ASEAN MALAYSIA CHAIRMANSHIP 2025

The 8th Meeting of the Working Group on Sustainable Development Goals Indicators (WGSDGI8)



The Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM) successfully hosted the **8th Meeting of the Working Group on Sustainable Development Goals Indicators (WGSDGI8)** from **5 - 6 August 2025** in Putrajaya. The WGSDGI, a key entity under the ASEAN Community Statistical System (ACSS), plays a vital role in strengthening ASEAN's data ecosystem. It leads regional efforts to **harmonize methodologies, align indicators and build statistical capacity across Member States** – ensuring that **SDG data remains transparent, comparable and actionable**.

WGSDGI8 convened 29 delegates from ASEAN Member States (AMS) and the ASEAN Secretariat (ASEANstats), with virtual participation from Cambodia, Lao PDR, and Myanmar. As a collaborative platform, the WGSDGI focuses on supporting the achievement and monitoring of SDG indicators across ASEAN. Its meetings serve to **review progress, address challenges and coordinate efforts** among Member States, UN agencies and international organizations in tracking SDG implementation.

This year's meeting aimed to:

- **Finalize agreement on the ASEAN Statistical Indicators Core Set (ASI-CT)**
- **Discuss the ASEAN SDG Indicators Progress Report 2025**
- **Review the WGSDGI Multi-Year Plan (MYP) 2026–2030**
- **Update the 2026 Annual Work Plan (AWP)**
- **Assess evolving needs and expertise under the ASEAN Help ASEAN Framework (AHAF)**
- **Review ASEAN–UN Women collaboration on Gender Statistics**
- **Present progress on the pilot study for Small Area Estimation (SAE)**

BACKGROUND

The ASEAN Working Group on Sustainable Development Goals Indicators (WGSDGI) was established in November 2016, following its endorsement at the 6th Meeting of the ASEAN Community Statistical System (ACSS) Committee held in Vientiane, Lao PDR. The group was formed to support ASEAN Member States in the development, compilation, and reporting of indicators to monitor progress toward the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

WGSDGI plays a central role in coordinating regional efforts on SDG indicators, harmonizing statistical methodologies, ensuring data comparability, and addressing gaps in SDG-related statistics across ASEAN. It also provides technical guidance, promotes collaboration among Member States, and operates under the ACSS framework in alignment with the ACSS Strategic Plan 2016–2025.

OBJECTIVE

The ASEAN Working Group on SDG Indicators (WGSDGI) aims to address the statistical requirements in monitoring and reviewing the implementation of the ASEAN SDG indicators in the ASEAN Member States (AMS) and ASEAN and the region's position at the global level.

WGSDGI

CHAIRMANSHIP

The Chair of the WGSDGI is selected from among the designated focal points of the Working Group, rotating every two years among ASEAN Member States (AMS) based on alphabetical country order or as mutually agreed by the WGSDGI. ASEANstats serves as the Co-chair. The Chair is primarily responsible for guiding the Working Group's activities and meetings toward achieving its stated objectives within a defined timeframe. In fulfilling this role, the Chair works in close coordination with ASEANstats to plan, initiate, and lead the implementation of the WGSDGI work plan.

MAIN ACTIVITIES

TECHNICAL

Focus on supporting SDG indicator compilation and communication within the global framework through 2030, establishing a relevant set of ASEAN SDG indicators with metadata, aligning methodologies with international standards, implementing a Multi-Year Work Plan (2020–2030), harmonizing ASEAN and national SDG indicators based on country capacities and monitoring regional progress in line with the ASEAN Community Blueprints 2025.

COORDINATION

Strengthening of the national coordination for collecting and compiling ASEAN SDG indicators by working closely with national coordinators, ministries and stakeholders, while also promoting partnerships to support resource mobilization and capacity-building efforts.

