**PERANGKAAN PEMBUATAN BULANAN, MALAYSIA,
NOVEMBER 2025**

**Jualan sektor Pembuatan berkembang 4.6 peratus, berjumlah
RM169.4 bilion pada November 2025**

PUTRAJAYA, 9 JANUARI 2026 - Sektor Pembuatan mencatatkan jualan RM169.4 bilion pada November 2025, berkembang 4.6 peratus (Oktober 2025: 6.3%). Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia (DOSM) melaporkan dalam keluaran **Perangkaan Pembuatan Bulanan, Malaysia, November 2025** pada hari ini.

Mengulas prestasi jualan Pembuatan terkini, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, Ketua Perangkawan Malaysia berkata, "Peningkatan nilai jualan dalam sektor Pembuatan disumbangkan terutamanya oleh subsektor Peralatan elektrik & elektronik, tumbuh 10.8 peratus pada November 2025 (Oktober 2025: 11.6%). Pertumbuhan ini turut disokong lagi oleh subsektor Makanan, Minuman dan Tembakau dan Produk mineral bukan logam, logam asas & produk logam, yang masing-masing meningkat sebanyak 7.7 peratus (Oktober 2025: 11.3%) dan 3.4 peratus (Oktober 2025: 4.6%). Perbandingan bagi bulan ke bulan, pertumbuhan nilai jualan menyusut 1.3 peratus, dari RM171.6 bilion yang direkodkan Oktober 2025."

Pertumbuhan nilai jualan bagi industri berorientasikan eksport yang mewakili 70.7 peratus daripada jumlah jualan, bertambah baik 4.6 peratus pada November 2025 (Oktober 2025: 6.9%). Prestasi ini terutamanya dipengaruhi oleh peningkatan dalam Pembuatan komputer, produk elektronik & optikal sebanyak 11.1 peratus (Oktober 2025: 12.1%). Sementara itu, Pembuatan kelengkapan elektrik juga meningkat sebanyak 10.8 peratus (Oktober 2025: 9.3%) dan Pembuatan minyak & lemak daripada sayuran & haiwan yang tumbuh 6.5 peratus (Oktober 2025: 12.9%). Perbandingan bulan ke bulan, pertumbuhan industri berorientasikan eksport jatuh 2.9 peratus (Oktober 2025: 0.8%).

Begitu juga, industri berorientasikan domestik meningkat 4.6 peratus pada November 2025, selepas mencatatkan 4.8 peratus pada sebulan lalu. Prestasi ini disokong oleh pertumbuhan kukuh dalam Pembuatan produk pemprosesan makanan dengan 8.9 peratus pada November 2025 (Oktober 2025: 8.5%); serta dalam industri Pembuatan logam asas (4.5%) dan Pembuatan produk logam kecuali mesin & kelengkapan (4.1%). Di samping itu, industri berorientasikan domestik meningkat 2.8 peratus berbanding bulan sebelumnya.

Mengulas mengenai bilangan pekerja, Ketua Perangkawan menyatakan, “Sejumlah 2.4 juta orang pekerja direkodkan dalam sektor ini pada November 2025, bertambah sebanyak 0.8 peratus (Oktober 2025: 1.1%). Pertambahan ini dipacu terutamanya oleh subsektor Makanan, minuman & tembakau (1.7%); Peralatan elektrik & elektronik (1.3%); dan Produk mineral bukan logam, logam asas & produk logam yang direka (1.0%). Berasaskan bulan ke bulan, bilangan pekerja dalam sektor ini berkurang sebanyak 0.2 peratus.

Seiring dengan itu, gaji & upah yang dibayar dalam sektor Pembuatan juga mencatatkan pengembangan 1.9 peratus (Oktober 2025: 2.4%), berjumlah RM8.46 bilion pada November 2025. Tambahan pula, gaji & upah yang dibayar menurun 0.3 peratus berbanding RM8.48 bilion yang direkodkan pada bulan sebelumnya. Selanjutnya, nilai jualan bagi setiap pekerja mencatatkan RM69,949 (3.7%), manakala purata gaji & upah bagi setiap pekerja adalah RM3,492, meningkat 1.1 peratus tahun ke tahun.”

