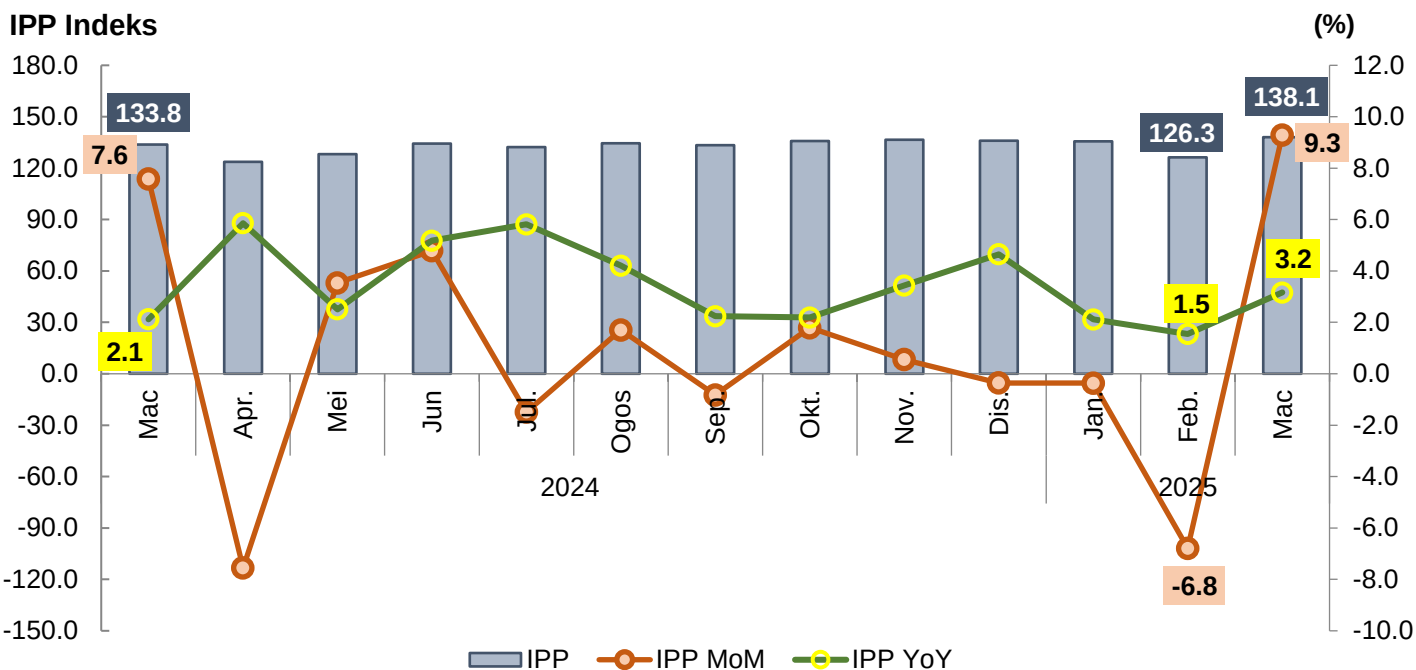
Secara keseluruhan, pada suku tahun pertama 2025, IPP merekodkan pertumbuhan perlahan 2.3 peratus berbanding 3.4 peratus yang direkodkan pada suku tahun keempat 2024. Pertumbuhan ini disumbangkan oleh sektor Pembuatan dengan pertumbuhan 4.2 peratus. Selain itu, IPP bagi sektor Perlombongan dan Elektrik masing-masing merekodkan penurunan 3.3 peratus dan 1.9 peratus. Dalam perbandingan suku ke suku, IPP merekodkan negatif 2.1 peratus.

Kepengerusian ASEAN-Malaysia 2025: Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia (DOSM) akan mempengerusikan Jawatankuasa Sistem Statistik Komuniti ASEAN Ke-15 (ACSS15) yang bertujuan untuk memperkukuh kerjasama statistik ke arah pembangunan serantau yang mampan.

