MONTHLY RUBBER STATISTICS, MALAYSIA NOVEMBER 2024

Malaysia natural rubber production increased by 0.2 per cent in November 2024

PUTRAJAYA, JANUARY 14, 2025 – The Department of Statistics, Malaysia (DOSM) released the **Monthly Rubber Statistics, Malaysia, November 2024.** This publication consists of statistics on production, imports, exports, domestic consumption, stocks, prices, number of employees, salaries & wages and productivity of rubber estates.

Chief Statistician Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin said, Natural Rubber (NR) production increased by 0.2 per cent in November 2024 (38,481 tonnes) as compared to October 2024 (38,400 tonnes). Year-on-year comparison showed that the production of NR increased by 25.5 per cent (November 2023: 30,669 tonnes). Production of NR in November 2024 for Malaysia was mainly contributed by smallholders sector (89.0%) as compared to estates sector (11.0%).

Total stocks of NR in November 2024 increased by 12.3 per cent to 151,197 tonnes as compared to 134,667 tonnes in October 2024. Rubber processors factory contributed 88.6 per cent of the stocks followed by rubber consumers factory (11.2%) and rubber estates (0.2%).

Exports of Malaysia's NR amounted to 43,562 tonnes in November 2024, decreased 9.5 per cent as against October 2024 (48,142 tonnes). P.R. China remained as the main destination for NR exports which accounted 44.2 per cent of total exports in November 2024 followed by Germany (12.5%), the United States of America (10.5%), the United Arab Emirates (8.6%) and Pakistan (4.5%). The exports performance was contributed by NR-based product such as gloves, tyre, tube and rubber thread. Gloves were the main exports of rubber-based products with a value of RM1.4 billion in November 2024, a decrease of 4.7 per cent as compared to October 2024 (RM1.5 billion).

Analysis of the average monthly price showed that Concentrated Latex recorded a decrease of 8.4 per cent (November 2024: 683.48 sen per kg; October 2024: 746.36 sen per kg) while Scrap decreased by 1.3 per cent (November 2024: 728.68 sen per kg; October 2024: 738.01 sen per kg). Trend of prices for all Standard Malaysian Rubber (S.M.R) decreased between 1.3 per cent and 8.4 per cent. The World Bank Commodity Price Data reported the prices for TSR 20 (Technically Specified Rubber) has decreased 3.8 per cent (from USD2.01/kg to USD1.93/kg) and SGP/MYS (Singapore/Malaysia) decreased 13.0 per cent (from USD2.63/kg to USD2.29/kg).

According to the Malaysia Rubber Board Digest published in November 2024, the Kuala Lumpur rubber market ruled mixed in November with SMR 20 price moving within the tight range and increased slightly towards month end. The bullish sentiment was supported by the shortage of global NR supply due to adverse weather in major producing NR countries, brighter NR demand outlook reported by the Association of Natural Rubber Producing Countries (ANRPC), and the latest report by the International Monetary Fund (IMF). Market sentiment was also supported by the improving Chinese economic performance boosted by the economic stimulus to support their economy.