DISSEMINATION

Advising the ACSS Committee on communication and dissemination of ASEAN SDG indicators, supporting ASEANstats in developing and maintaining a comprehensive SDG database, ensuring annual updates for UN regional reporting and contributing to the preparation of comprehensive and snapshot SDG reports with guidance on format, content and data visualization.

CAPACITY BUILDING

Coordinate capacity-building efforts, foster collaboration among ASEAN Member States to enhance statistical capacity for SDG indicator production and actively engage in regional and international exchanges to support effective SDG monitoring and reporting.

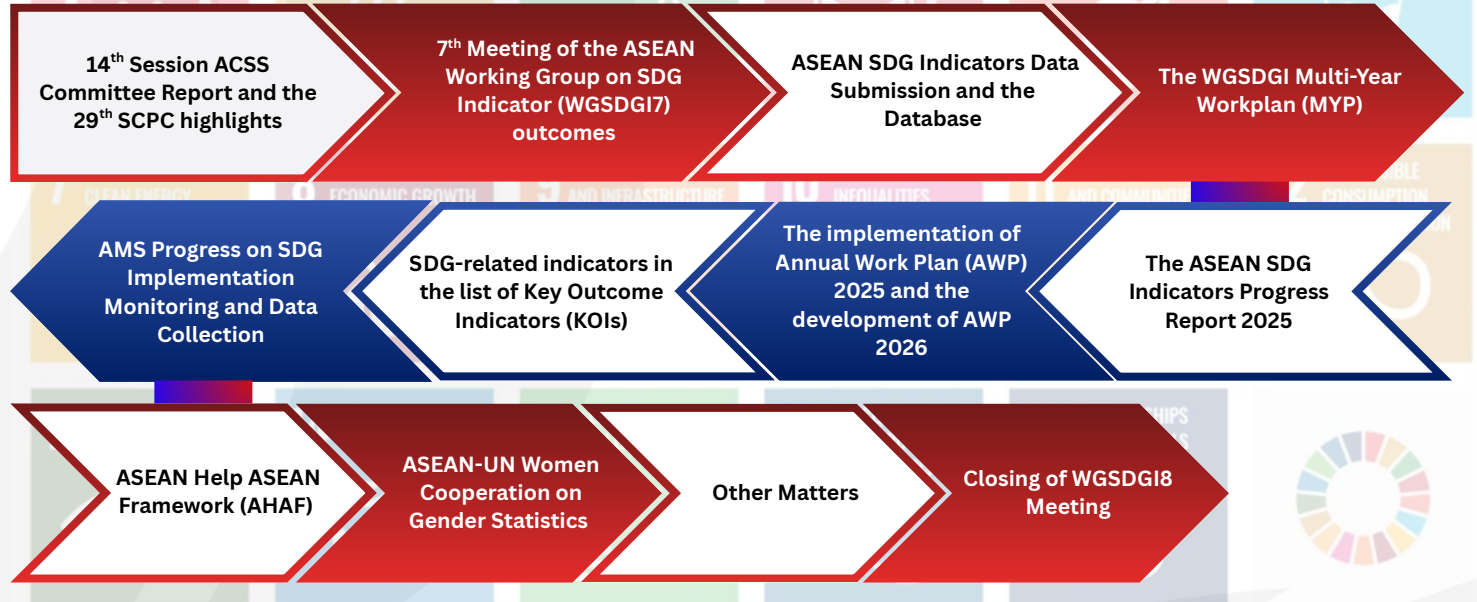

MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

1 ASEAN SDG Indicators Data Submission and the Database

The Meeting reviewed the latest updates on SDG Indicator data submissions, noted that ASEAN currently tracks 147 main indicators (374 including sub-indicators) and agreed on proposed adjustments to the indicator list.

2 WGSDGI Multi-Year Workplan (MYP) 2026-2030

The Meeting discussed the WGSDGI MYP 2026-2030 and agreed to include a supporting activity to establish national inter-agency working groups with clear task allocation to streamline SDGI data processes and explore Big Data and other sources. It also agreed to further develop a Statistical Glossary for SDG statistics and noted the proposed KPIs for monitoring and evaluating the ACSS Action Plan 2026-2030 across all working groups.