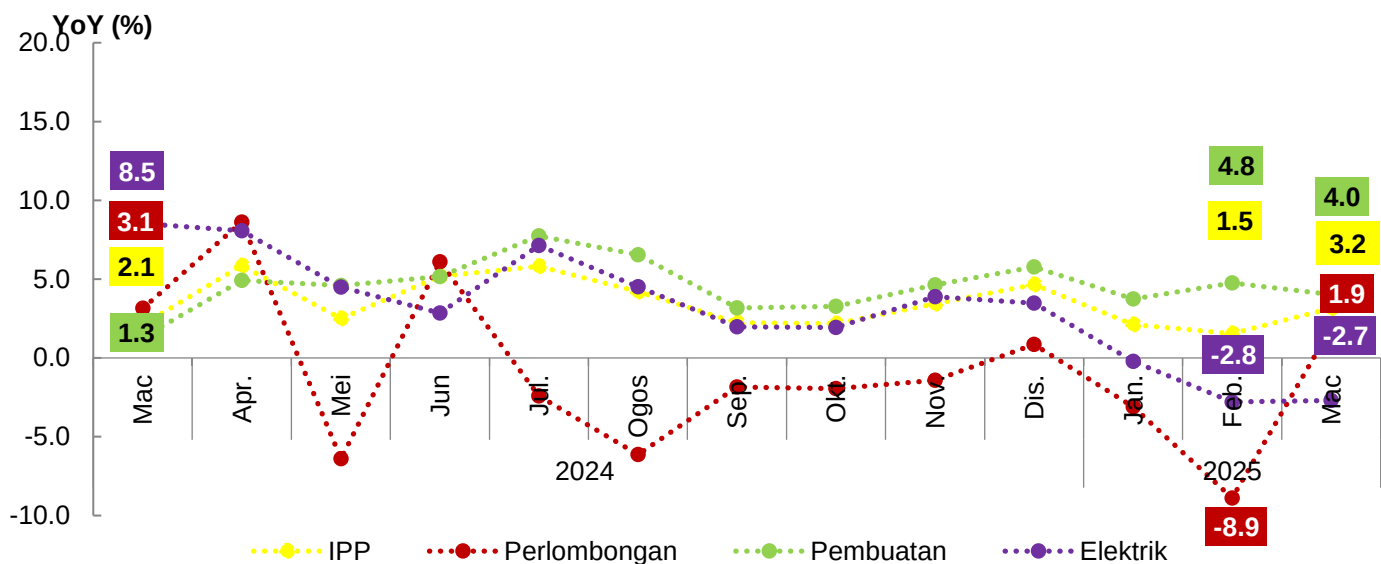

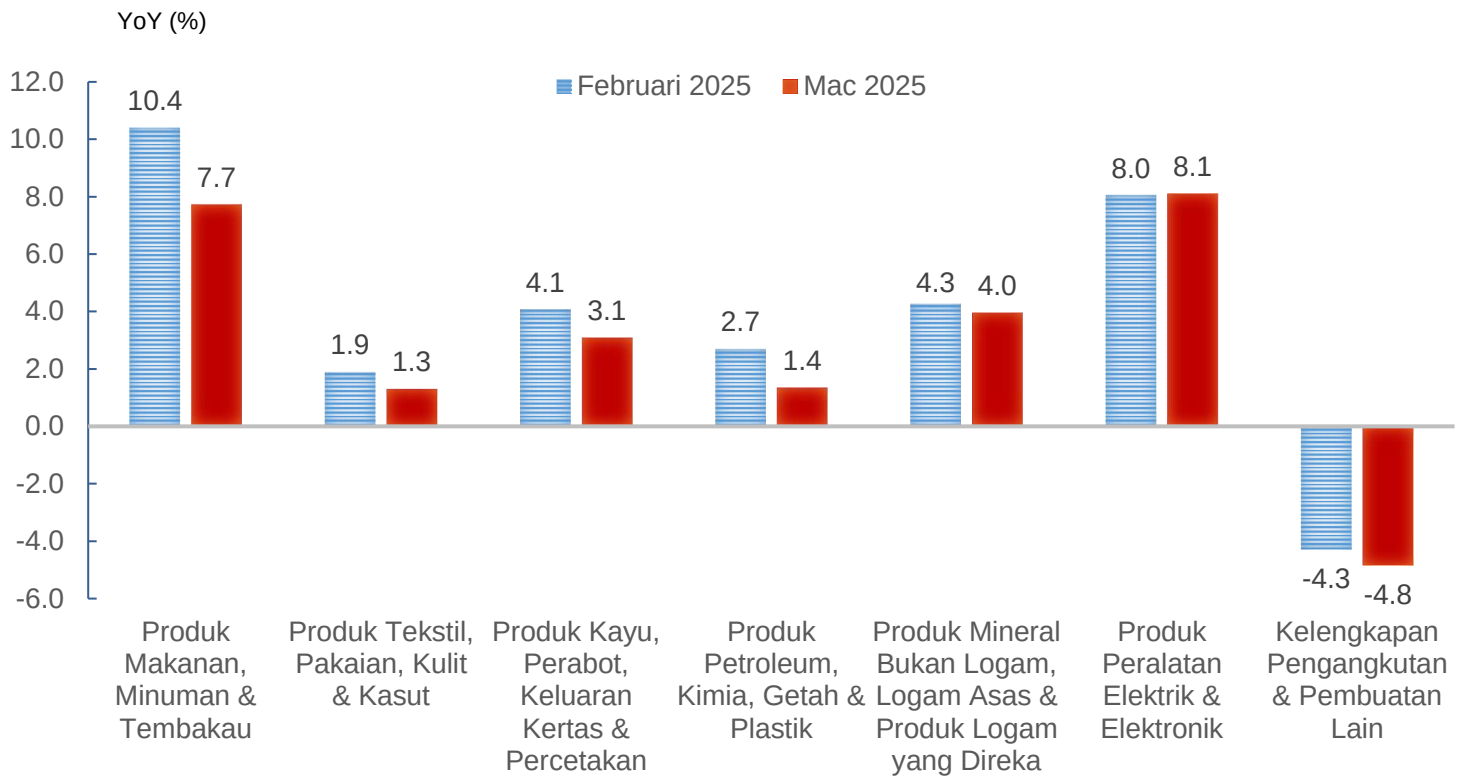
**Carta 1: Indeks Pengeluaran Perindustrian, Malaysia,
Mac 2024 – Mac 2025**