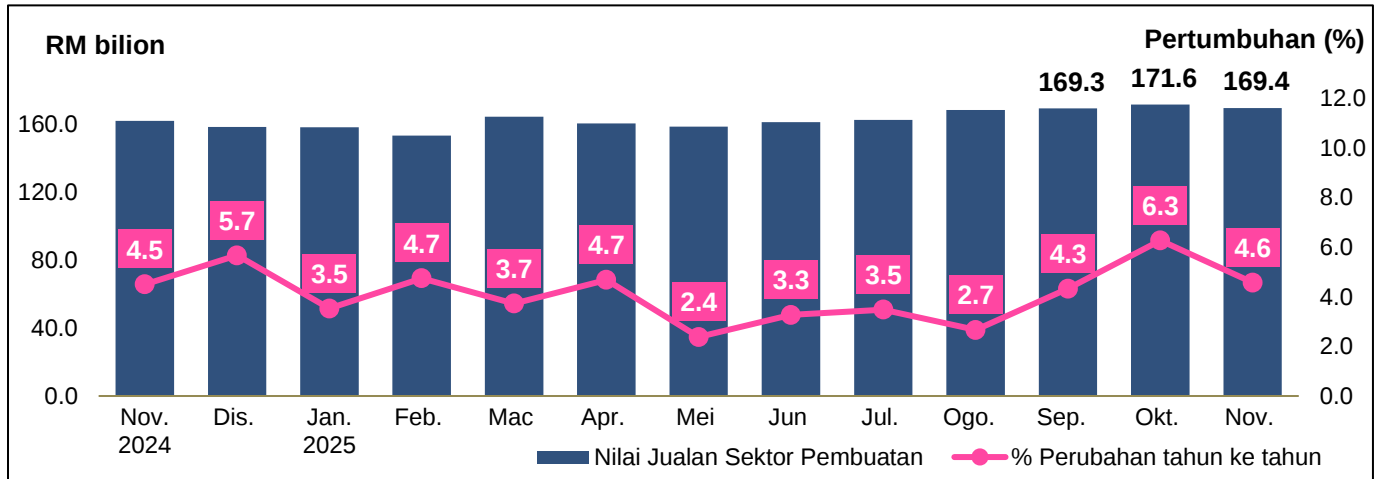
Merumuskan kenyataannya, Ketua Perangkawan berkata, “Bagi tempoh dari Januari sehingga November 2025, sektor Pembuatan merekodkan jualan kumulatif sebanyak RM1.8 trilion, tumbuh 4.0 peratus berbanding tempoh yang sama tahun 2024 (Januari – November 2024: 4.5%). Bilangan pekerja meningkat sebanyak 0.8 peratus kepada 2.4 juta orang, manakala gaji & upah meningkat 1.9 peratus kepada RM92.1 bilion. Selain itu, nilai jualan setiap pekerja berjumlah RM742,017, tumbuh 3.1 peratus.”

Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia (DOSM) sedang melaksanakan Banci Ekonomi 2026 (BE2026), bertemakan “Data Nadi Ekonomi Rakyat”. Pelaksanaan Banci Ekonomi kali keenam ini berlangsung dari 5 Januari hingga 31 Oktober 2026. BE2026 bertujuan untuk mengumpul data yang menyeluruh dan berstruktur daripada semua pertubuhan perniagaan berdaftar dan tidak berdaftar di Malaysia, bagi menilai prestasi, struktur serta ciri-ciri ekonomi negara secara komprehensif dan berasaskan bukti.