3 The ASEAN SDG Indicators Progress Report 2025

The Meeting reviewed progress on the ASEAN SDG Indicators Progress Report 2025 and noted ASEANstats will explore the possibility of organising a special event to mark the launch of the report. It also praised the working group's collaboration and commitment, which led to a comprehensive and insightful report.

4 The implementation of Annual Work Plan (AWP) 2025 and the development of AWP 2026

The Meeting reviewed the implementation of the WGSDGI Annual Work Plan and agreed that from 2026 onward, WGSDGI activities will align with the ACSS Action Plan and MYP 2026-2030. It was decided that a separate AWP will no longer be needed and the MYP may be adjusted to address emerging priorities or issues.

5 SDG-related indicators in the list of Key Outcome Indicators (KOIs)

The Meeting acknowledged the inclusion of SDG-related indicators in the preliminary list of Key Outcome Indicators of the AEC Strategic Plan 2026-2030. It emphasized data collection challenges and recommended assessing data availability in ASEAN Member States before adding these indicators to the SDGI submission template (Section L).

6 AMS Progress on SDG Implementation Monitoring and Data Collection

The Meeting appreciated the efforts by ASEAN Member States to improve SDGI monitoring and data compilation and also acknowledged common challenges faced by AMS in SDGI data compilation.

7 ASEAN Help ASEAN Framework

The Meeting acknowledged the successful implementation of AHAF capacity-building activities in 2024-2025 and noted that all AMS had submitted the updated list of needs and expertise. The Meeting also reviewed evaluation results and future recommendations and proposed seeking collaboration with international bodies for SDG indicator development.

8 ASEAN-UN Women Cooperation on Gender Statistics

The Meeting discussed the draft work plan for the ASEAN-UN Women Cooperation Programme on Gender Statistics and recommended incorporating all gender-related topics identified by AMS. ASEANstats will relay this suggestion to UN Women for consideration.

9 Other Matters

The Meeting reviewed progress on the Small Area Estimation (SAE) pilot including capacity-building efforts in 2024 and implementation in 2025 and encouraged AMS to seek support if needed. It also noted potential assistance from ONS UK on SDG-related topics such as Tier II indicators, Big Data integration, SDMX metadata standards and data quality frameworks. The Meeting confirmed that the 9th WGSDGI Meeting will be held at the ASEAN Secretariat in 2026 and welcomed Indonesia as the incoming chair for 2026-2027.

Malaysia Hosts The 8th Meeting of the Working Group on Sustainable Development Goals Indicators (WGSDGI8)

PUTRAJAYA, AUGUST 7th 2025 – Under ASEAN Malaysia Chairmanship 2025, themed "Inclusivity and Sustainability," the Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM) successfully hosted the 8th Meeting of the Working Group on Sustainable Development Goals Indicators (WGSDGI8) from 5th to 6th August 2025 in Putrajaya.

The WGSDGI, a key body under the ASEAN Community Statistical System (ACSS), plays a pivotal role in advancing ASEAN's data ecosystem. It leads efforts to harmonize methodologies, align indicators and strengthen statistical capacity across Member States, ensuring SDG data is transparent, comparable and actionable. The WGSDGI8 brought together 29 delegates from the ASEAN Member States (AMS) and the ASEAN Secretariat (ASEANStats), including virtual participation from Cambodia, Lao PDR and Myanmar.

Malaysia, as the ASEAN Chair in 2025 reaffirms its commitment to building a cohesive, inclusive and data-driven ASEAN. Malaysia aims to strengthen statistical capacity, harmonize regional indicators and ensure measurable and meaningful progress, reflecting its belief in regional solidarity, informed governance and a shared future powered by data.