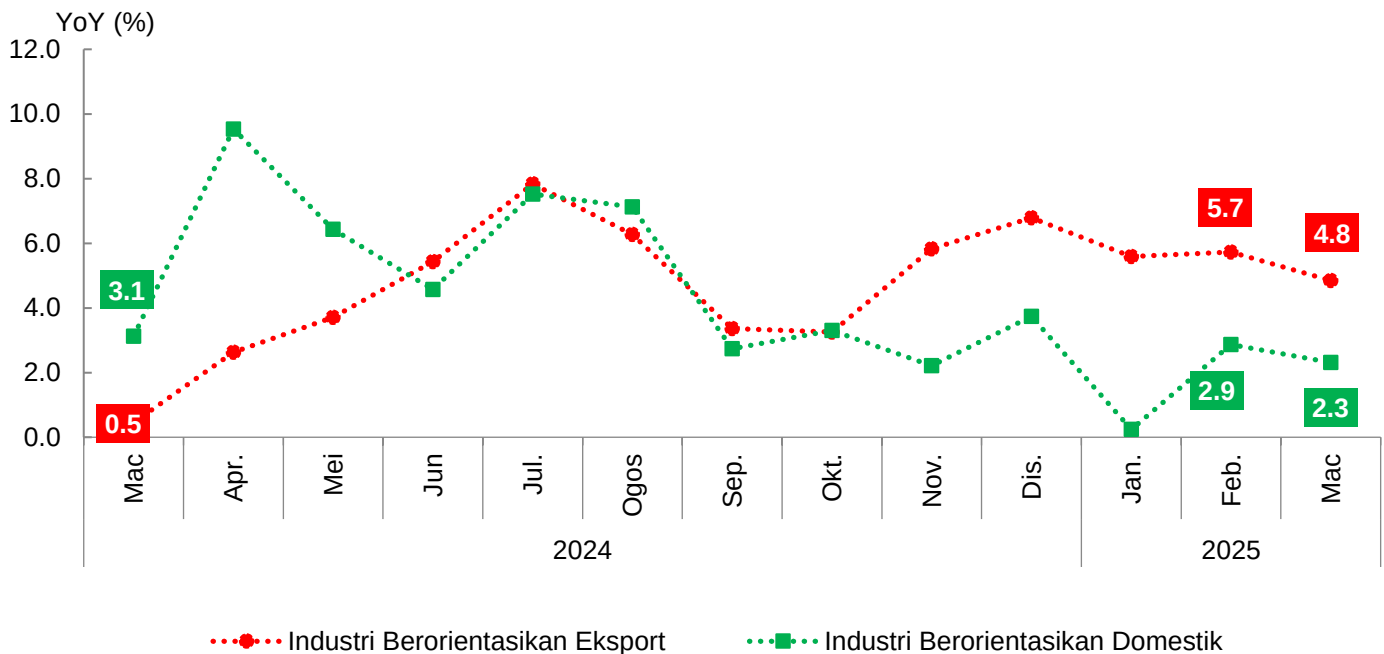
**Carta 2: Indeks Pengeluaran Perindustrian dan Komponennya, Malaysia
Mac 2024 - Mac 2025**



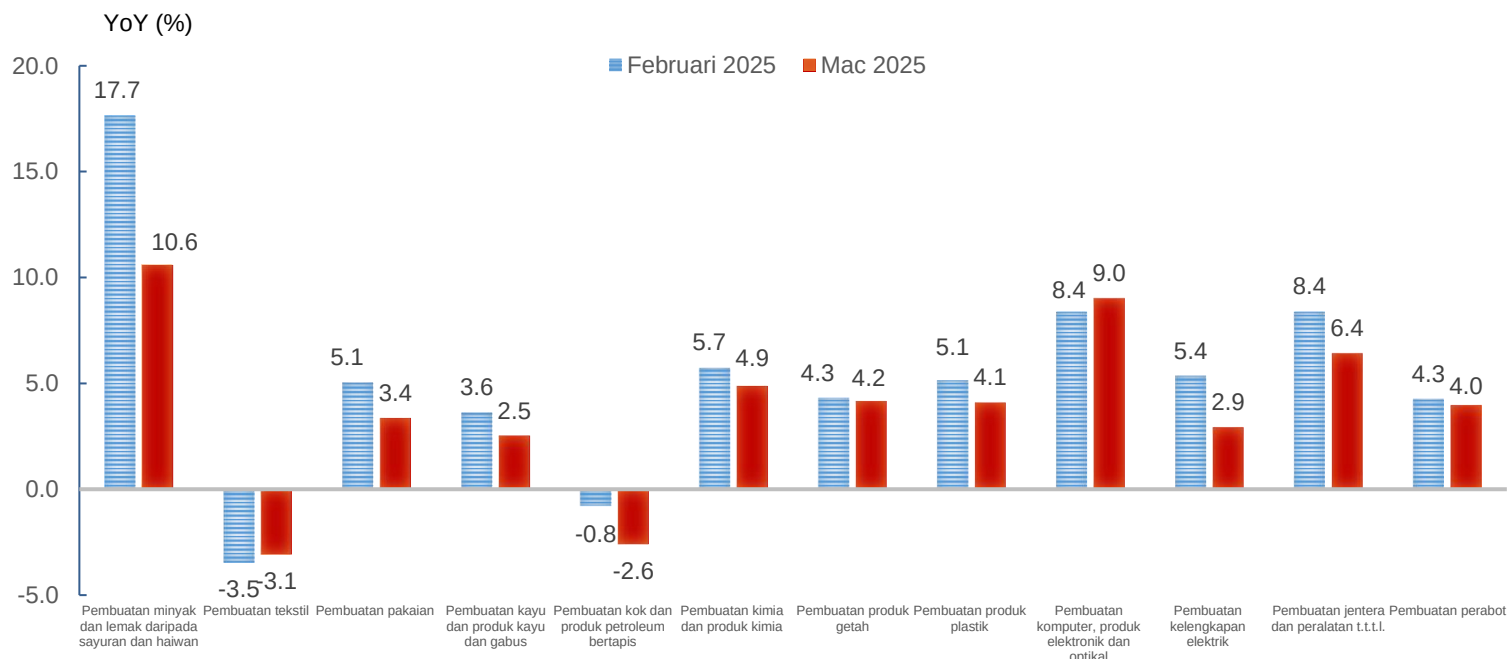
**Carta 3: Pertumbuhan Indeks Pembuatan Mengikut Subsektor, Malaysia
Februari 2025 dan Mac 2025**