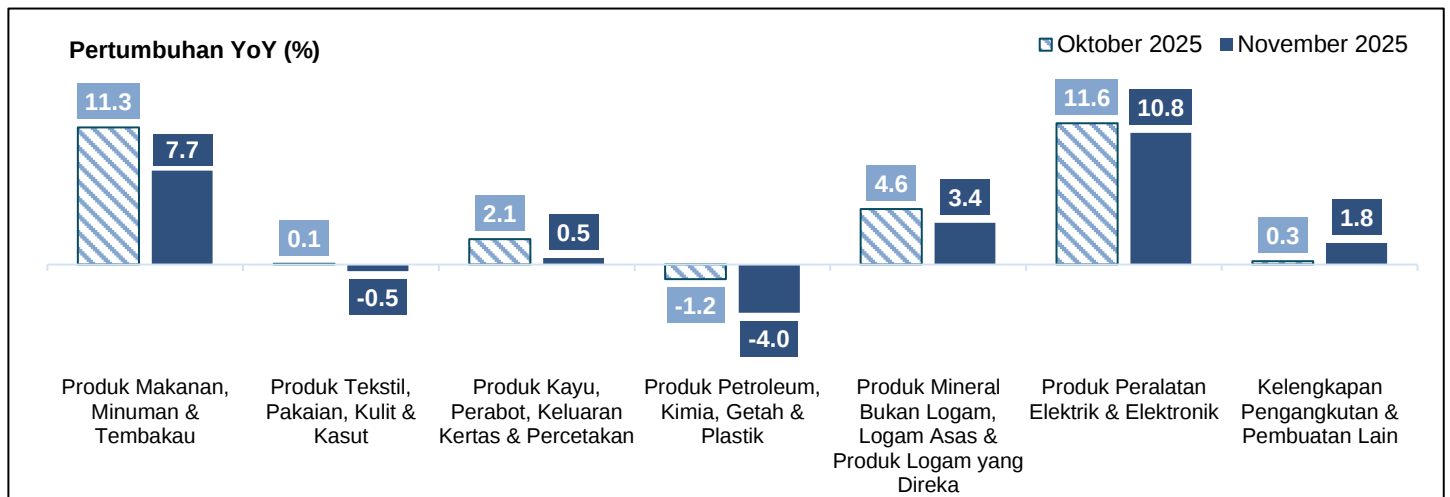

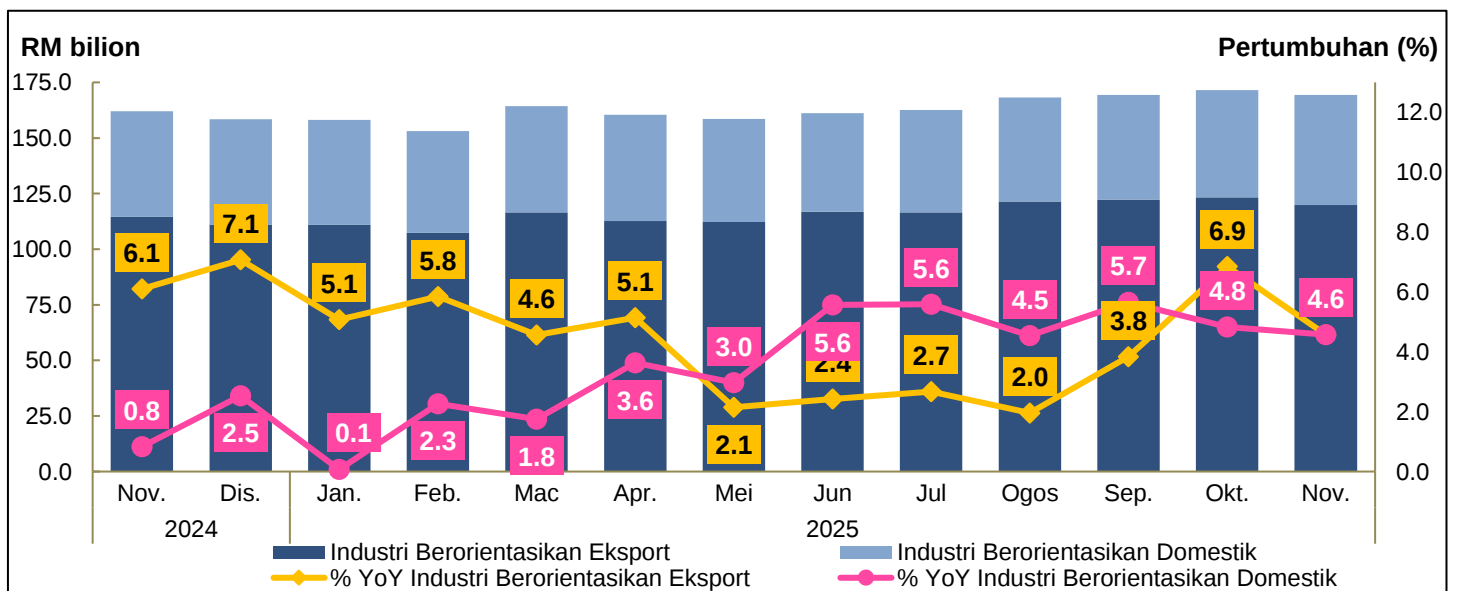
**Carta 1: Nilai Jualan Sektor Pembuatan, Malaysia
November 2024 - November 2025**



