Pengeluaran getah asli Malaysia meningkat 5.9 peratus pada Jun 2025

PUTRAJAYA, 12 Ogos 2025 – Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia (DOSM) telah menerbitkan **Perangkaan Getah Bulanan, Malaysia, Jun 2025**. Penerbitan ini memaparkan statistik pengeluaran, import, eksport, penggunaan domestik, stok, harga, bilangan pekerja, gaji & upah dan produktiviti bagi estet getah.

Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin berkata, pengeluaran getah asli meningkat 5.9 peratus pada Jun 2025 (25,679 tan metrik) berbanding pada Mei 2025 (24,256 tan metrik). Perbandingan tahun ke tahun menunjukkan pengeluaran getah asli menurun 14.1 peratus (Jun 2024: 29,881 tan metrik). Pengeluaran getah asli Malaysia pada Jun 2025 disumbangkan terutamanya oleh sektor pekebun kecil (84.7%) berbanding sektor estet (15.3%).

Jumlah stok getah asli pada Jun 2025 menurun 11.4 peratus kepada 164,189 tan metrik berbanding 185,324 tan metrik pada Mei 2025. Kilang pemproses getah menyumbang stok akhir sebanyak 85.2 peratus diikuti kilang pengguna getah (14.7%) dan estet getah (0.1%).

Eksport getah asli Malaysia berjumlah 29,719 tan metrik pada Jun 2025, menurun 17.3 peratus berbanding Mei 2025 (35,939 tan metrik). China terus kekal sebagai destinasi utama untuk eksport getah asli iaitu menyumbang 33.9 peratus daripada jumlah keseluruhan eksport pada Jun 2025 diikuti Jerman (18.1%), Emiriah Arab Bersatu (9.6%), Amerika Syarikat (7.3%) dan India (3.8%). Prestasi eksport

disumbangkan oleh produk berasaskan getah asli seperti sarung tangan getah, tayar, tiub dan benang getah. Produk sarung tangan getah merupakan eksport utama dengan nilai sebanyak RM1.2 billion pada Jun 2025, menurun 1.7 peratus berbanding Mei 2025 (RM1.3 billion).

Analisis perbandingan harga purata bulanan menunjukkan Lateks Pekat merekodkan penurunan iaitu 9.0 peratus (Jun 2025: 558.66 sen sekilogram; Mei 2025: 613.80 sen sekilogram) manakala Sekerap menurun sebanyak 7.0 peratus (Jun 2025: 564.13 sen sekilogram; Mei 2025: 606.67 sen sekilogram). Trend harga bagi semua jenis Getah Mutu Malaysia (G.M.M) pula menunjukkan penurunan antara 8.9 peratus dan 10.7 peratus. *The World Bank Commodity Price Data* melaporkan harga bagi getah jenis TSR 20 (*Technically Specified Rubber*) menurun 5.4 peratus daripada USD1.70/kg kepada USD1.61/kg dan SGP/MYS (Singapura/Malaysia) menurun 1.5 peratus daripada USD2.19/kg kepada USD2.16/kg.

Prestasi suku kedua 2025 menunjukkan pengeluaran getah asli menurun 28.6 peratus kepada 67,943 tan metrik berbanding 95,101 tan metrik pada suku pertama 2025. Prestasi pertumbuhan tahunan pengeluaran getah asli Malaysia pada suku kedua 2025 pula mencatatkan penurunan 11.5 peratus berbanding suku kedua 2024 (76,814 tan metrik).

Menurut *Malaysia Rubber Board Digest* keluaran Jun 2025, Pasaran Getah Kuala Lumpur dibuka bercampur-campur sepanjang Jun 2025 dengan harga SMR 20 meningkat sedikit disokong oleh aliran menaik dalam pasaran niaga hadapan getah serantau di tengah-tengah peningkatan kebimbangan terhadap bekalan bahan mentah getah asli yang semakin berkurangan berikutan keadaan cuaca buruk di negara pengeluar utama Thailand. Sentimen pasaran meningkat oleh data ekonomi China yang positif ditambah pula dengan unjuran optimis oleh Persatuan Negara Pengeluar Getah Asli (ANRPC) mengenai permintaan getah asli (NR) dan kenaikan harga minyak mentah.

