














# **EMPLOYEE WAGES STATISTICS (FORMAL SECTOR) REPORT FOURTH QUARTER 2024**



# **BY STATE**



The highest median monthly wages in December 2024 was recorded in W.P. Kuala Lumpur (RM4,200) followed by Pulau Pinang and Selangor.

## **CONCEPT & DEFINITION**

refer to all remuneration Wages paid to employees, including bonuses, commissions and allowances, during the reference period.

The **Median** refers to the middle observation in a set of data arranged in a sequence. The median wage is used to give a more accurate picture of "average wage", as the determination of the median is not affected by extreme values.

## **SCOPE & COVERAGE**

These statistics is based on the administrative including data on the mandatory data, contribution of retirement savings by the private and non-pensionable public sectors and data on the contribution of social security insurance from various agencies. The data focus only on the citizen formal employees and does not cover employed persons fall under non-standard persons under non-standard employed employment, including own-account workers and unpaid family workers.