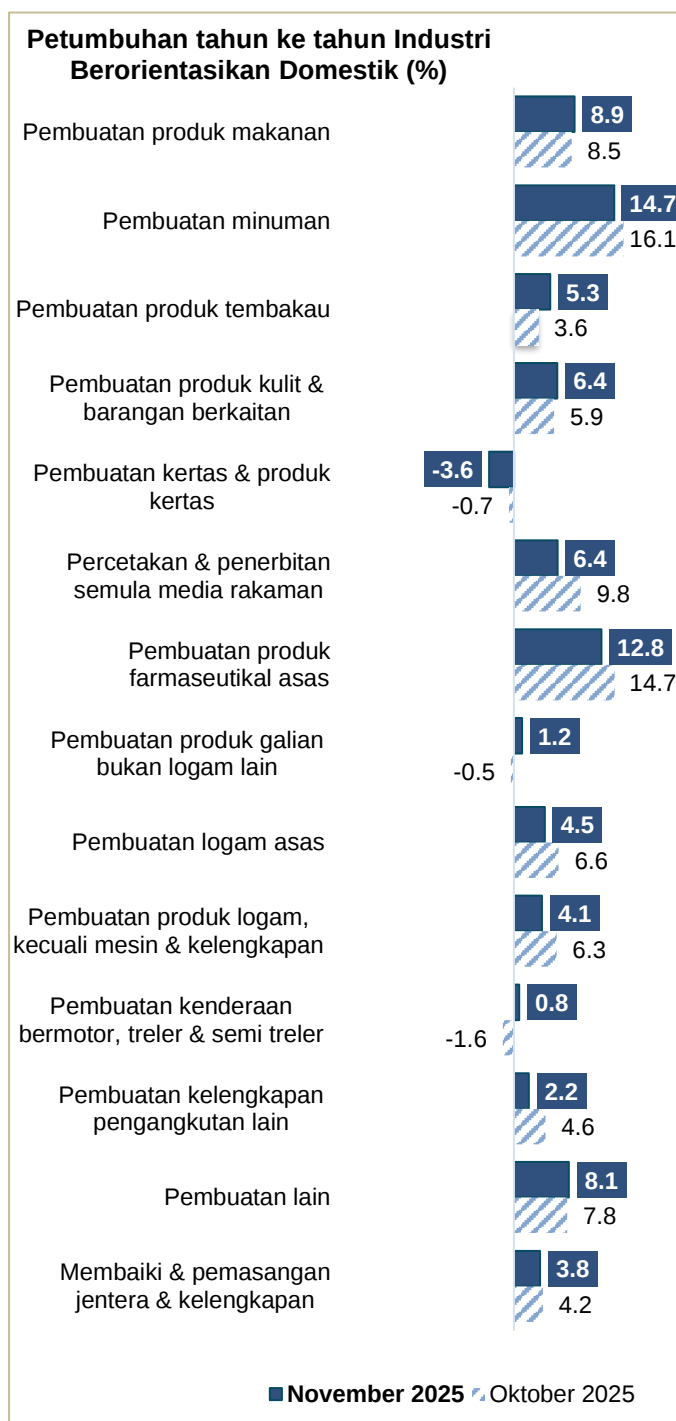
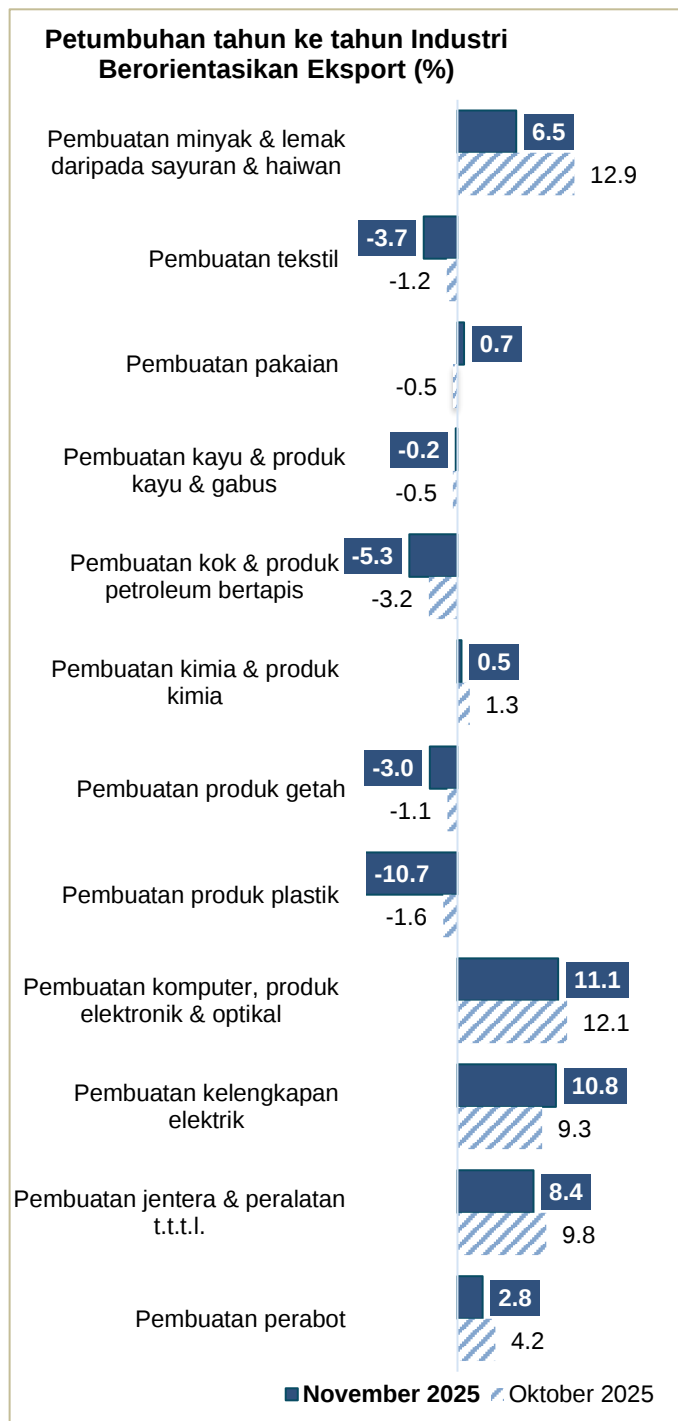
**Carta 2: Pertumbuhan Jualan Subsektor Pembuatan, Malaysia,