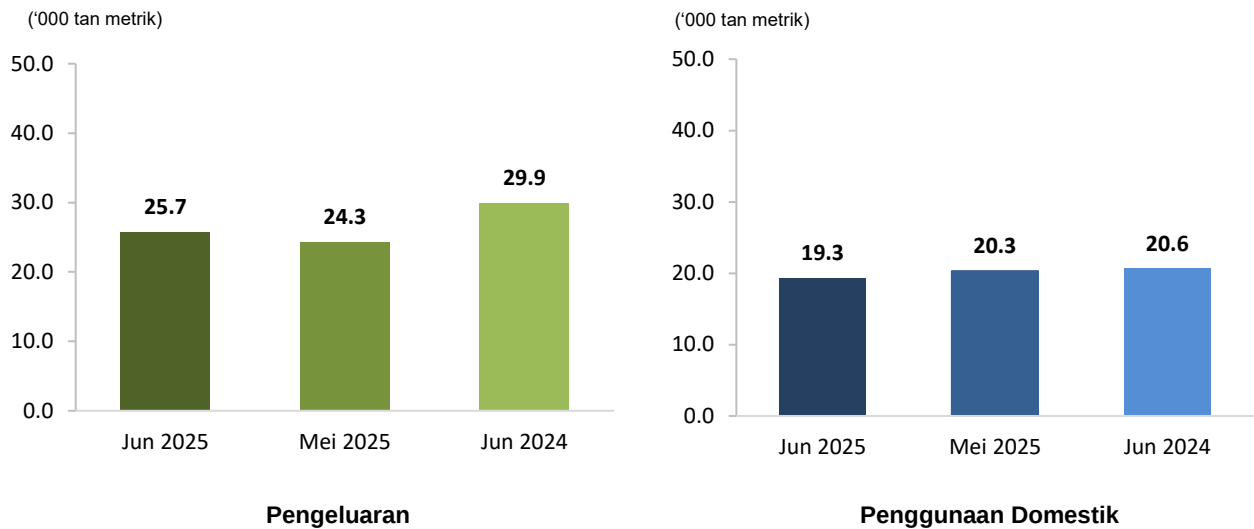
Kepengerusian ASEAN-Malaysia 2025: Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia (DOSM) akan mempengerusikan Jawatankuasa Sistem Statistik Komuniti ASEAN Ke-15 (ACSS15) yang bertujuan untuk memperkukuh kerjasama statistik ke arah pembangunan serantau yang mampan.

Malaysia buat julung kalinya telah menduduki tangga pertama (1) di peringkat global dalam laporan dwi-tahunan *Open Data Inventory* (ODIN) 2024/25 yang dikeluarkan oleh *Open Data Watch* (ODW), mengatasi 197 negara lain. Pencapaian ini merupakan lonjakan ketara daripada kedudukan ke-67 dalam penilaian ODIN 2022/23.

