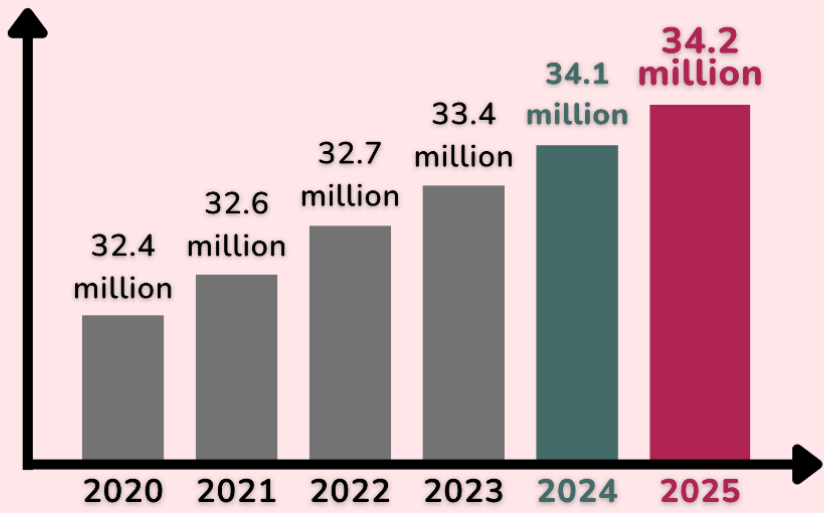
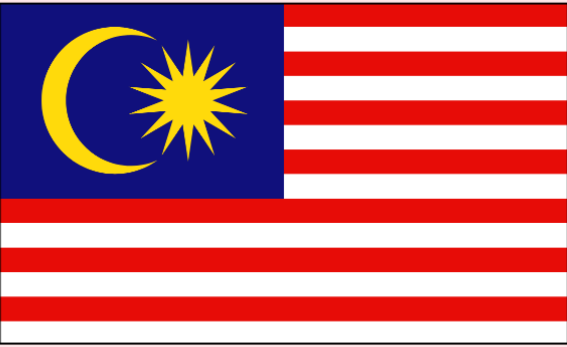

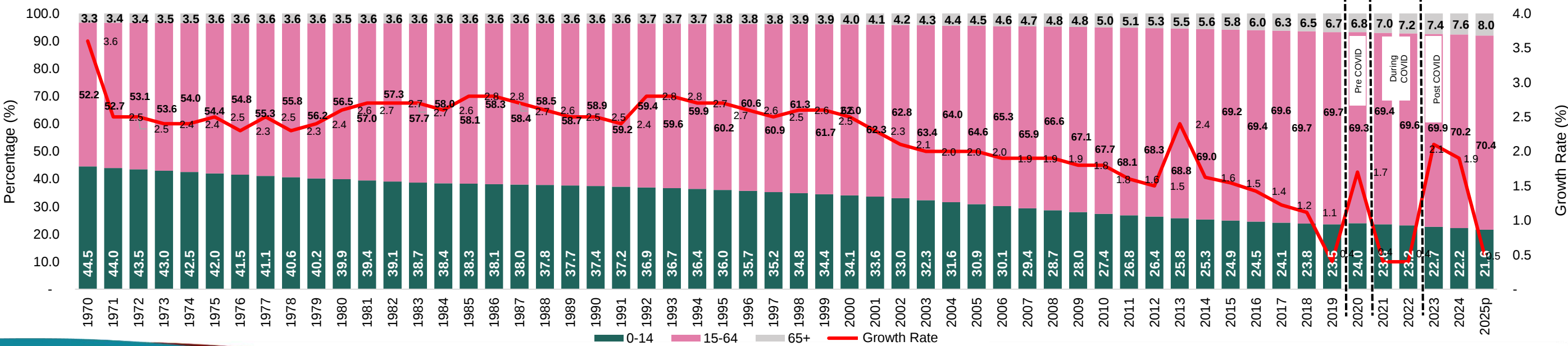

Melaka, Pahang and W.P. Kuala Lumpur have joined nine other ageing states

- Malaysia's total population in 2025 is estimated at 34.2 million as compared to 34.1 million in 2024 with a growth of 0.5 per cent. The Citizens population increased from 30.7 million in 2024 to 30.9 million in 2025 with the growth rate lowering from 0.7 per cent to 0.6 per cent. Similarly, Non-citizens showed the same trend with growth rate of -0.5 per cent in 2025 as compared to 13.6 per cent in 2024.
- A total of 12 states in Malaysia have reached ageing state status with the latest additions in 2025 being Melaka (7.3%), Pahang (7.1%) and W.P. Kuala Lumpur (7.1%). Perak remains as the leading state with the highest percentage of elderly population at 10.3 per cent.
- Five states namely Terengganu (1.2%), Kelantan (1.0%), Pahang (0.6%), Selangor (0.6%) dan Melaka (0.6%) have surpassed the national growth rate of 0.5 per cent. The three states with the highest population percentage in 2025 are Selangor (21.6%), followed by Johor (12.3%) and Sabah (11.0%). On the other hand, W.P. Labuan and W.P. Putrajaya recorded the lowest population percentage at 0.3 per cent and 0.4 per cent respectively.
- The composition of Citizens in 2025 increased to 90.1 per cent (2025) from 90.0 per cent. Meanwhile, Non-citizens decreased from 10.0 per cent to 9.9 per cent over the same period.
- W.P. Putrajaya recorded the highest composition of young age population (0-14 years) in 2025 at 33.3 per cent. Meanwhile, W.P. Kuala Lumpur recorded the highest number of working age population (15-64 years) with 76.1 per cent.