MONTHLY MANUFACTURING STATISTICS, MALAYSIA, NOVEMBER 2025

Sales in the Manufacturing sector expanded 4.6 per cent, stood at RM169.4 billion in November 2025

PUTRAJAYA, JANUARY 9, 2026 – The Manufacturing sector posted sales of RM169.4 billion in November 2025, expanded 4.6 per cent (October 2025: 6.3%). The Department of Statistics, Malaysia (DOSM) reported today in the release of **Monthly Manufacturing Statistics, Malaysia, November 2025**.

Commenting on the latest Manufacturing sales performance, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, Chief Statistician Malaysia said, "The growth in sales value within the Manufacturing sector was mainly contributed by the Electrical & electronics products sub-sector, surged 10.8 per cent in November 2025 (October 2025: 11.6%). The growth was further supported by the Food, beverages & tobacco and the Non-metallic mineral products, basic metal & fabricated metal products sub-sectors, which rose by 7.7 per cent (October 2025: 11.3%) and 3.4 per cent (October 2025: 4.6%), respectively. In comparison by month-on-month, sales value declined 1.3 per cent, from RM171.6 billion recorded in October 2025."

Sales value growth in the export-oriented industries which accounting for 70.7 per cent of total sales, improved by 4.6 per cent in November 2025 (October 2025: 6.9%). The performance was primarily influenced by the increase in the Manufacture of computer, electronics & optical products by 11.1 per cent (October 2025: 12.1%). Meanwhile, the Manufacture of electrical equipment also increased by 10.8 per cent (October 2025: 9.3%) and the Manufacture of vegetable & animal oils & fats which grew by 6.5 per cent (October 2025: 12.9%). On a month-on-month comparison, the growth of export-oriented industries dropped 2.9 per cent (October 2025: 0.8%).

Likewise, the domestic-oriented industries increased 4.6 per cent in November 2025, after registered 4.8 per cent a month ago. The performance was supported by robust growth in the Manufacture of food processing products with 8.9 per cent in November 2025 (October 2025: 8.5%), as well as in the Manufacture of basic metals (4.5%) and Manufacture of fabricated metal products, except machinery & equipment (4.1%). Furthermore, the domestic-oriented industries increased 2.8 per cent as compared to the preceding month.

Commenting on the number of employees, the Chief Statistician Malaysia stated, “A total of 2.4 million employees were recorded in this sector during November 2025, augmented by 0.8 per cent (October 2025: 1.1%). The augmentation was mainly driven by the Food, beverages & tobacco (1.7%); Electrical & electronics products (1.3%); and Non-metallic mineral products, basic metal & fabricated metal products (1.0%). On a month-on-month basis, the number of employees in this sector decreased by 0.2 per cent.