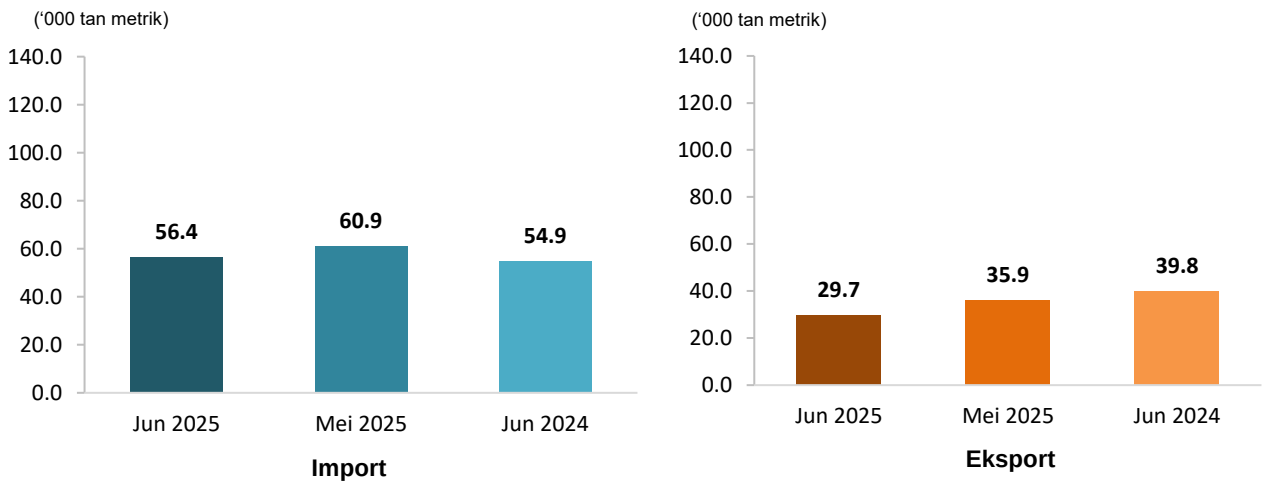

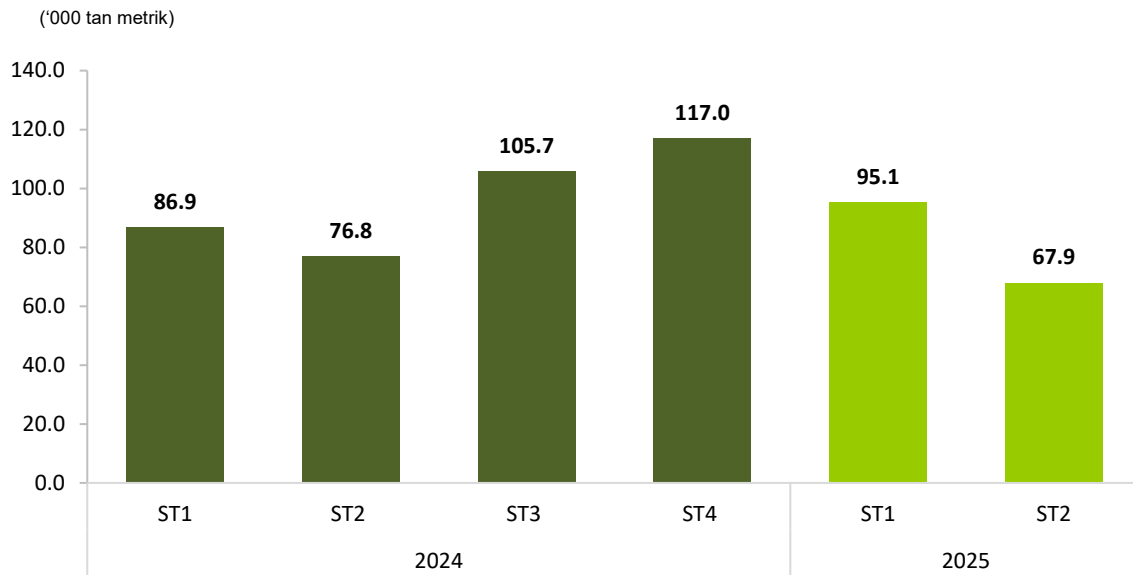
Carta 1: Pengeluaran dan penggunaan domestik bagi getah asli Jun 2024, Mei - Jun 2025

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MONTHLY RUBBER STATISTICS, MALAYSIA JUNE 2025

Malaysia natural rubber production increased by 5.9 per cent in June 2025

PUTRAJAYA, AUGUST 12, 2025 – The Department of Statistics, Malaysia (DOSM) released the **Monthly Rubber Statistics, Malaysia, June 2025**. This publication consists of statistics on production, imports, exports, domestic consumption, stocks, prices, number of employees, salaries & wages and productivity of rubber estates.

Chief Statistician Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin said, Natural Rubber (NR) production increased by 5.9 per cent in June 2025 (25,679 tonnes) as compared to May 2025 (24,256 tonnes). Year-on-year comparison showed that the production of NR decreased by 14.1 per cent (June 2024: 29,881 tonnes). Production of NR in June 2025 for Malaysia was mainly contributed by smallholders sector (84.7%) as compared to estates sector (15.3%).

Total stocks of NR in June 2025 decreased by 11.4 per cent to 164,189 tonnes as compared to 185,324 tonnes in May 2025. Rubber processors factory contributed 85.2 per cent of the stocks followed by rubber consumers factory (14.7%) and rubber estates (0.1%).

Exports of Malaysia's NR amounted to 29,719 tonnes in June 2025, decreased 17.3 per cent as against May 2025 (35,939 tonnes). P.R. China remained as the main destination for NR exports which accounted 33.9 per cent of total exports in June 2025 followed by Germany (18.1%), the United Arab Emirates (9.6%), the United States of America (7.3%) and India (3.8%). The exports performance was contributed by NR-based

product such as gloves, tyre, tube and rubber thread. Gloves were the main exports of rubber-based products with a value of RM1.2 billion in June 2025, a decrease of 1.7 per cent as compared to May 2025 (RM1.3 billion).