In his welcoming remarks, YBhg. Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin, Chief Statistician of Malaysia and Chair of the 15th Session of the ACSS (ACSS15), emphasised that "To fulfil the commitment to leave no one behind, a clear understanding of the current situation requires relevant, reliable and timely indicators, as well as data that reflects not only regional performance but also the lived experiences of the people".

"Therefore, AMS play an important role in this effort and the National Statistics Offices (NSOs) serve not only as data producers but also strategic enablers of evidence-based development," said YBhg. Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin.

The WGSDGI is a working platform involving ASEAN countries with the main focus of ensuring the achievement and monitoring of SDG indicators among ASEAN countries. The WGSDGI meeting discusses the progress, challenges and issues in the implementation of SDG indicators, as well as coordinates efforts among member states, UN agencies and international organisations in monitoring SDG progress.

The WGSDGI8 was specifically held to obtain agreement on the ASI-CT, discuss the ASEAN SDG Indicators Progress Report 2025, review the WGSDGI Multi-Year Plan (MYP) 2026-2030, update the 2026 Annual Work Plan (AWP), discuss the updated WGSDGI needs and expertise under the ASEAN Help ASEAN Framework (AHAF), review ASEAN-UN Women cooperation on Gender Statistics and present the progress of the pilot study on Small Area Estimation (SAE).

The ASEAN SDG Indicators Progress Report 2025 is expected to be published in September 2025. ASEAN currently monitors 147 main indicators or 374 including sub-indicators and additional indicators.

The WGSDGI Multi-Year Plan (MYP) 2026-2030 is aligned with the vision and mission of the ASEAN Community Statistical System (ACSS) and formulated based on the ACSS Action Plan 2026-2030. The 2026 Annual Work Plan (AWP) will be developed based on the WGSDGI Multi-Year Plan (MYP) 2026-2030. The ASEAN Help ASEAN Framework (AHAF) continues to be strengthened through the joint efforts of AMS in identifying needs and expertise that can be leveraged to enhance regional cooperation.

In conjunction with the hosting of WGSDGI8, the delegates also had the opportunity to experience Malaysia's warm hospitality, reflecting the country's commitment to creating a harmonious atmosphere and supporting cooperation within the ASEAN statistical community.

ASEAN Malaysia 2025 Chairmanship: The Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM) will chair the 15th ASEAN Community Statistical System Committee (ACSS15) which aims to strengthen the statistical cooperation towards sustainable regional development.

Malaysia, for the first time, ranked as number one (1) globally in the biennial Open Data Inventory (ODIN) 2024/25 report released by Open Data Watch (ODW), surpassing 197 other countries. This achievement marks a significant leap from its 67th position in the ODIN 2022/23 assessment.

The Government of Malaysia has declared October 20th as National Statistics Day (MyStats Day), with the theme "Statistics is the Essence of Life". Meanwhile, the Fourth World Statistics Day will be celebrated on 20th October 2025, with the theme "Driving Change with Quality Statistics and Data for Everyone".

Malaysia Menjadi Tuan Rumah Mesyuarat Kumpulan Kerja Mengenai Indikator Matlamat Pembangunan Mampan Ke-8 (WGSDGI8)

PUTRAJAYA, 7 OGOS 2025 – Di bawah kepimpinan Pengurus ASEAN Malaysia 2025 yang bertemakan "Inklusiviti dan Kelestarian," Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia (DOSM) telah berjaya menganjurkan Mesyuarat Kumpulan Kerja Mengenai Indikator Matlamat Pembangunan Mampan ke-8 (WGSDGI8) pada 5 hingga 6 Ogos 2025 di Putrajaya.