Correspondingly, the salaries & wages paid in the Manufacturing sector also posted an expansion of 1.9 per cent (October 2025: 2.4%), amounted to RM8.46 billion in November 2025. In addition, the salaries & wages paid decreased 0.3 per cent compared to RM8.48 billion recorded in the preceding month. Subsequently, the sales value per employee registered at RM69,949 (3.7%), while the average salaries & wages per employee was RM3,492, increased by 1.1 per cent year-on-year.”

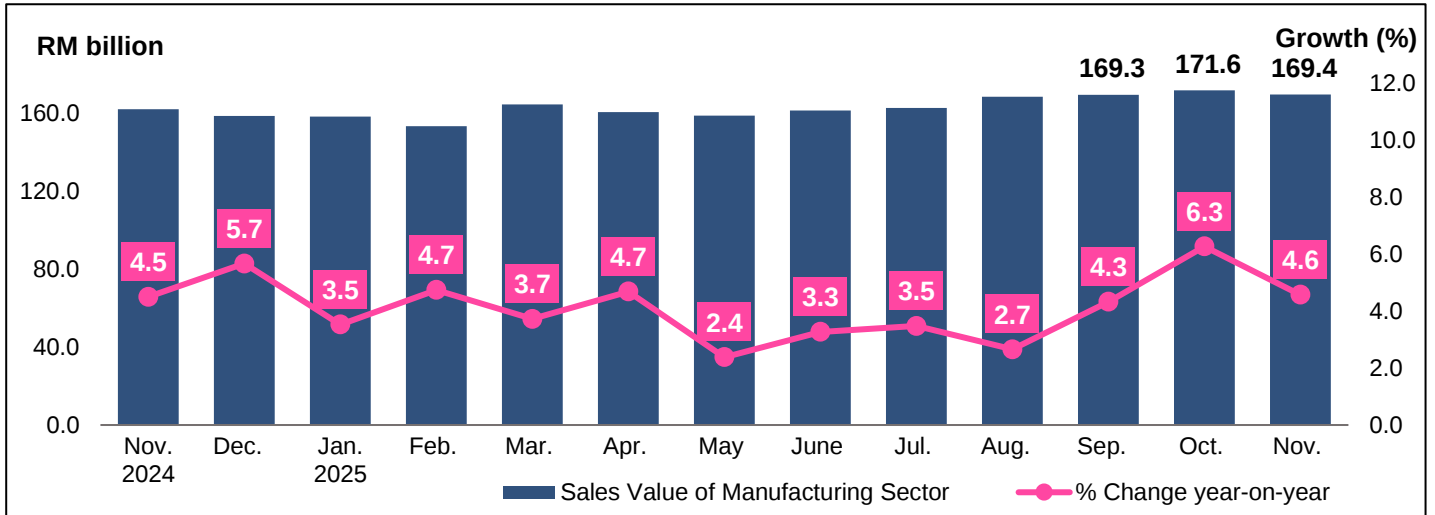
Concluding his statement, the Chief Statistician said, “For the period of January to November 2025, the Manufacturing sector recorded cumulative sales of RM1.8 trillion, grew 4.0 per cent as compared to the same period of 2024 (January – November 2024: 4.5%). The number of employees upticked by 0.8 per cent to 2.4 million persons, while salaries & wages increased by 1.9 per cent to RM92.1 billion. Moreover, the sales value per employee stood at RM742,017, grew 3.1 per cent.”

The Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM) is conducting the Economic Census 2026 (BE2026), themed “Data Nadi Ekonomi Rakyat”. The sixth Economic Census, running from 5th January to 31st October 2026. BE2026 aims to collect comprehensive, structured data from all registered and unregistered business establishments in Malaysia to assess the nation’s economic performance, structure and characteristics in an evidence-based manner.