Analysis of the average monthly price showed that Concentrated Latex recorded a decrease of 9.0 per cent (June 2025: 558.66 sen per kg; May 2025: 613.80 sen per kg) while Scrap decreased by 7.0 per cent (June 2025: 564.13 sen per kg; May 2025: 606.67 sen per kg). Trend of prices for all Standard Malaysian Rubber (S.M.R) showed a decrease between 8.9 per cent and 10.7 per cent. The World Bank Commodity Price Data reported the prices for TSR 20 (Technically Specified Rubber) has decreased 5.4 per cent (from USD1.70/kg to USD1.61/kg) and SGP/MYS (Singapore/Malaysia) decreased 1.5 per cent (from USD2.19/kg to USD2.16/kg).

The performance of the second quarter of 2025 showed natural rubber production decreased by 28.6 per cent to 67,943 tonnes as compared to 95,101 tonnes in the first quarter of 2025. The annual performance of Malaysia's natural rubber production in the second quarter of 2025 recorded a decrease of 11.5 per cent as compared to the second quarter 2024 (76,814 tonnes).

According to the Malaysia Rubber Board Digest published in June 2025, the Kuala Lumpur Rubber Market opened mixed throughout June 2025 with the price of SMR 20 rising slightly higher supported by the uptrend in the regional rubber futures markets amid increase concerns for dwindling NR raw material supply owing to bad weather condition in major producer Thailand. Market sentiments were lifted by positive Chinese economic data coupled with the upbeat projection by Association of Natural Rubber Producing Countries (ANRPC) on natural rubber (NR) demand and gains in crude oil prices.

ASEAN-Malaysia 2025 Chairmanship: The Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM) will chair the 15th ASEAN Community Statistical System Committee (ACSS15) which aims to strengthen the statistical cooperation towards sustainable regional development.

Malaysia, for the first time, ranked as number one (1) globally in the biennial Open Data Inventory (ODIN) 2024/25 report released by Open Data Watch (ODW), surpassing 197 other countries. This achievement marks a significant leap from its 67th position in the ODIN 2022/23 assessment.

The Government of Malaysia has declared October 20th as National Statistics Day (MyStats Day), with the theme 'Statistics is the Essence of Life'. Meanwhile, the Fourth World Statistics Day will be celebrated on 20th October 2025, with the theme 'Driving Change with Quality Statistics and Data for Everyone'.

(‘000 tonnes)