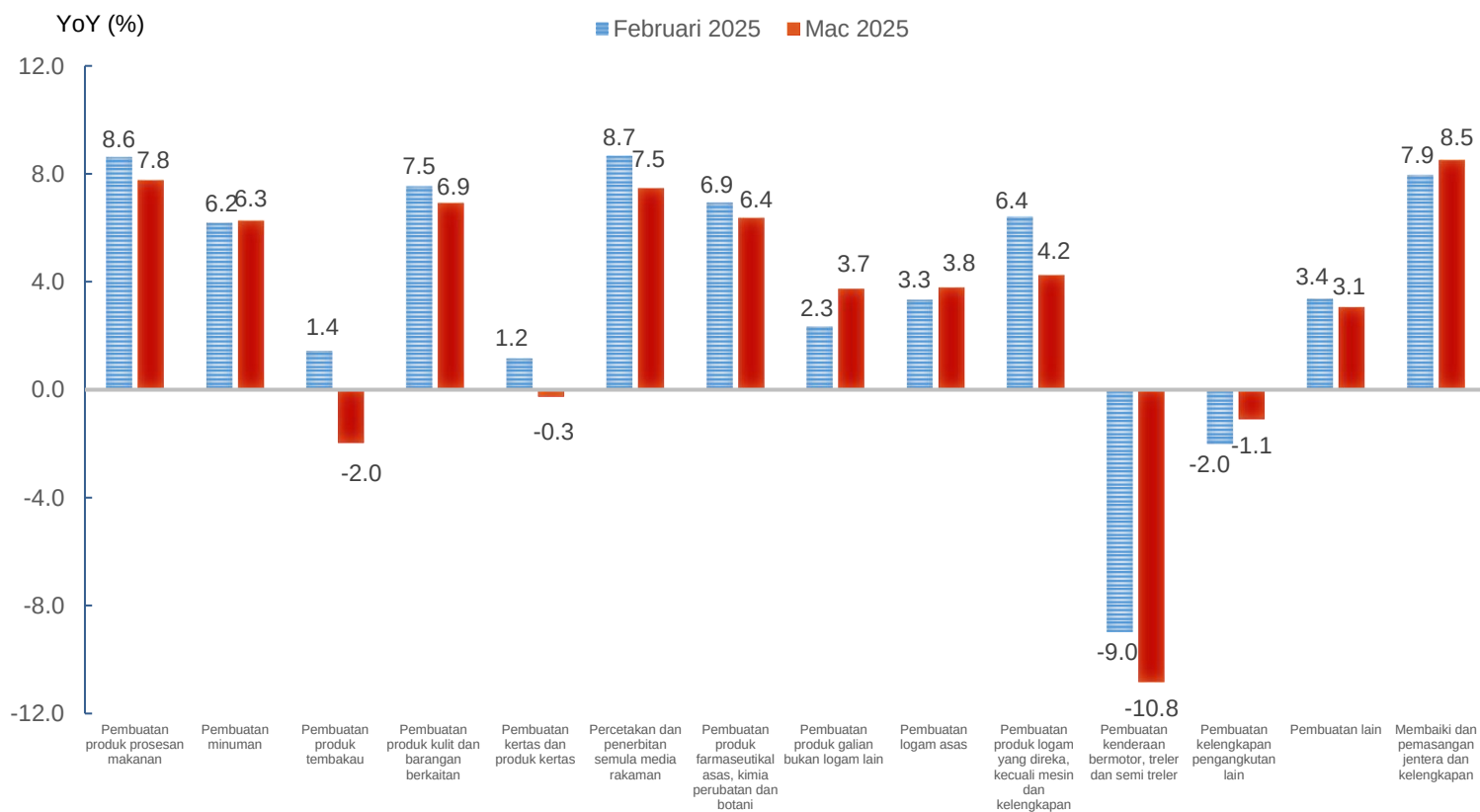

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INDEX OF INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION MALAYSIA MARCH 2025

Industrial Production Index grew 3.2 per cent in March 2025, driven by output growth of the Manufacturing and Mining sectors

PUTRAJAYA, 8 May 2025 – The Industrial Production Index in March 2025 recorded a growth of 3.2 per cent driven by the output growth of the Manufacturing and Mining sectors. The Department of Statistics Malaysia reported in the publication of the **Industrial Production Index (IPP), Malaysia, March 2025** today. This publication displays IPP statistics consisting of three sectors, namely Mining, Manufacturing, and Electricity.

According to the Chief Statistician of Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, "The increase in IPP to 3.2 per cent in March 2025 was contributed by the output growth of the Manufacturing and Mining sectors, which recorded 4.0 per cent and 1.9 per cent respectively. Meanwhile, the output production of the Electricity sector remained in the negative range at a rate of 2.7 per cent. In terms of monthly comparison, the IPP recorded an increase of 9.3 per cent (February 2025: -6.8%).

The increase in Manufacturing sector production in March 2025 was supported by production in export-oriented industries which grew to 4.8 per cent compared to 5.7 per cent recorded in February 2025. This growth was primarily underpinned by growth in the Manufacture of computer, electronic and optical products which recorded an increase of 9.0 per cent; followed by the Manufacture of oils and fats from vegetables and animals (10.6%). Moreover, the Manufacture of chemicals and chemical products

also contributed at a rate of 4.9 per cent. In addition, export-oriented industries grew by 10.1 per cent compared to the previous month (February 2025: -5.6%).