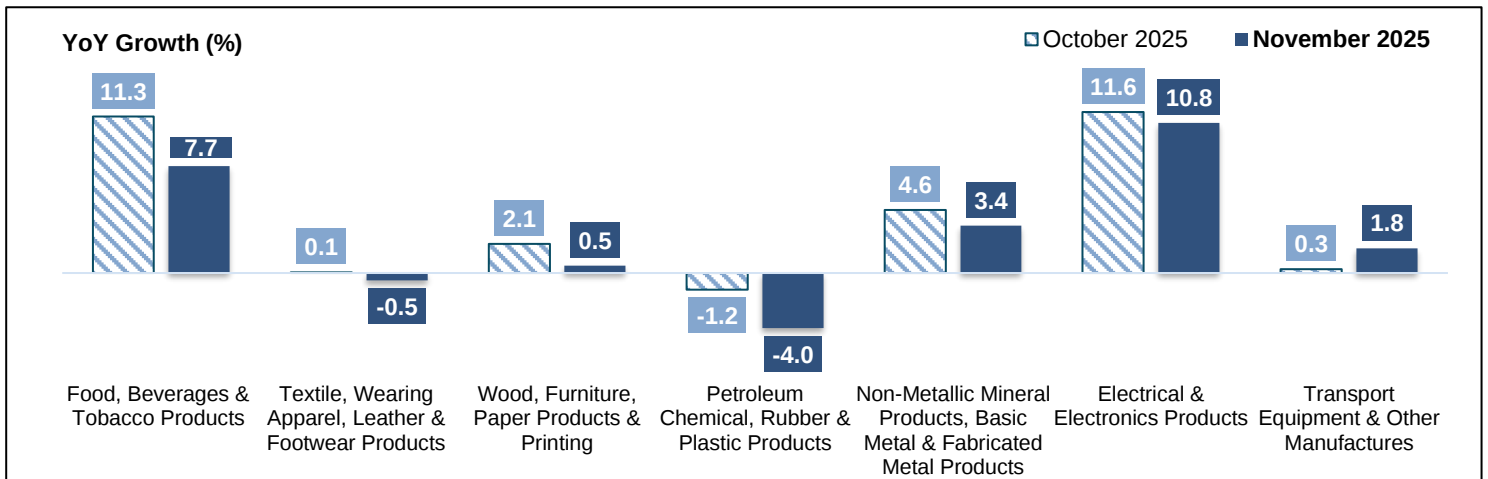
Malaysia has, for the first time, successfully secured the top position globally in the biennial Open Data Inventory (ODIN) 2024/25 report released by Open Data Watch (ODW), surpassing 197 other countries. This achievement marks a significant leap from its 67th position in the ODIN 2022/23 assessment.