WGSDGI, sebuah Kumpulan Kerja utama di bawah Sistem Statistik Komuniti ASEAN (ACSS), memainkan peranan penting dalam memajukan ekosistem data ASEAN. Ia menggalakan usaha untuk menyelaraskan metodologi, menyelaraskan indikator dan memperkuhi keupayaan statistik di seluruh Negara Anggota ASEAN (AMS), bagi memastikan data SDG adalah telus, boleh dibandingkan dan boleh diguna pakai. Mesyuarat WGSDGI ke-8 (WGSDGI8) telah menghimpunkan 29 orang perwakilan dari AMS dan Sekretariat ASEAN (ASEANStats), termasuk penyertaan secara maya dari Cambodia, Lao PDR dan Myanmar.

Malaysia selaku Pengurus ASEAN 2025, mengulangi komitmennya untuk membina ASEAN yang lebih padu, inklusif dan dipacu oleh data. Malaysia berhasrat untuk memperkuhi keupayaan statistik, menyelaraskan indikator serantau dan memastikan kemajuan yang boleh diukur dan bermakna, yang mencerminkan keyakinannya terhadap solidariti serantau, tabir arus berinformasi dan masa depan bersama yang didorong oleh data.

Laporan Kemajuan Indikator SDG ASEAN 2025 dijangka akan diterbitkan pada September 2025. ASEAN kini memantau 147 indikator utama atau 374 termasuk sub-indikator dan indikator tambahan.

Pelan Kerja Pelbagai Tahun (MYP) WGSDGI 2026-2030 adalah selaras dengan visi dan misi Sistem Statistik Komuniti ASEAN (ACSS) serta digubal berdasarkan Pelan Tindakan ACSS 2026-2030. Pelan Kerja Tahunan (AWP) 2026 akan dibangunkan berdasarkan Pelan Kerja Pelbagai Tahun (MYP) WGSDGI 2026-2030. Malaysia buat julung kalinya telah menduduki tangga pertama (1) di peringkat global dalam laporan dwi-tahunan Open Data Inventory (ODIN) 2024/25 yang dikeluarkan oleh Open Data Watch (ODW), mengatasi 197 negara lain. Pencapaian ini merupakan lonjakan ketara daripada kedudukan ke-67 dalam penilaian ODIN 2022/23.

Among the agreements reached was that the ASEAN SDG Indicators 2025 Progress Report is expected to be published in September this year.

"The WGSDGI 2028–2030 MYP aligns with the ACSS vision and mission and is developed based on the ACSS Action Plan 2028–2030. The 2028 AWP will be formulated based on the 2028–2030 MYP.

Chief Statistician of Malaysia Datuk Seri Dr Mohd Uzir Mahidin said that to fulfil the "leave no one behind" commitment, a clear understanding of current situations required relevant, reliable, and accurate indicators and data that reflected not only regional performance but also the lived experiences of the people.

"Therefore, ASEAN Member States (AMS) play a crucial role in this effort, and National Statistics Offices (NSOs) serve not only as data producers but also as strategic facilitators for evidence-based development," said Mohd Uzir, who is also chairman of the 15th ASEAN Community Statistical System Committee (ACSS15).

Regarding the 8th Working Group Meeting on Sustainable Development Goals Indicators (WGSDGI8), DOSM said it gathered 29 delegates from AMS and the ASEAN Secretariat (ASEANstats), including virtual participation from Cambodia, Laos, and Myanmar.

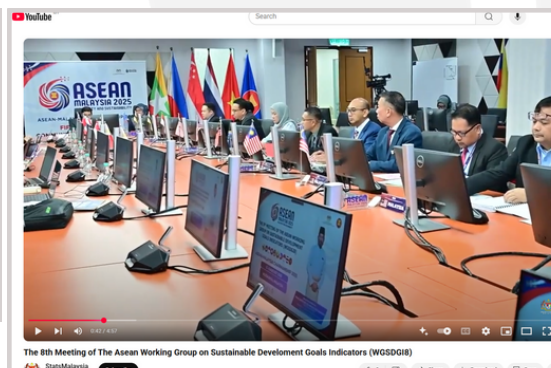