Domestic-oriented industries grew 2.3 per cent in March 2025 compared to the growth of 2.9 per cent recorded in the previous month. This positive increase was contributed by the Manufacture of food processing products (7.8%); Manufacture of fabricated metal products, except machinery and equipment (4.2%); and Manufacture of other non-metallic mineral products (3.7%). Compared to the previous month, domestic-oriented industries increased by 1.3 per cent."

Commenting on the performance of the Mining sector, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin said, "The 1.9 per cent growth in the Mining sector in March 2025 was driven by the increase in the output of Crude Petroleum & Condensate and the output of Natural Gas, which respectively recorded increases of 2.2 per cent and 1.8 per cent. In terms of monthly comparison, the Mining index increased to 17.8 per cent compared to negative 12.5 per cent recorded in February 2025."

Meanwhile, the Electricity index remained at a negative rate of 2.7 per cent in March 2025 compared to the negative 2.8 per cent recorded last month. On a month-on-month comparison, the Electricity index increased to 11.2 per cent.

Globally, the IPP for several other countries showed a downward trend in March 2025, including Taiwan (13.6%), Vietnam (9.3%), South Korea (5.3%), the United States (1.3%) and Japan (-0.3%). In contrast, China (7.7%), Singapore (5.8%) and Thailand (-0.7%) showed encouraging increases in March 2025.

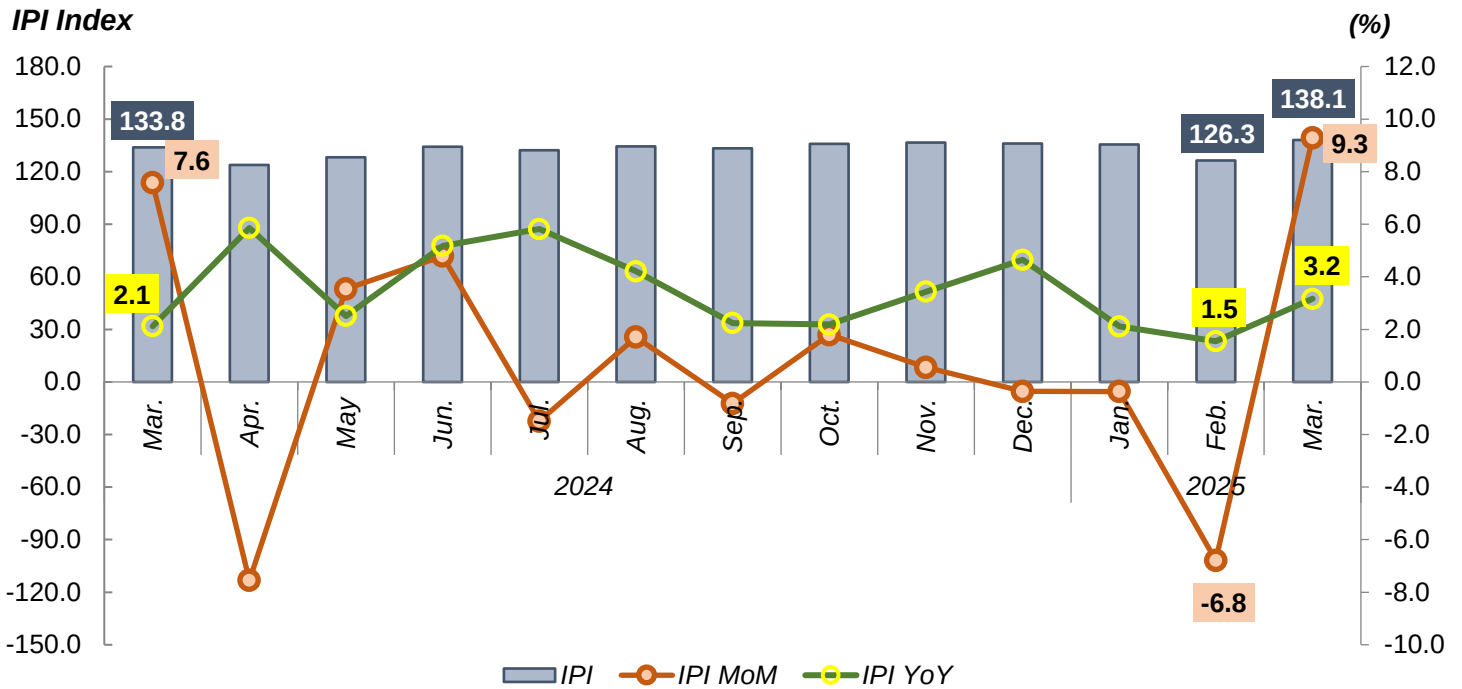
Overall, in the first quarter of 2025, the IPP recorded a slower growth of 2.3 per cent compared to the 3.4 per cent recorded in the fourth quarter of 2024. This growth was contributed by the Manufacturing sector with a growth of 4.2 per cent. In addition, the IPP for the Mining and Electricity sectors respectively recorded decreases of 3.3 per cent and 1.9 per cent. In quarterly comparison, the IPP recorded negative 2.1 per cent.

