MONTHLY RUBBER STATISTICS, MALAYSIA,
NOVEMBER 2025

**Malaysia natural rubber production
decreased by 29.6 per cent in November 2025**

PUTRAJAYA, JANUARY 13th, 2026 – The Department of Statistics, Malaysia (DOSM) released the **Monthly Rubber Statistics, Malaysia, November 2025**. This publication consists of statistics on production, imports, exports, domestic consumption, stocks, prices, number of employees, salaries & wages and productivity of rubber estates.

Chief Statistician Malaysia, Dato' Sri Dr. Mohd Uzir Mahidin said, Natural Rubber (NR) production decreased by 29.6 per cent in November 2025 (20,891 tonnes) as compared to October 2025 (29,673 tonnes). Year-on-year comparison showed that the production of NR decreased by 48.2 per cent (November 2024: 40,341 tonnes). Production of NR in November 2025 for Malaysia was mainly contributed by smallholders (83.3%) as compared to estates (16.7%).

Total stocks of NR in November 2025 decreased by 17.3 per cent to 120,208 tonnes as compared to 145,422 tonnes in October 2025. Rubber processors factory contributed 76.7 per cent of the stocks followed by rubber consumers factory (23.1%) and rubber estates (0.1%).

Exports of Malaysia's NR amounted to 37,150 tonnes in November 2025, decreased 29.8 per cent as against October 2025 (52,932 tonnes). P.R. China remained as the main destination for NR exports which accounted 50.8 per cent of total exports in November 2025 followed by Germany (15.1%), the United Arab Emirates (12.5%), the United States of America (5.7%) and Turkiye (2.2%). The exports performance was contributed by NR-based product such as rubber gloves, tyre, tube and rubber thread. Gloves were the main exports of rubber-based products with a value of RM0.9 billion in November 2025, a decrease of 25.8 per cent as compared to October 2025 (RM1.2 billion).

Analysis of the average monthly price showed that Concentrated Latex recorded an increase of 0.4 per cent (November 2025: 571.93 sen per kg; October 2025: 569.84 sen per kg) while Scrap decreased by 1.8 per cent (November 2025: 589.83 sen per kg; October 2025: 600.44 sen per kg). Trend of prices for all Standard Malaysian Rubber (S.M.R) was decreased 1.7 per cent and increased 0.2 per cent. The World Bank Commodity Price Data reported the prices November for TSR 20 (Technically Specified Rubber) has decreased 0.2 per cent (from USD1.712/kg to USD1.708/kg) and SGP/MYS (Singapore/Malaysia) increased 1.4 per cent (from USD2.00/kg to USD2.03/kg).

According to the Malaysia Rubber Board Digest published in November 2025, The Kuala Lumpur rubber market opened mixed in November, weighed down by lower oil prices, a stronger ringgit against the U.S. dollar, and concerns over weaker economic data from both the U.S. and China. However, further losses were limited by worries over supply disruptions caused by heavy rains in major producing countries, firmer expectations of a U.S. rate cut, improved U.S.–China trade relations, positive developments in the semiconductor sector, anticipated additional stimulus from Beijing, robust global EV sales, and the one-year delay of the EUDR.

The Department of Statistics Malaysia (DOSM) is conducting the Economic Census 2026 (BE2026), themed “Data Nadi Ekonomi Rakyat”. The sixth Economic Census, running from 5th January to 31st October 2026. BE2026 aims to collect comprehensive, structured data from all registered and unregistered business establishments in Malaysia to assess the nation’s economic performance, structure and characteristics in an evidence-based manner.

Malaysia has, for the first time, successfully secured the top position globally in the biennial Open Data Inventory (ODIN) 2024/25 report released by Open Data Watch (ODW), surpassing 197 other countries. This achievement marks a significant leap from its 67th position in the ODIN 2022/23 assessment.

Chart 1: Production and domestic consumption of natural rubber November 2024, October - November 2025 ('000 tonnes)





Chart 2: Imports and exports of natural rubber November 2024, October - November 2025 ('000 tonnes)