Manufacturing Sector, Malaysia, November 2024 – November 2025**

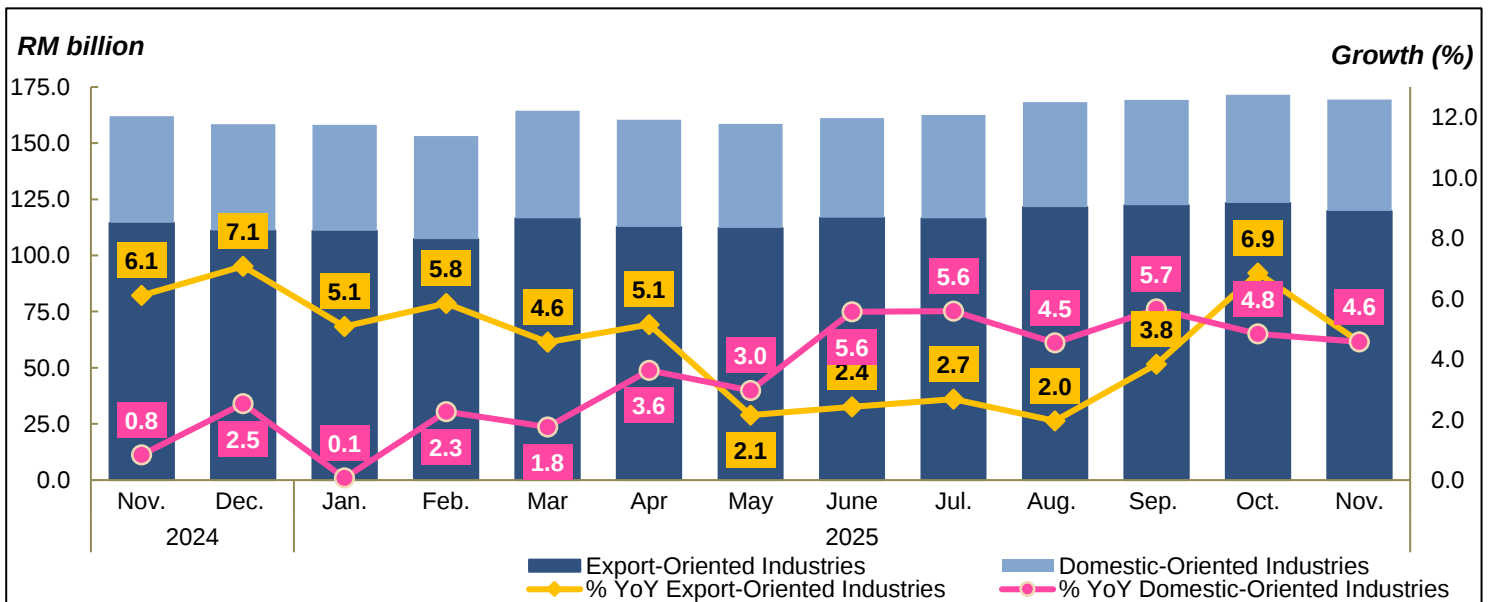
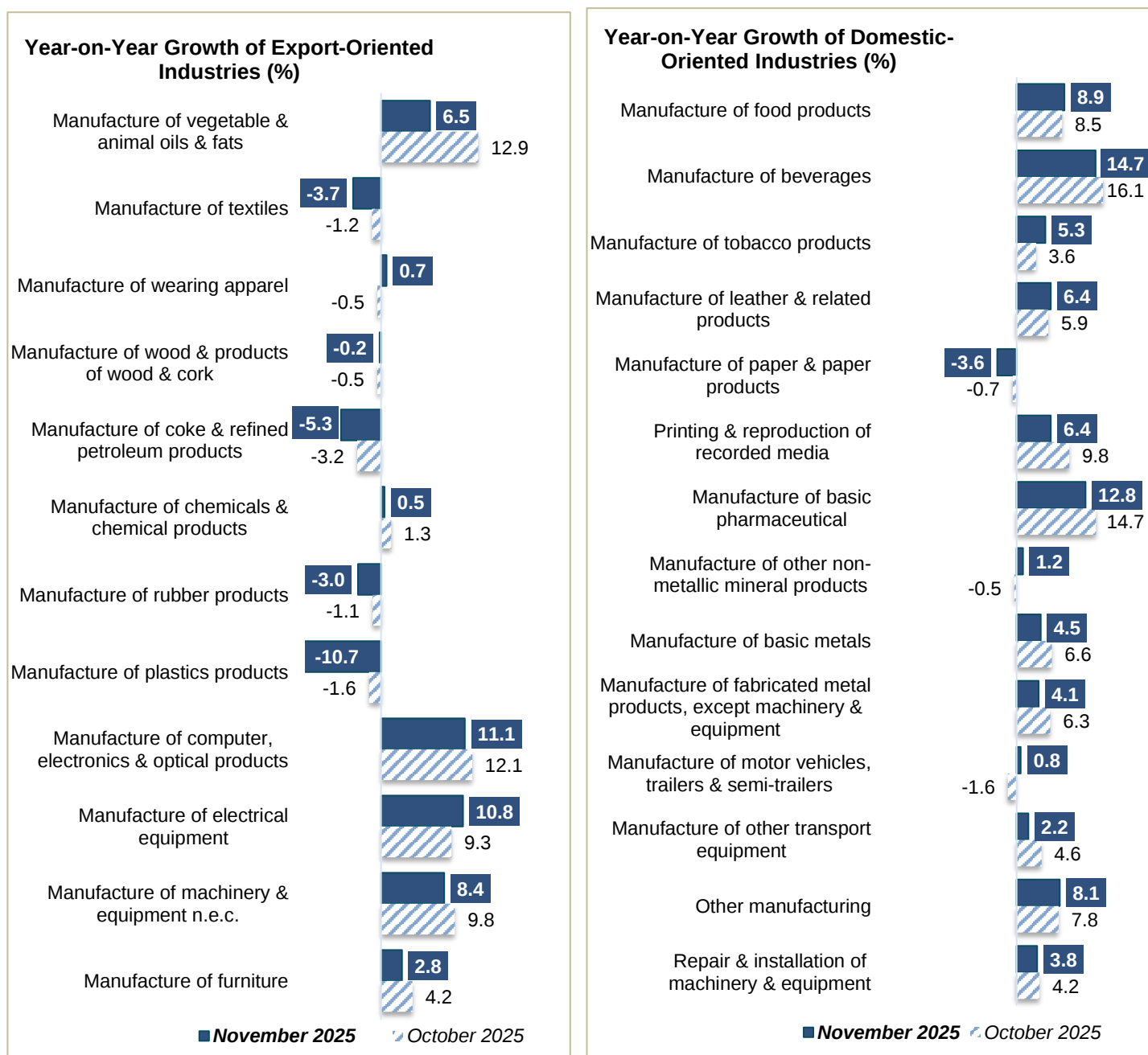


Chart 4: Sales Value of Manufacturing Export and Domestic-Oriented Groups, October and November 2025