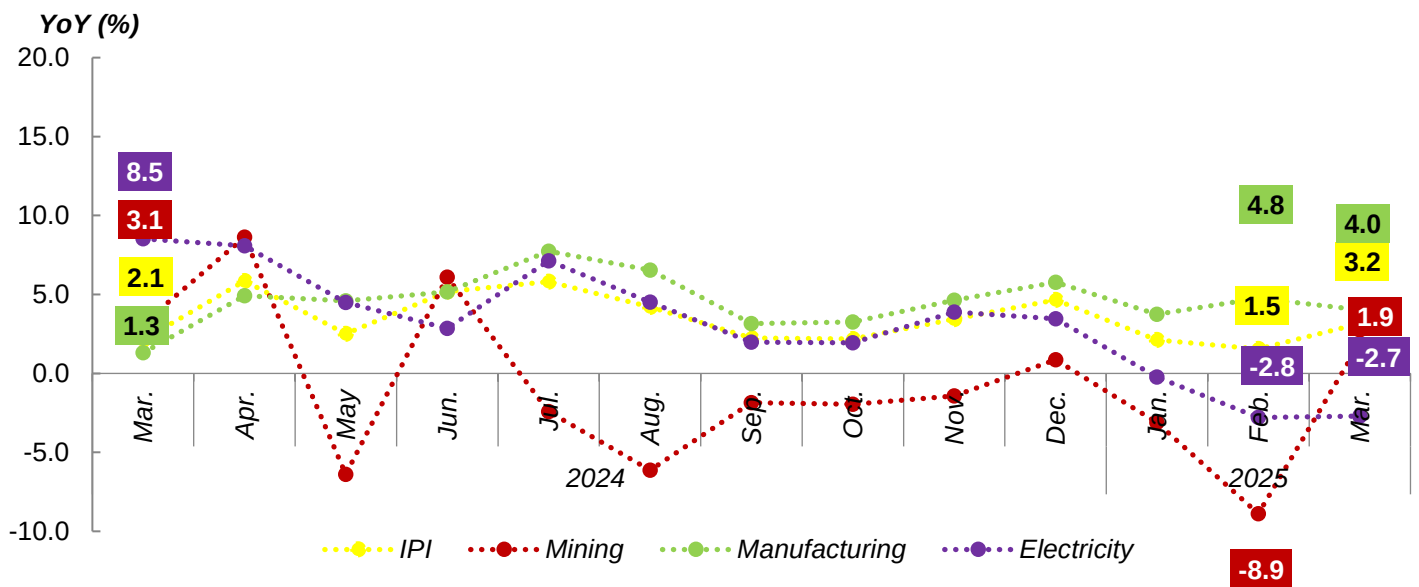

February 2025 and March 2025**

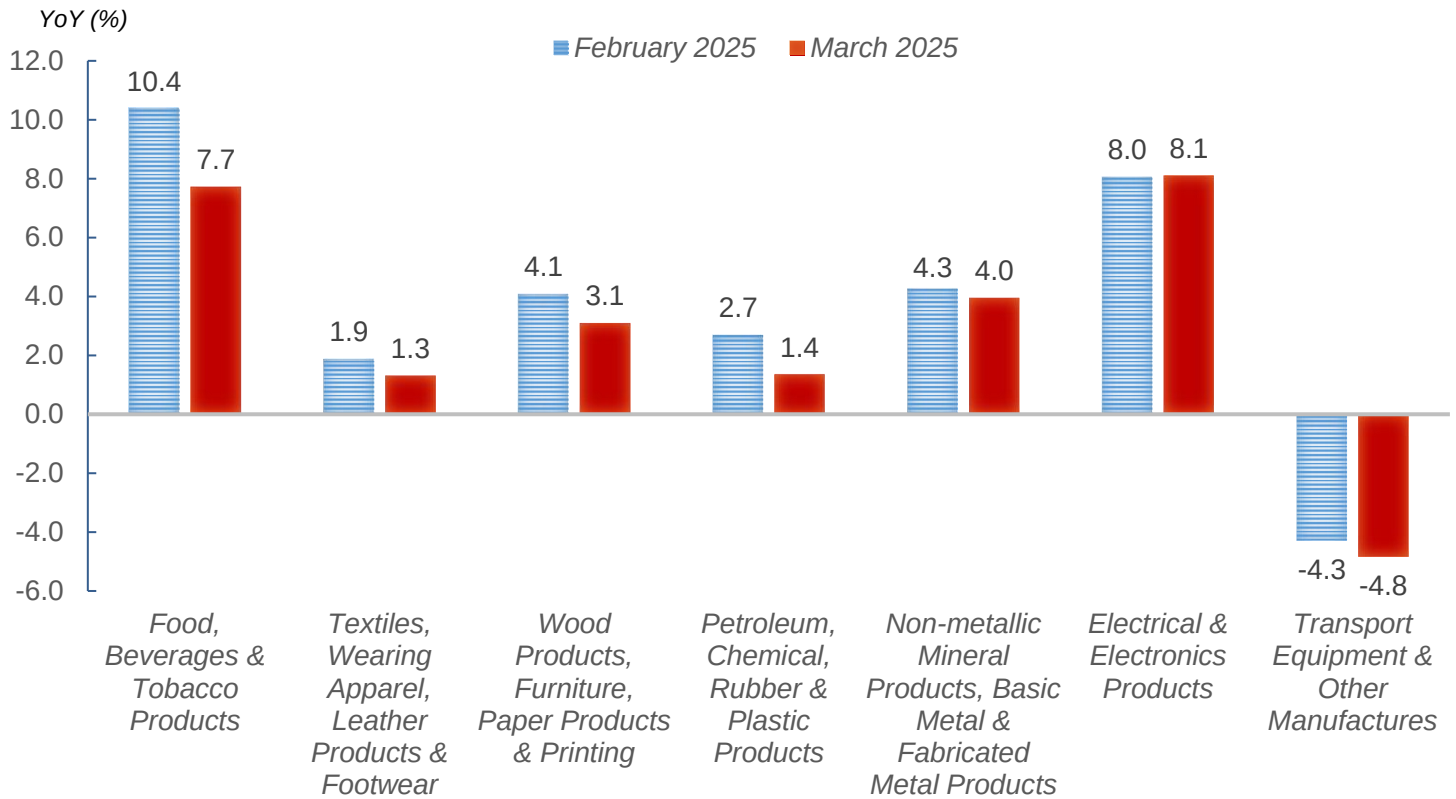
