



June's unemployment rate stood at 3.0 per cent, with the number of unemployed declining to 518.7 thousand persons







June's unemployment rate stood at 3.0 per cent, with the number of unemployed declining to 518.7 thousand persons

- The **labour force** continued its upward trend in June 2025, increasing by **0.3 per cent** month-on-month to **17.43 million persons** (May 2025: 17.38 million persons). The **labour force participation rate** in June 2025 stood at **70.8 per cent**, consistent with the rate recorded in May.
- The unemployed declined further by 0.7 per cent to 518.7 thousand persons during the month (May 2025: 522.4 thousand persons).
- The unemployment rate remained unchanged at 3.0 per cent for the third consecutive month, indicating sustained labour market stability.
- Employment continued to increase in June 2025, with the number of **employed** rising by **0.3 per cent** to **16.92 million persons** (May 2025: 16.86 million persons).
- Employment across economic sectors continued to increase during the month, led by steady growth in the Services sector, particularly in Wholesale and retail trade; Accommodation and food & beverage services; as well as Information & communication activities. Similarly, the number of employed persons in the Manufacturing, Construction, Mining & quarrying, and Agriculture sectors also experienced a rise during the month.
- As for the number of persons **outside the labour force** in June 2025, it was slightly down by **0.004 per cent**, totalling **7.18 million persons** (May 2025: 7.18 million persons).