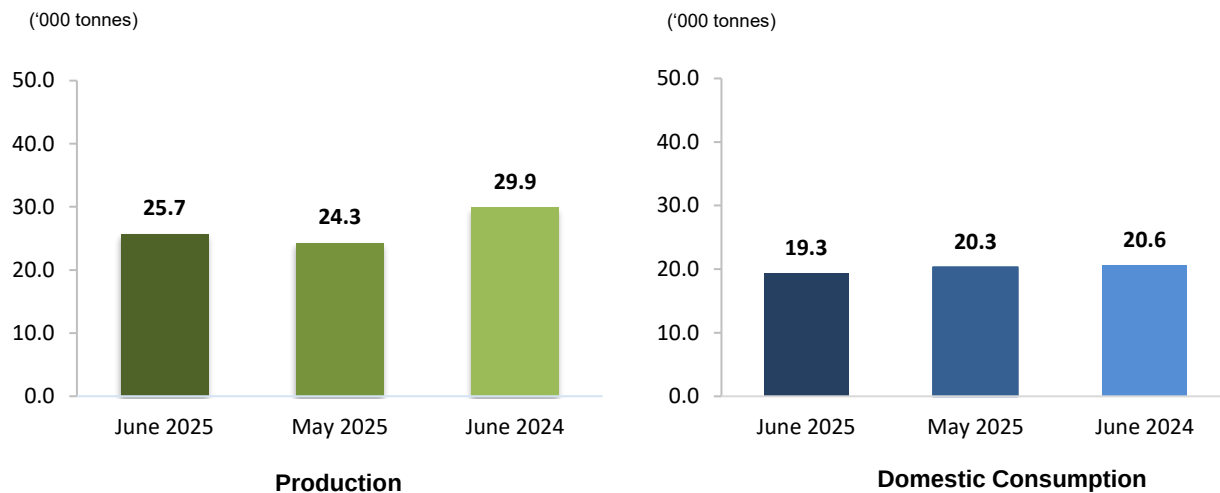
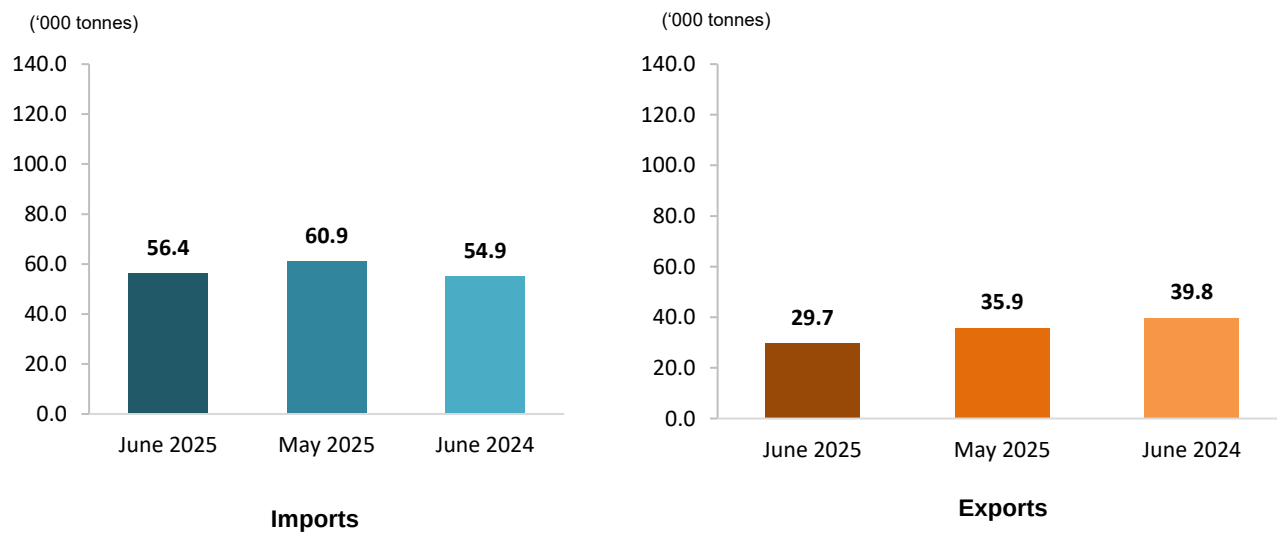
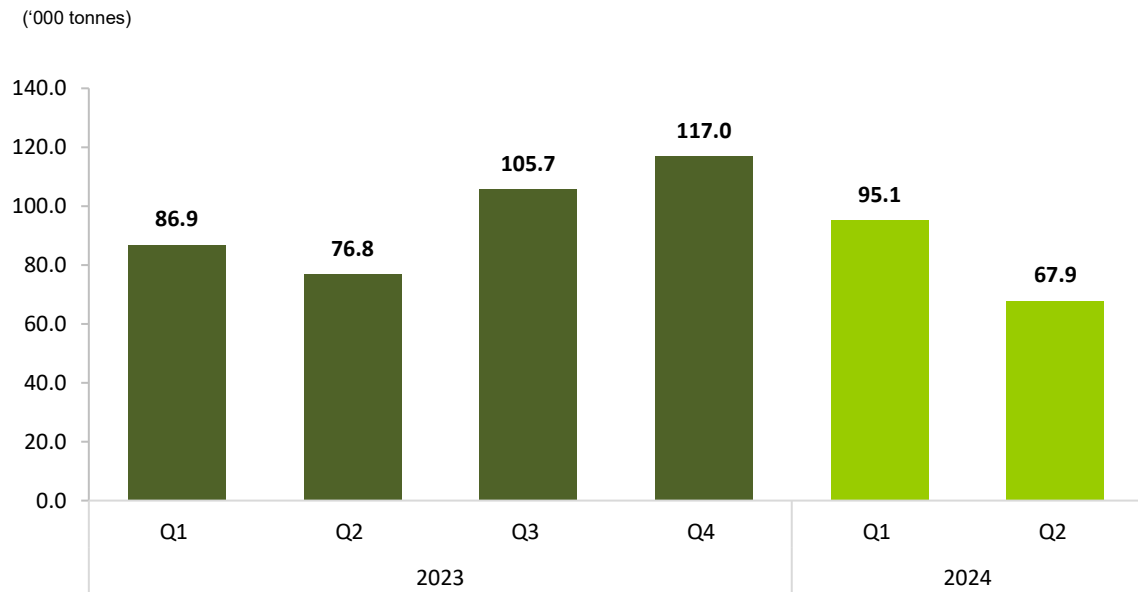


Chart 2: Imports and exports of natural rubber June 2024, May - June 2025