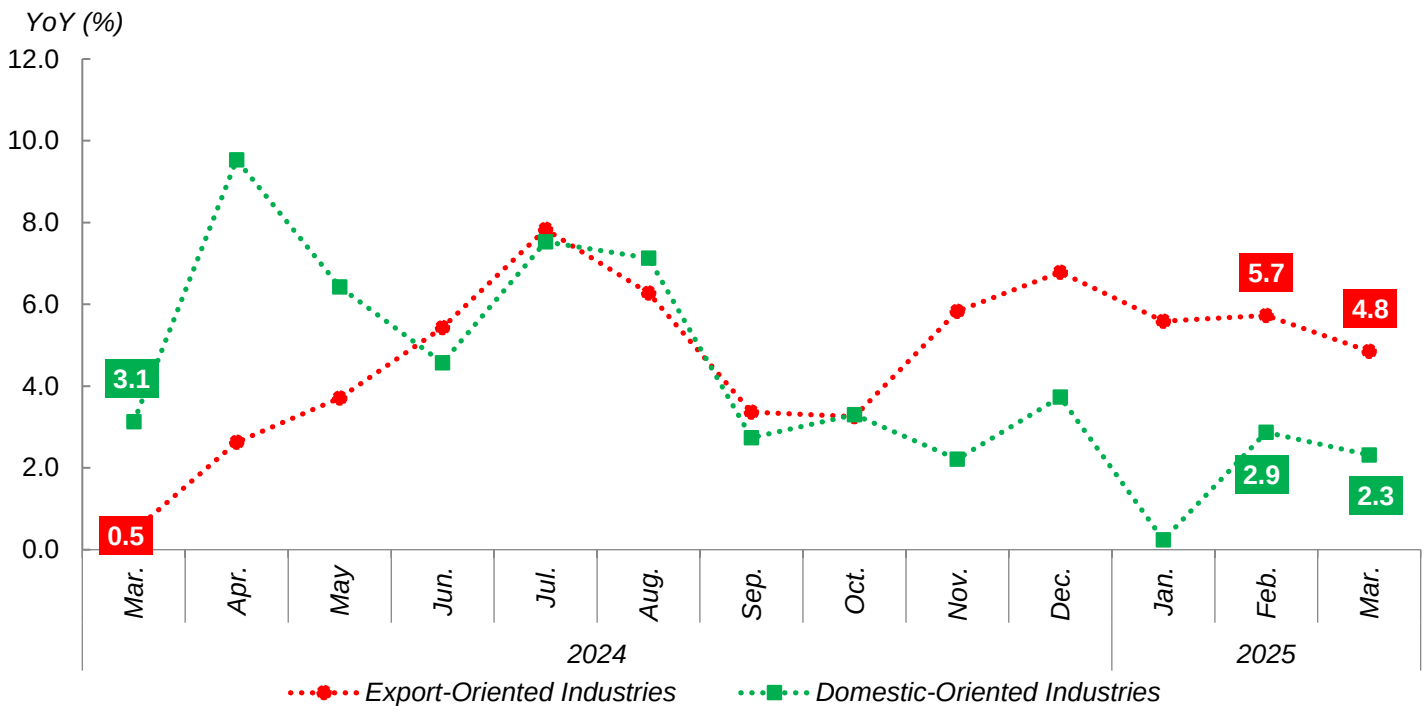
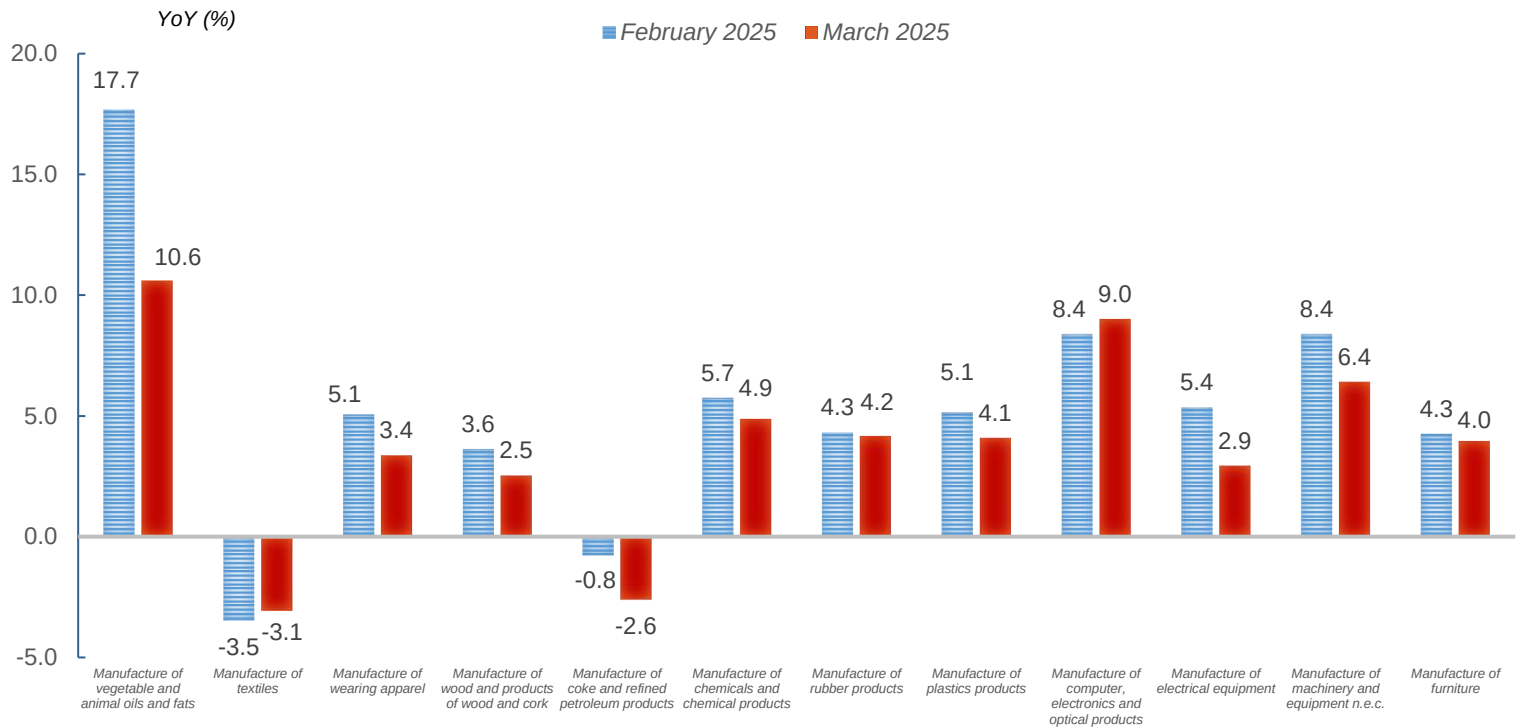


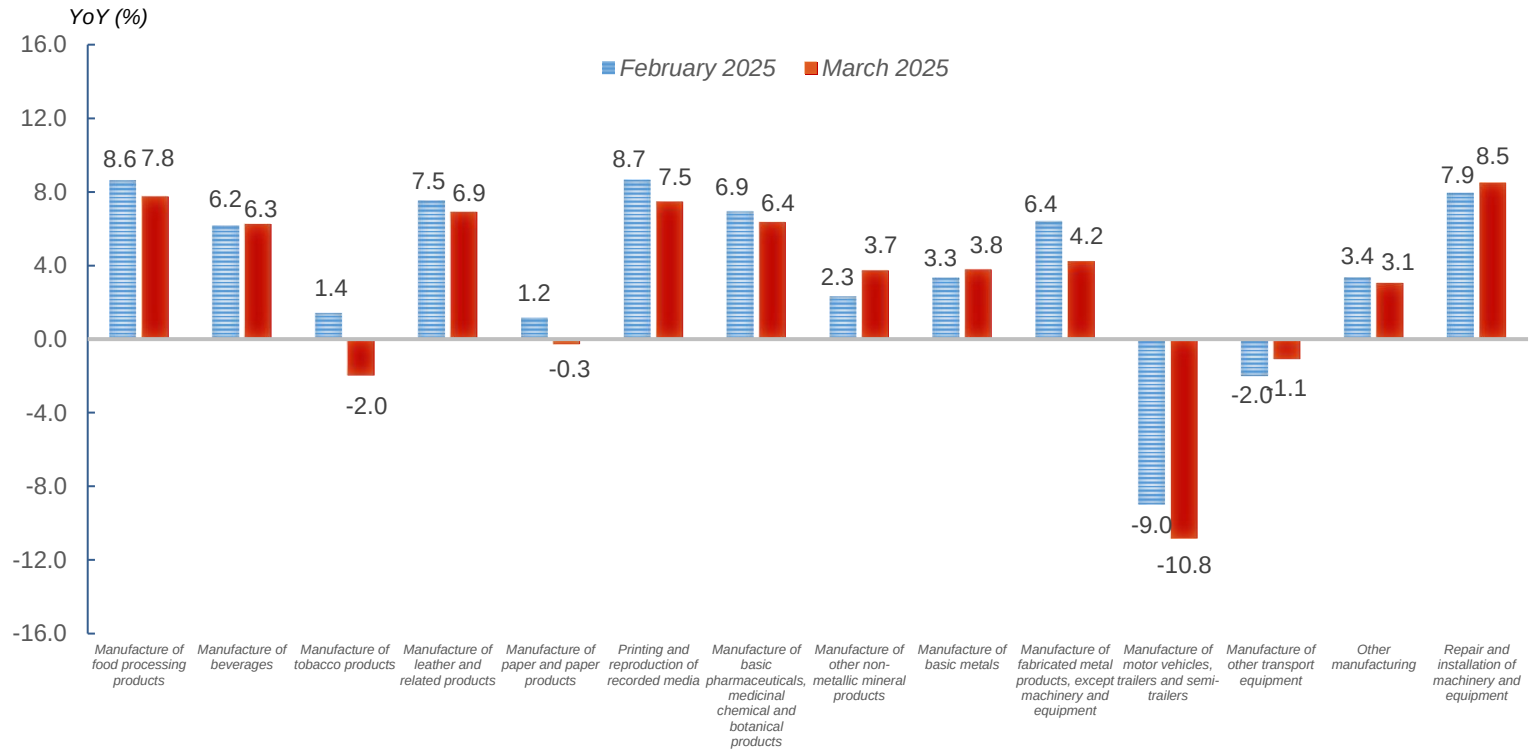
Chart 4: Manufacturing Index by Export and Domestic Oriented Industries, Malaysia, March 2024 – March 2025
